WHEAT MARKETS STILL LOW. LOCAL STOCKS QUIET, BUT VALUES SLIGHTLY UP.

Montreal Stock Exchange—Local Grain Market Quiet and Firm—Produce and Provision—Beecham's Report—New York Stock Exchange—Business Troubles.

Thursday Evening, March 26, Canadian Pacific stock was steady in London to-day at 72.

Business on Toronto Grain Exchange will be resumed Saturday.

There will be no sessions of Toronto and Montreal Stock Exchanges until Tuesday.

Cincinnati price current predicts that summer corn of hogs will be 1,500,000 under last year.

The feature of local stock market was the sale of British America stock at 95 1/2 to 96.

Amount of bullion taken out of Bank of England to-day on balance 700,000.

W. G. McCormick & Co. of Chicago hold the key to the present situation to-day is the weakness in corn.

There were 425 shares sold on change to-day, 175 of which were in Canadian Pacific and 250 in Northwest Land.

Receipts wheat at Duluth 42,000 bushels against 50,000 yesterday; at Toledo 11,000 against 10,000; at Detroit 21,000 against 18,000.

Receipts flour in Milwaukee 10,315 bbls. against 12,000 yesterday; wheat, 28,000 bushels against 20,000; corn, 5,000 same as day before; oats, 7,000 against 10,000; rye, 9,000 against 6,000; barley, 11,000 against 8,000.

Drummond & Brown's Chicago correspondents give receipts of wheat to-day at 11 primary points as 210,000 bushels and shipments 10,000. They also report that the large clearance of wheat from New York had no effect on Chicago market.

The new United States sugar tariff goes into force April 1, and on that date the price of sugar will go down to 4 1/2 per cent, a reduction of 1/2 per cent. The trust overestimated the demand for March, and it is probable that April demand will reach 4 1/2 per cent, sugar on hand, which is estimated will reach 4 1/2 per cent, to the combine.

The profits of the New York and Chicago bulls are enormous, aggregated it is said, about \$4,000,000, and it is estimated that if wheat goes to \$1.25, at which figure Cottrell is found of quote, it will profit by fully \$4,000,000. The New Yorkers are said to hold about 30,000,000 bushels of the "long" wheat, so that if they hold on until Cottrell's figure is reached their profit will be in the neighborhood of \$4,000,000.
