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
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To Nervous Sufferers.



It is not a very pleasurable task we have undertaken, that of issuing a treatise to *Nervous Sufferers* and those afflicted with *Chronic Diseases*. What we chiefly wish is to gain the confidence of our patients and the public, and hope by a straightforward statement of our object and plan of treatment to permanently merit that confidence. But we have many difficulties and prejudices to overcome before that end can be obtained—the greatest of these is the fact that numerous imposters have advertised worthless preparations at different times, and those who have so often been deceived fear again to trust themselves to advertised remedies.

England our firm has for many years overcome this prejudice, but in Canada it is only of late years that we have been advertising and selling our remedies, and so of course we cannot expect the public to receive us with confidence unless we can prove to them that our intentions are strictly honourable, and that we practise not merely to extort money from our patients, but that our earnest endeavours is to do them good as well as reimburse ourselves for our time and knowledge.

The question now is, which is the best way to attain these objects? When we first established an agency in Canada it was our intention to sell **Dr. J. Bell Simpson's Specific and Tonic Pills** only, but the great demand for them and the frequent requests for special treatment decided us upon having one of the medical gentlemen connected with the English firm come to Canada for the purpose of visiting those places where his services were in request.

DR. SIMPSON'S partner, who arrived in Canada in the early part of the present year (1874), has had many years experience

with **DR. J. BELL SIMPSON** in **LONDON, ENGLAND.** He intended at first to remain for a few months only, and visited several towns and cities, but no sooner was his arrival announced than the applications for treatment became so numerous that it occupied nearly his whole time in attending to them. To remedy this, he has decided to remain permanently in Canada, and for this purpose has established an office at *No. 28 Market Street, corner of Park Street, Hamilton;* the number is conspicuous on the door and the office being situate near the centre of the city is very easily found.

We do not claim to have any particular medicine which will cure almost every known disease. We treat patients on scientific principles, and in complicated cases have to vary the treatment according to the symptoms.

The most eminent medical authorities say that there is no disease to which so many are subjected and from the effects of which so many constitutions break down, leaving the mind confused and finally chaotic or idiotic. The insane asylum or an early grave closes the scene.

We leave it to our readers if it is not a noble task we have undertaken—that of restoring those suffering as above to health and strength, and we have confidence derived from long experience that we can do so. We only ask of our patients that they will follow our directions **STRICTLY** and take the medicines **REGULARLY**. We have spoken before of difficulties in our way: First, sufferers are often too impatient to be cured, thinking that they ought to find immediate relief, forgetting that the disease has been in existence for years, and in many cases health and strength have never been experienced. The fact is that *Nervous Debility* cannot be quickly cured, it is against the nature of things to

suppose so. The constitution must be gradually restored, and even with care and attention this occupies considerable time.

Again they fear excessive expense, but to this we answer that our charges are as moderate as possible, rarely exceeding \$10.00, and in many cases not more than half that sum. We tell our patients candidly what we think of their case, whether hopeful or not. If hopeless we tell them so and ask no fee, if hopeful and they entrust themselves to our care, we do our best for them at as little expense to them as possible. But we think we will be agreed with when we say that it is much better for any man to put up with any other inconvenience than want of health, and that money spent in regaining that should never be regretted. Many have a habit of grumbling at paying a doctor's bill, forgetting the benefit they have derived from his treatment which often amounts to being snatched from death itself.

Again patients do not follow our directions strictly. They continue to indulge in bad practices, and continue the

They also allow themselves to dwell on their troubles, neglect proper precautions, such as exercise, bathing, &c., and then wonder the medicine does not cure them more quickly.

So much has been written and so many things offered to the public as a cure for CONSUMPTION and LUNG DISEASES that we hesitate to offer our services to that class of sufferers, not from any fear that we cannot relieve them, but doubting if we will be allowed a fair opportunity of doing so. In aggravated cases we can give the patient ease and quiet, in those not so far advanced a good hope of perfect restoration, and in recent cases a certainty of cure. About this we will say no more.

Could we but publish the communications we have received the last few months we could convince the most skeptical that we can cure these frightful diseases, but as we regard all communications as strictly confidential, we never use any

letter, even with the address and name cut off. We sympathise with the afflicted and would sooner forego profit to ourselves than have our patients be subject to the slightest suspicion. For this purpose we have our office arranged so that there is no likelihood of one patient being seen by another, and we regard all communications as sacred as the confessional. Parties from a distance wishing to consult should write beforehand, and have an hour arranged so as not to be disappointed, as the Doctor is sometimes from home. When he intends visiting any town or city it will be announced in the local papers, stating when and where he is to be seen.
