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

## (LOCAL BILL.)

## BILL.

An Act establishing the line between lots numbers six and seven, and twelve and thirteen, from the River Thames to the eleventh concession inclusive, in the Township of Howard.

Received and read, first time, Tuesday, 15th March, 1859.

Second reading, Wednesday, 16th March, 1859.

## TORONTO:

An Act to confirm and establish the Road Allowances between Lots six and seven, and twelve and thirteen, from the River Thames to the line between the tenth and eleventh concessions of the Township of Howard, in the County of Kent.

THEREAS the original posts planted in the allowances for roads Preamble, between lots six and seven and twelve and thirteen, in the Township of Howard, in the County of Kent, have been lost, and great doubts exist as to the true position of these lines; And whereas the 5 roads on these lines, as now travelled, were laid out and surveyed by Richard Parr and Albert Pellew Salter, Esquires, Deputy Provincial Surveyors, under the orders of the Council of the said Township, and could not be altered without great loss and inconvenience to the inhabitants settled along the same; and it is therefore expedient to establish the said 10 roads, as now travelled, upon the lines laid out by Messrs. Salter and Parr aforesaid; Therefore Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows:

1. The road allowance between lots numbers six and seven, in the Line between said Township, as laid out by Albert Pellew Salter, Esquire, Deputy lots six and Provincial Surveyor, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, seven confirmed.

15 from the River Thames to the eleventh concession inclusive, and upon which the road is now mostly made and travelled, is hereby confirmed and established as the true boundary between the said lots from the River Thames to the eleventh concession inclusive, and shall be held to have been so from the time when it was so laid out.

II. The side line or allowance for road between lots numbers twelve Line between and thirteen, as surveyed and laid out in part by Richard Parr, Deputy and thirteen Provincial Surveyor, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-established. six, and completed by Albert Pellew Salter, Esquire, Deputy Provincial Surveyor, in the year one thousand eight hundred and lifty, from the

- 25 River Thames to the eleventh concession inclusive, and upon which the road is now mostly made and travelled, is hereby confirmed and established as the true boundary between the said lots, from the River Thames to the eleventh concession inclusive, and shall be held to have been so from the time it was laid out.
- III. The By-law, number thirteen, passed by the Counil of the said A certain Township on the thirtieth day of August, 1856, and in which the survey of the said lines is particularly described, shall be and is hereby confirmed. ed and declared valid.

IV. Whereas in the front of the said second concession from the eastern boundary, the old monuments are obliterated and no certain boundary or post remains; therefore the inhabitants of the front of said concession, or any number of them interested, are hereby authorized to procure a duly licensed Deputy Provincial Surveyor to measure along the front of the said concession, from the town line west to the side roal between lots numbers six and seven, as established by this Act, and to average the lots between said two governing boundaries, or to measure along said concession from said side road to the side road between lots numbers twelve and thirteen, as established by this Act, and to average the lots between said two gov- 10 enring boundaries, or to measure along said concession from said side road last mentioned to the town line east, and average the lots between said two governing boundaries, such survey or surveys to be made at the cost and charges of the applicants, or (if in the judgment of the surveyors it would be more equitable) to be charged by such surveyors to the owners 15 or occupants of all the lands interested, in proportion to the services rendered, and to be recovered by him according to law, whether such owners or occupants be residents or not.

Certain corner posts in the second concession confirmed. V. The posts planted by Alexander McIntosh, Deputy Provincial Surveyor, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, at 20 the angles of the lots in the second concession aforesaid, on the line between the said concession and the block, are hereby confirmed as the boundaries of the several lots in the south half of the said second concession.

VI. This Act shall be deemed a public Act.

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
