





It will be but a waste of money to increase the working staff and the expenditure if the present methods of street repair are to be continued: The right kind of material for permanent wear is not placed upon the surface of the streets, nor is to be continued. The right kind of material for permanent wear is not placed upon the surface of the streets, nor is there much improvement after the alleged repairs are made. The principles of good road making are continually violated. If this is because there is only a small appropriation to be spread over a great many streets, a larger appropriation should be combined with better methods of street repair. For years the city has been wasting money on work that was not permanent and that soon called for repairs. This is a fault of method. The city should abartion the patchwork system and adopt methods giving permanent results. Citizens could endure poor streets in their own locality with greater equanimity for a certain period if they knew that a system had been adopted which sooner or later would bring them permanently good road-ways. The existing methods give no promise, of such a result. Even the first large experiment in permanent paving has resulted in conditions which the mayor himself has declared to be unsatisfactory, because of the character of the work done.






