Canadian Patents

Are granted only to British Subjects (resident in the Province). A fee of Five Pounds must accompany an application, addressed to the Minister of Agriculture, Toronto, C. W., who requires a specification and description and lettered drawing, giving a full description (in duplicate), signed by the applicant and certified by two witnesses.

He also requires a declaration, signed before a Justice of the Peace, that the applicant is a British Subject, a resident of the Province, and that he believes himself to be the true and original inventor of _____

The above, with a model, showing as far as possible the working, &c., of the invention, discovery or improvement, accompanied by a petition to his Excellency the Governor-General, praying that Letters Patent may be granted for, &c., must be forwarded at the expense of the applicant. Fourteen years is the ordinary period for which Letters Patent are granted.

Travellers, residents of the Province, &c., introducing inventions not known or used in the Province from foreign countries (not Great Britain or the United States), may secure patents on the same for seven years by the ordinary means.

NEWSPAPERS.

Newspapers published within the Province of Canada, pass by mail free of Postage within the Province, whether posted from the office of publication or otherwise.

Between Canada and other British North American Provinces, free of charge.

To the United States, free to the Frontier.

To Foreign Countries, at rates of charge prescribed by Imperial Post Office.

Canada to England (Cunard Line) 1d. on delivery.

Do do. (Canadian Line) 1d. on delivery.

England to Canada (Cunard Line) 1d. on delivery ; 1d. also to be prepaid in England.

England to Canada (Canadian Line), 1d. to be prepaid in England.

Newspapers for the British Colonies, sent *via* England, are liable to a British charge—which must be *prepaid*—of 1d. when forwarded by Canadian Line of Steamers, and of 2d. when forwarded by Cunard Line.

## MAGAZINES, PERIODICALS, &amp;c.

Between any P. O. in Canada and any place in British N. America or the United States the Canadian rate is—

If not exceeding 3 oz. in weight,  $\frac{1}{2}$ d.

If over 3 oz. in weight, 2d.

The quarterly prepayment of Postage on Periodicals, reduces postage one-half.

Printed Circulars, Price Currents, Hand Bills, etc. are charged at the rate of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per oz. (For further regulations respecting Magazines, Circulars, &c. see last year's *Canadian Almanac*, p. 39.

## REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons transmitting letters which they desire should pass through the Post as "Registered Letters," must observe that no record is taken of any letters unless specially handed in for registration at the time of posting. Upon all such letters, with the exception of those addressed to the United States, 1d. must be prepaid, as a Registration charge. If addressed to the United States, the ordinary Postage rate on the letter to that country *must be prepaid*, and in addition a Registration charge of 3d. per letter. The registry thus effected in Canada will be carried on by the United States Post Office, until the letter arrives at its destination.

In like manner, letters addressed to Canada may be Registered at the place of Posting in the United States, and the registry made there will accompany the letter to the place of delivery in Canada.

A Certificate of Registration will be given by a Postmaster, if required.

It must be distinctly understood by parties who avail themselves of the privilege of registration, that such registration, with the certificate and receipt, are merely intended to afford the means of tracing the course of such letters through the Post, and of ascertaining their delivery at destination, and will not be held to imply any liability on the part of the Postal department to make good any loss, or alleged loss, arising from the miscarriage of any such letter or its contents.

*Reciprocal Free Trade with British N. A. Provinces.*—By Proclamation, dated 15th August, 1850, under the Act 13 and 14 Vic. chap. 3, the following articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, or Prince Edward's Island, and when imported directly from any of the said Provinces, are exempt from duty, that is to say :

Animals, salted and fresh Meats, Bark, Butter, Cheese, Chocolate, and other preparations of Cocoa, Copper, Earths, Fruits, Firewood, Fish, Fish Oil, Firs and Skins, the produce of Fish or creatures living in the sea, Grain and Breadstuffs of all kinds, Grindstones and stones of all kinds, Gypsum, ground or unground, Hay and Straw, Hops, Hides, Horns, Head, Matter and Blubber of creatures living in the sea, Iron in pigs and blooms, Lard, Lead in Pigs, Lime, Ores of all kinds, Orches, Rock Salt, Seeds, Spermaceti Oil, Tallow, Timber and Lumber of all kinds, Train Oil, Undressed Skins and Furs of all kinds, Vegetables, Wool, Wood.

*Note.*—As to the importation of Fish and Oil *via* the United States, see below.

*Goods in transitu through another Country.*—In vir-

tue of the authority of the third Section of an Act of the Provincial Parliament, passed in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and chaptered eighty-five, it is ordered that goods *bona fide* exported to this Province from any country, but passing *in transitu* through another country and under Bonds, shall be, until it shall be otherwise ordered, valued for duty, as if such goods were imported directly from such first mentioned country into this Province.

*Discount for Cash in Invoices.*—By Circular of 29th of April, 1853, Importers of Goods in every case are allowed to deduct the discount actually allowed for cash, or that according to the custom of Trade which is allowed for cash.

*Foreign Export duty.*—By Circular of 20th May, 1853, it is directed that in all cases in which an Export duty is charged on the face of the Invoice, the same shall be deducted from the amount upon which the duty is to be levied.

*Importation of Fish and Oil via United States.*—In virtue of the authority of the Nineteenth Section of an Act of the Provincial Parliament, passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and chaptered four, His Excellency, the Administrator of the Government in Council, has been pleased to order that Fish and Oil, being *bona fide* the growth, produce, or manufacture of any of the British North American Provinces, may be imported into this province *via* the United States, between the First day of November and the First day of May in each year, and be exempt from the payment of Duties of Customs, upon being accompanied by proper Certificates of growth produce or manufacture, as required by law to entitle them to exemption.

TAXES.

IMPOSED BY THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF QUEBEC.

*Taxes on Proprietors.*

Proprietors of houses, buildings, lots of ground and wharves within the limits of the City when occupied by the Proprietors pay on the yearly assessed value, 1s 3d in the pound.

And when the above houses, &c., are leased, proprietors pay 10d in the pound.

TAXES ON BANKS AND BANK AGENCIES.

On each bank and on each bank agency, a tax of £50 per annum.

TAX ON INSURANCE COMPANIES.

On each Insurance company or Insurance agency' fire, marine, or inland navigation, (Life Insurance companies excepted,) a tax of \$200 per annum.

TAX ON LIFE INSURANCE COMPANIES.

On each Life Insurance company, or Life Insurance agency, a tax of \$50 per annum.

TAX ON BROKERS AND MONEY CHANGERS.

An annual tax of \$40 on each person acting as broker or money changer.

TAX ON AGENTS OF MERCHANTS.

An annual tax of £25, on the agent or agents of merchants not residing within the limits of this Province.

TAX ON BREWERIES AND BREWERY AGENCIES.
