If the modern epicure is not satisfied with the above, our anicent gastronomer gives further instructions as follows:—"If you design to bake this pudding, then put in hialf a pound of currants, and half as many raisins and plums, and three-quarters of a pound of beef suet, shreed fine, and so bake it; one hour will bake it. 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
