To the Lay Members of the United Church of England and Ireland, in the Diocese of Toronto:—

MY DEAR BRETHREN,—

I am reminded, by the approach of Christmas, of the pleasing duty of calling your attention to the annual offering which, on that holy day, you are requested to make for the special benefit of your Clergyman.

There was never, perhaps, a season in which, in this Province, a more bountiful harvest has been gathered in; and an abundant harvest may be looked upon as the great source of prosperity to the country at large.

It is, we must feel, but reasonable and dutiful that the Ministers of the Lord should share in this prosperity. SYNOD ASSESSMENT.

The duty having been entrusted to the Finance Committee of assessing the several Parishes and Missions of the Diocese, not as formerly for expenses connected with the Annual Meeting of the Synod alone, but "for all purposes required for the expenses of the Synod," viz.: Secretary-Treasurer's salary,

office expenses, printing, assessment of the Diocese for expenses of the Provincial Synod, &c.; and the Committee having ascertained that at the lowest computation the sum of \$3000 will be required to meet arrears and the expenses of the current year, have been compelled to frame the assessment accordingly.

In issuing the subjoined list, they beg to suggest to the parochial authorities of the several parishes, that the amount assessed to each may generally be most conveniently raised by asking for a small subscription from every member of the Church for this special purpose, in addition to his annual subscription to the Mission Fund of the Diocese. None, surely, who consider the importance of keeping the Mission and other Special Funds of the Diocese intact for the express purposes for which they have been contributed, will be unwilling to aid in meeting the necessary expenses of the Diocese. And every parishioner, it is believed, will feel interested in securing for the parish to which he belongs, the opportunity of being represented in the Synod of the Diocese.
