Pastoral Letter.

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS
OF THE ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

My dear brethren,

It was a good and great departure when the fathers of the Reformation called Christians back to the days of Jesus and His disciples, the Apostles, in order to learn what the christian religion really is. It was necessary to go to the fountain head, as contained in the Gospels and Epistles of the New Testament, to know what Christ meant and wished His church to be and teach and do. And what was necessary then is in a measure necessary in every age,—to get back not only to the first principles involved in christianity, as taught by its Founder, but also to the simple and earnest spirit of the early believers. There has to be a constant watchfulness, to guard against the temper of the world invading and infecting that which should belong to the church, as made up of the Lord's people. Paul's ideal of a congregation as set forth in his letters to the Corinthians, and his model pastor, portrayed in his letters to Timothy and Titus, cannot be read and studied too often by pastors and people.

The situation of the early church, in the bringing of a large number of persons to enter upon an entirely new line of thought, belief and action, is paralleled in the yearly history of every progressive congregation. There has been a new departure for some among the people, even though they may not have been numerous. A change has come over their views, which has reached to the seat of their affections, and promises to exercise a controlling influence over their lives. The duty of the church is to heartily welcome such to its membership, to encourage their enthusiasm and guide it, and to use it in the Master's service. Especially ought it to be expected that every year shall yield its quota of additions to the moral and spiritual force of the church from among the young, who have grown up in its fold and shared in its privileges. This is the quarter from which

growth is specially to be looked for, in an advancing and prospering congregation. The past year has been an encouraging one for St. Gabriel Church, as regards additions from both within and without; and we who have been longer in the fellowship of the congregation not only welcome them to all the advantages which St. Gabriel's has to offer, but also invite their earnest cooperation in carrying on the work of the congregation in one or other of the many departments of its activity. We hope all may find a sphere of usefulness among us, and profit by their connection with the old historic organization.

The Annual Report is as usual late in being issued, in the printed form; but if it brings afresh the claims of the church before the minds of the people, there may not after all be so much disadvantage in its tardy appearance. It is, however, the wish to give the new addresses of the people, as accurate and full as possible, that is the chief cause of the delay. But now that it is issued, it is hoped it will receive careful perusal, and that it will help to maintain the enthusiastic attachment of old friends, and call forth the warm cooperation of new ones.

"Commending you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to keep you, and build you up and give you an inheritance among the sanctified."

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE
CONGREGATION OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation of St. Gabriel Church was held in the Lecture Room on Wednesday Evening, January 11th, 1899, at 8 o'clock.

The meeting was opened with devotional exercises conducted by the Pastor.

Rev. Dr. Campbell was called to the chair and Mr. Wm. C. McAllister was requested to act as Secretary.

The minutes of the last annual meeting having been printed in last year's Report and distributed among the members and adherents, it was moved by Mr. P. M. MacTavish, seconded by Mr. John M. Farquhar, and agreed to:—

“That the minutes of the last annual meeting be held as read.”

Mr. A. E. Taylor, in the absence of the Secretary, read the report of the Board of Trustees; and in his capacity as Treasurer, presented a Statement of the Receipts and Disbursements during the past year. Mr. J. M. Farquhar, Sec.-Treas of the Purchase and Interest Fund, also read a report on the finances of this important fund.

Rev. Dr. Campbell gave the statistics for the year, and at the same time touched upon some important matters relating to the welfare of the church.

Moved by Mr. John Loughhead, seconded by Mr. Charles Byrd, and carried:—

“That the reports and financial statements as now read be received and adopted, and that the same be printed and distributed amongst the members and adherents of the congregation.”

Moved by Mr. James Robertson, seconded by Mr. Albert E. Taylor, and carried:—

“The congregation has been called upon to mourn heavy losses in its membership during the year, and bows to the Heavenly Father's will therein; but as a people we that remain must try and profit by the warnings we have received, and while thankful for the services of the good friends taken from us, be more diligent in the work we are called upon in God's providence to do.”

Moved by Mr. Wm. Darling, seconded by Mr. W. C. McAllister, and carried :—

“That this meeting makes acknowledgement of the kindness and zeal of the Ladies' Aid Society and Lady Visitors who have devoted much time and work to the christian duties of providing seasonable comfort and aid for those in adversity, and in visiting the sick. Therefore, a cordial vote of thanks is now accorded to the Ladies' Aid Society and the Lady Visitors for their disinterested attention to those duties, and also includes thanks for donations towards the refitting of the interior furnishings of the church.”

Moved by Mr. W. J. Mundell, seconded by Mr. L. Stewart, and carried :—

“That as the assistance of the Choir in leading the praise services of the congregation requires much training and talent on the part of the Choir, this meeting expresses its approbation and thanks to all members of the Choir who have led the praise service of the congregation during the past year.”

Moved by Mr. J. M. Farquhar, seconded by Mr. P. M. MacTavish, and agreed to :—

“That as it is becoming increasingly necessary to have the children and young people of the congregation thoroughly instructed in Bible knowledge and in the privileges of the religious life, therefore, this meeting recognises the great importance of the Sabbath School, and would encourage the Superintendent and Teachers by a hearty vote of thanks for their valuable services, and requests the Board of Trustees to provide for the usual necessary expenses of the Sabbath School during the year 1899.”

Moved by Mr. Charles Byrd, seconded by Mr. John MacTavish, and carried :—

“That this meeting records its appreciation of the onerous nature of the duties falling upon those filling the offices of Treasurer and Secretary, and now passes a cordial vote of thanks to the Treasurers, Messrs. John Henderson and Albert E. Taylor, and the Secretary, Mr. Andrew McAllister, for the careful fulfillment of their respective duties during the year 1898.”

Moved by Mr. P. M. MacTavish, seconded by Mr. J. M. Jerrom, and agreed to :—

“That in accordance with Article III of the By-Laws, this meeting does now re-elect Messrs. William Arnott, John Beckingham, Andrew McAllister and Robt. S. Weir, to be members of the Board of Trustees, to fill the vacancies occurring by rotation at this time ; and also elect Messrs. D. M. Brophy and W. Clelland, Jr., to be members of the Board to fill up the vacancies caused by the resignation of Mr. John Henderson and the death of Mr. Archibald McNaughton respectively.”

Moved by Mr. W. J. Mundell, seconded by Mr. J. McGregor, and agreed to :—

“That this meeting approves of the acts of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee in collecting the subscriptions hitherto given to the Purchase and Interest Fund, and in view of the winding up of the original scheme of subscriptions a new list shall be opened to provide for the semi-annual interest on the purchase price of the building, and that the following shall be a committee to carry this into effect, viz :—Charles Byrd, John MacTavish, A. E. Taylor, J. M. Farquhar, Wm. Clelland, Jr., W. J. Mundell, Arch. McAllister, George A. Campbell and W. C. McAllister, with power to add others.”

Moved by Mr. James Bacon, seconded by Mr. F. Dockrill, and carried :—

“That Messrs. A. C. Abernethy and G. F. Barker be appointed Auditors for the year 1899.”

On motion of Mr. A. E. Taylor, seconded by Mr. Charles Byrd, a hearty vote of thanks was passed to Mr. James R. Bain for the great assistance rendered by him in connection with the late Scotch Concert.

The thanks of the meeting were tendered to Rev. Dr. Campbell for the efficient manner in which he had filled the position of Chairman.

There being no further business, the meeting closed with praise, after which the ladies served refreshments which were much enjoyed.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

For the year ending December 31st, 1898.

As it is the duty of the Trustees to lay before the congregation each year a report of their doings in the way of receipts and disbursements, we beg, on behalf of the Board, to submit the following for your consideration.

In the first place, it is with deep regret that we record the great loss the church has sustained by the death of our old and esteemed friend Mr. Archibald McNaughton, who, since our last Annual Meeting, has been called to his reward, which we are sure was a rich one, as his whole heart seemed to be in the work of this church. Often he would be seen at his post at the door when physically he was very unable ; and in his many years of labour he seldom missed a service. Would that many of our congregation should benefit by his splendid example and be more constant in their attendance at the ordinances.

In opening our report, we would say that owing to a special effort that was made at the close of last year, in the way of raising extra money to enable the Board to clear off all outstanding accounts and commence this year on a more sound basis, we were enabled to pay

our liabilities and start with a small balance to the good, which was then very encouraging.

It will be unnecessary for us to go into any details as to the receipts and expenditures during the past year, as the Treasurer will lay that all before you, and we trust his statement may receive your thoughtful and earnest attention.

The total amount collected to maintain the running expenses of the church since January last, amounted to \$2712 36. In addition to this the sum of \$656.25 was received toward clearing off the debt incurred through the repairs and cleaning of the church, making the total amount received from all sources to be \$3368.61.

We are certain that it was seen by all that the cleaning of the edifice was a necessity, and the Board assure the congregation that the work was done at as low a cost as possible.

It may be said that we have been under extra expense this year that will not occur again for some time. That we grant, at least we hope so. Still the Board feel themselves in a very undesirable position when they meet month after month and see how low the funds remain. It is at times rather discouraging.

Although \$652.25 was collected over and above the regular revenue, still even with that added the total and then the full amount subtracted from the expenditure, it only leaves about \$200.00 over our running expenses this year, which makes us \$450.00 behind where we were at the beginning of the year. This is a source of anxiety.

For the past four years it has been found necessary to ask the congregation for a special offering at the close of each year, an action which the Board greatly deplored. But for various reasons it was thought advisable not to ask for one this year.

However, the fact is quite evident that our income is not sufficient to carry on the work, Some means will have to be devised whereby an increase of 15% may be added to the present revenue.

No doubt there are some who are doing their duty and doing it well,—but the majority are falling far short of what the Lord expects of them. For instance, a glance at the Treasurer's books will show about 200 names subscribing towards the maintenance of the church. Only these few out of a large congregation like ours. And when you take into consideration that in some cases three or four contributors

appear in one family, it means that between eighty and ninety families support the church. This will give you a right idea why the Board has cause for anxiety as to the future financial position of the church.

When we entered the new church, it was fully understood that our income should reach \$70.00 each Sunday; the average for the past few years has been about \$52.00 per Sabbath.

The Purchase and Interest Fund account has, as usual, been made out in detail, and will be submitted. As the majority of the amounts promised to that Fund have been paid, it now remains for some scheme to be originated by which the payment of the interest on the balance of the debt could be guaranteed.

Before closing, we beg to thank those who so kindly and generously responded to the special appeal, and trust that they may consider their donation well spent, especially when they see the marked improvement in the interior of our beautiful edifice.

The retiring Trustees at this time are Messrs. John Beckingham, William Arnott, Robert S. Weir and Andrew McAllister, all of whom are eligible for re-election.

The are at present 36 members on the roll,—19 active and 17 on trial. Of this number 12 have joined during the past year. A Superintendent, an Assistant and a Committee are appointed by the Senior Society to take charge of the meetings which are held every Wednesday afternoon, from 4 to 5 o'clock. Two members connected themselves with the church at the last communion. A special feature of our work is visiting the Hospitals, and distributing dolls, picture-books and papers to the sick children there. Very little has been given for Missions this year; the reason for this being that the meetings were suspended during the summer months. Two entertainments were given,—a concert, the proceeds of which went to the church, and a Christmas-tree for poor children. The total amount of money collected during the year was \$20.07; of this, \$8.56 was given to the church, \$1.85 for missions, and \$5.21 for other expenses, leaving a balance of \$4.45.

The year just closed has been one of unusual interest and helpfulness. Not only have the meetings been better attended than ever before, but in the variety and interest of the topics discussed they have been well sustained throughout the year.

Eight meetings have been held during the year, at which papers have been read or talks given on various branches of mission work both in home and foreign fields. In the home field we have learned about work in British Columbia, North-West Territories, among the Doukhobors, and also about the work undertaken by our own Society. In the foreign field we have discussed the work of the Judson's in Burmah, of the Allan's in East Central Africa, and of the various missionaries of the church in Trinidad, Honan, India, and at Round Lake, Indian Reserve. In November a barrel of clothing was sent to Fort Saskatchewan in answer to an appeal for aid for the settlers in that district. It proved very timely and acceptable as most of the settlers in that district are as yet very poor and the climate is exceedingly severe. Very interesting letters were received from the missionary in charge, telling of the work of himself and his wife who is a trained nurse and doctor.

The Treasurer's Statement shows a slight increase over last year. We hope to continue improvement along this line as well as in the character of our meetings. Altogether we may feel that we have had a good year, a year of growth in knowledge, interest and sympathy, and that we have perhaps come a little nearer to realizing the brotherhood and sisterhood of all the children of the All-Father, and the responsibility that rest upon us who are strong in light and liberty to bear the infirmities of the weak. We look forward to the coming year with hope and trust that it will be the best we have ever had, and that we may be a power for good in the corner of the Master's field entrusted to our care.
