# Twenty Below Where Russians Fight Honored on Eve of His

### Weather Conditions Very Severe ITALY FACING NEW on Eastern Battle Ground

Strenuous Work in West; Germans Have Captured Signal Hill and Village of Norroy—Counter Attack Drives Them **Back Part Way** 

London, Feb 15-A despatch yesterday to the Daily Chronicle from Czerno-

"Fighting continues in Bukowina. The Russians have received reinforcements, and have begun a series of counter-attacks which shattered the Ausl tro-German lines at three points, compelling a retirement.

"The Russians are now moving forward, but snow impedes them. The cold is intense, the temperature being twenty below zero. A driving snow renders it impossible to distinguish friend from foe a hundred feet distant. Thousands of wounded on both sides have perished from exposure." FRENCH SUMMARY.

Paris, Feb. 15—The French War Office this afternoon reported:—

"In Belgium yesterday the German bombardment of our trenches was uninterrupted. From the great dune, our heavy artillery inflicted damage on the mortars of the enemy. We occupied, for a distance of about 250 yards a German trench along the roadway from Bethune to Labasse.

"Yesterday saw very spirited artillery exchanges in the vicinity of Lens, around Alberta, between the Avre and the Oise, in the suburbs of Soissons, and at Verneuil, to the northeast of Vailly.

"In the Argonne, in the direction of Bagatelle and Marie Therese, the fighting still continues with energy from trench to trench, but there have been no movements of infantry.

"Between the Argonne and Meuse, an attempt at attack by the German forces at a point between the village of Malancourt and the forest of the same name, was promptly repulsed.

"In Lorraine the enemy, after having driven back our advance guard, succeeded in occupying Signal Hill and the village of Norroy. A counter attack on our part drove the Germans back as far as the western declivity of Signal Hill, where they are still holding their position in some trenches.

"In the Vosges the German offensive movement which began along the two banks of the river Lauch, was not pursued yesterday on the south bank. The enemy bombarded our position only on the north bank of this stream. The Germans are being held in check by us in front of our advanced line at Langenfeldkopf, in the forest of Rempach. French troops on skits have executed a very brilliant counter attack against the German positions on the sides of the mountain at this point. Yesterday afternoon a very heavy snowstorm blew over this locality."

London, Feb. 15—Forty-nine thous and Turkish prisoners, including 527 of fficers, have passed through Pyatigorsk in the territory of Terrik, Schiscaucasia, en route to the interior since the war with Turkey began, according to the Petrograd correspondent of Rueter's Tele- gram Company.

Geneva, Feb. 14 (via Paris, Feb. 15)—What is said to be the first bayonet charge on skits during the present war was made yesterday in the Vosges Mountains, near Coldubonhomme. Forty Alpine chasseurs with two officers, were cut off by the Germans and were ordered to surrender. They refused and charged down the snow covered slope on their skits into the German trenches, where a terribl struggle took place before the French soldiers were overcome. GERMANS ALSO TO LEAVE LOWICZ.

SAYS WERNER HORN ONCE WAS OFFICER IN GERMAN ARMY

His Lawyer Hopes to Establish Contention For Use in Defence -Horn Not a Crank, He Says

Mr. O'Connell said that the papers in Horne's trunk bore out his story that he was thirty-three years old, that he had been nine years in the German army, that his rank was that of a lieutenant, that he had lived for three years on a coffee plantation in Guatemala, that he had tried to get back to Germany but had come to this country when he saw that German reservists were almost certain to be captured on their way home.

He was quite certain, Mr. O'Connell said, that his client had no hand in the burning of the Roebling plant at Trenton, where several buildings were destroyed in which supplies for the Allies were being manufactured. The papers in Horn's trunk, he said, have no hint that there were others acting in concert with him.







Uniformity in provincial legislation in Canada is greatly desired by all who Uniformity in provincial legislation in Canada is greatly desired by all who have business to transact in different provinces, and also lawyers, who now find it necessary to have a knowledge of the laws of all provinces, as well as of the Dominion. A strong movement to bring about greater uniformity has been inaugurated by the Canadian Bar Association, and its action has been endorsed by the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association, which is asking the ro-operation of the principal boards of trade and other public bodies in each province.

An address on this subject, delivered by Sir James Aikins, president of the Canadian Bar Association, in Winnipeg, in December last, has been printed in pamphlet form and is being distributed by the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association. Sir James Aikins pointed but how desirable it is in the interests of banks, manufacturers and wholesale merchants, as well as lawyers, that there should be a uniformity in provincial legislation, and that one of the purposes for which the Canadian Bar Association was formed was to bring about this desired result. Lawyers of all the provinces are thus interested in the work, which can only be done with the concurrence of the several provincial governments and legislatures.

A precedent has been established in the United States. Twenty-five years ago the American Bar Association begun an agitation which resulted in the greation of a Board of Commissioners and Inform State Laws, appointed by Inform State Laws, appointed the Information of Information

gun an agitation which resulted in the areation of a Board of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, appointed by the governments of the respective states, to make a study of the comparative laws of each state, and to make recommendations. This board has not only gathered information, but has had standard forms of acts relating to the several subjects on which uniformity is desired drafted by experts. Sir James Aikins pointed out that as a result the Negotiable Instruments Act has been a model. Premier Hearst replied that the government had been giving very careful consideration to the whole question, and promised that legislation to minimize the affects of the liquor traffic would be asked for, although he pointed out that conditions in Ontario were quite different from those in Russia, and intimated that his government was not considering so drastic a measure as total prohibition. Negotiable Instruments Act has been adopted by forty-six states, territories and federal districts and possessions; the Warehouse Receipts Act by thirty states; the Bills of Lading Act and the Sale of Goods Act in eleven states; the Certificates of Stock Act in nine states, and several others in a number of states. The work is being continued, and Sir James very properly says that what the United States has done Canada can do; and, as a matter of fact, there is more uniformity in Canada at present than there was in the United States before there was in the United States before they began to adopt standard acts. After discussing legislative jurisdictions in Canada as between the federal and provincial authorities, and dealing with a number of questions and showing clearly the inconsistencies and contradictions in provincial laws, Sir James made a very strong plea for the adoption of standard acts, or failing this that Dominion legislation be secured. 
