Repatrolled invalids, 288 officers and 4934 men.

Total, 13,265, exclusive of the sick and wounded now in hospital.

To the War Office returns of the British losses must be added the losses of the last week and the wounded, aggregating about 10,000, making a grand total of upwards of 23,000 officers and men put out of action.
