To day we celebrate the twenty fifth birthday of the Dominion of Canada. A quarter of a century has passed since the reentered colonies of Great Britain on this continent were united into what has already become a great Dominion.

TELEGRAPHIC.

RAILWAYS.

The first railway in Canada was built in 1826 between Laprairie and St John's, Quebec. In 1850 there were only 71 miles of railway in all the Dominion; now there are 14,004, which places Canada eighth on the list of the world.

route 1,000 miles shorter than any other railway, thus giving us two days advantage in time.

Our canals have cost over fifty-one millions of dollars, and by means of them we have the largest and most important system of inland navigation in the world.

Our net public debt in 1890 was \$237,533,212. Enormous though this sum it must be remembered that nearly the whole of our public debt has been created by the construction of public works, such as our railways and canals, and not as in European countries and the United States, by aggressive and defensive wars.

Amount per head of public debt in various countries, 1890: West Australia, \$152.80; France, \$150.32; Great Britain and Ireland, \$87.36; Italy, \$73; Canada, \$45.81; Austria, \$40.35; United States, \$24.80.

Number of years of revenue required to pay off the public debt of various countries, 1890: France, 9.94; Spain, 7.84; Great Britain and Ireland, 7.73; Italy, 6.95; Russia, 6.53; Canada, 5.99; United States, 3.84.

Wages per week in Germany, England and Canada: Bricklayers, per week, Germany, \$4.21; England, \$7.56 Canada, \$15. Masons, Germany, \$4.07; England, \$7.05; Canada, \$12. Carpenters Germany, \$4.11; England, \$7.66; Canada, \$10.50.

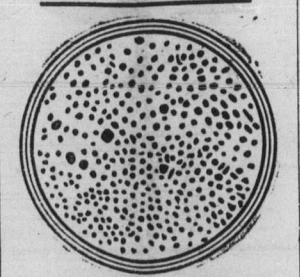
