The above does not include drains leading from gullies or catch basins, but is confined exclusively to public sewers proper.

The usual semi-annual inspection shewed the whole of the fifty thousand two hundred and fifty-eight feet of new sewer to be self-cleansing, and free, therefore, from offensive odor. Any trouble experienced in this way has been in connection with old sewers, laid many years ago, when sound sewerage principles were but little understood.

The inspections are made by passing through such sewers as are sufficiently large for this purpose, and when this cannot be done, the internal condition of the sewer is ascertained from contiguous man-holes. The latter are placed at short distances apart, with a view to inspection, and when the pipe is clean and properly graded, a light or lamp placed in one man-hole, in a line with the axis of the pipe, is easily seen from the other.

The water extensions of the past year embraced the laying of thirteen thousand six hundred and fifty-four (13,654) feet of main pipe, four thousand four hundred and twenty-two (4,422) feet of service pipe, and the placing of ten (10) new fire plugs; of the excavation required for these extensions one third fully was in rock. The greater part of the new main laid is in furtherance of the plan suggested in 1874, for improving the fire service of St. John and Portland.

The streets in which new mains are laid, with the length and size of each, are shewn below:

Whole length of piping, - 306,662 " Seventy-one (71) leaks were reported in connection with this piping dhring 1876, ten of which belonged to twenty-four inch pipe, one to fifteen-inch, one to twelve-inch, two to six-inch, nine to fourinch, one to three-inch two to six-inch, nine to fourinch, one to three-inch, and forty-seven to service pipes. The causes which led to this leakage were of the usual character, and many of those connected with service pipes belonging to sewerage work and unavoidable. The length of digging connected with the leakage repairs of the year measured seven hundred and forty-one (741) feet.

The following report shows briefly the amount of work done during the year 1876, in connection with the sewerage and water supply of Saint John and Portland, as well as the extent and state of each at the present time.

No serious complaints have been FIRE and MARINE tion and winter waste are beginning to tell on the higher districts. No serious complaints have been made as yet in regard to this, but, at the present rate of increase, the time is not far distant when they will be heard as of old, unless some means can be devised to prevent reckless waste, which seems hopeless with a constant supply in a climate like ours.

Inspections continue to be made periodically, particularly of fittings in exposed positions, and it is no uncommon thing to find water running at the rate of two thousand to ten thousand gallons and upwards per day, under the old pretext "to keep from freezing." In all cases of discovered or reported waste, immediate steps are taken for its suppression, but, as no money penalty is imposed by law for delinquencies of this sort, it is often difficult to get people to do what is right, and sometimes impossible without shutting off altogether, which is always an unpleasant duty.
