Boston Herald: Oklahoma's abbreviation is O.K. Now let Oklahoma R.F.P.

Editorial World: Having come down to attend the Dominion Day Convention at Ottawa, I desire through the courtesy of your paper to give you some information in connection with this important interest in Manitoba. The people of the Province of Ontario are interested in the development of the agricultural resources of the West, because in that direction, which is the most fertile, the property of the West will rest upon the East. From a competitive standpoint the development of our dairy interests in the Province of Manitoba does not interest the farmers of Ontario. There is rather a community of interest which can be made a mutual support. The cheese industry has steadily risen from an importation in 1868 to the production of about nine million dollars in 1888. It has displaced butter almost entirely as an article of export, but the resources of the country are still undeveloped. It is necessary to raise the export value of our butter to the same level as cheese in less than 20 years, and this can only be done by the introduction of a new and more profitable article of export. The most feasible plan is to push forward the manufacture of butter in the West, where the feed is plentiful and where dairy farms can be established with ease upon the co-operative plan. In the Province of Manitoba it is our interest to turn attention to the manufacture of butter, because we require the skim milk to raise the value of our cheese, and the cream to be used on twenty dollars worth of butter, 100 lbs., is half the cost of 200 lbs. of cheese. We can make butter of an exceptionally good quality and yield under the summary system, because the climate is suitable and the feed good, and by the careful handling of our milk and the management of our creameries we can sell naturally in establishing a reputation and a market for Canadian butter which will benefit our agricultural interests everywhere. The average yield of milk per cow per day during the season is 15 pails in Quebec, 17 pails in Ontario and in Manitoba it is, I think, about 20 pails. Our farmers are beginning to weigh their milk so as to know the value of their cows, and before long we shall be able to give more reliable information upon this point. A neighbor of mine has a good cow, and he is producing a cow whose intrinsic value through its producing power is sixty or seventy dollars.

There is so much unoccupied land that it will be years before the country becomes so thickly settled as to require the most excellent financial results can be obtained in dairying which would redound to the benefit of the country, and in the meantime Canadian butter can be established as an article of export. It would not be advisable to establish it at the expense of our cheese, in the manufacture of which we have great valuable experience and an enviable reputation which is absolutely necessary to maintain by honest milk and improved methods, but it is in the interest of the people of the Province of Ontario and Quebec to co-operate with an industry of interest. What we mainly require is capital to build creameries and increase our cows, and to improve the quality of our milk. The number of cows that are at present in possession, and the ability of the country to support stock is practically unlimited. We have as yet little accumulated capital, because our farmers turn in their earnings to the improvement of their farms for the first few years; there has also been a temptation to develop large wheat production, which has not been found equitable in its results. It is very easy to mislead farming, and the dairy and stock interests will receive a larger share of attention in which there is comparative safety. Every acre of wheat injured by frost last year would have produced its full value in dairy stock if it had been in that line.

Those who have investments in land in the Province of Manitoba, stock raisers, dairy men, and the people generally are interested in the development of our butter interests, which will distribute wealth through the West. This can be done by co-operation or by joint stock companies to carry on the manufacture of butter on a systematic plan, which modern appliances render simple and profitable. To increase our cows in Ontario for the purpose of producing butter is a matter which is worthy of an effort. Many farmers prematurely dispose of their calves in order to get the benefits of the first milk, which is distributed among so many people.
