CARTER HARRISON KILLED.

Chicago's Mayor Shot by An Assassin.

THE MURDERER AN EX-POLICEMAN.

Called to the Door and Pistoled to Death.

Chicago, Oct. 23.—Another crazy crank has done his deadly work, and Carter Harrison, five times Mayor of Chicago and one of the best known men in the world, has been shot to death. The assassin, a man named William Harrison, 23 years of age, and the servant, shortly before 8 o'clock the door bell rang, and when Mary Harrison, the domestic, opened the door she was confronted by a man about 5 feet 5 inches in height, smooth shaven, his face clean cut, bright eyes, and a pair of dark eyes.

"Mr. Harrison," asked the man in a quiet, pleasant voice.

"Yes, sir," responded the girl, as she threw the door wider open to permit his entrance.

"I would like to see him, please," said the man as he walked toward the back end of the hall. Mr. Harrison was in the dining room, which opens into the rear end of the hall. Hearing the man ask for him he rose and, stepping into the hall, walked toward the door, which was opened by the man.

"Without saying a word, Prudergast drew his revolver and fired three times, and every bullet hit the mark. One ball shattered Mr. Harrison's head, another passed into the right side of the abdomen, making a wound that would have been mortal in a few days; the third bullet entered the chest, slightly above the heart. The bullet was the immediate cause of death.

As soon as Prudergast was free to move he turned and ran rapidly toward the dining room. He walked through the door, across the dining room, and passed into a butler's pantry opening off the room, where, weakened by loss of blood, he fell to the floor.

Prudergast did not follow up his victim to make any attempt to get away, but he hid in his pocket with the same deliberation that had marked all his actions and started toward the door. Just as he was passing through the doorway, the door opened, and the assassin, the Mayor's son, came tearing down the stairs from the upper portion of the house, just as Mrs. Harrison was entering into the rear end of the hall. The cries of Harry Harrison directed the assassin toward the door. He had a revolver of his own and he fired a bullet into the air, which leveled his weapon and sent a bullet after the disappearing Prudergast.

"That man Prudergast is crazy," said Corporation Counsel Kraus. "I know him and I know his father. He is a man who is called as my office twice and told me that he was going to shoot me. I was a policeman and I know that Prudergast was insane, but I never thought he would do such a awful thing as this."

Threats Against the Mayor's Life. Prudergast has had many threats in the past several days. On Thursday afternoon he was entered Billy Boyle's chop house in Calumet place, and a seat at a table occupied by W. A. S. Graham, the murderer of John D. Rockefeller, and another man well known to local financial circles. Graham, who was acquainted with Prudergast, was sitting at the table with him, and he was talking to him in a friendly manner. Prudergast burst into the room and told the mayor for what he declared was the latter's opposition to the elevation of the surface railroad tracks.

"If he don't elevate the tracks I will kill him. I will shoot to kill," ejaculated Prudergast, bringing his fist down on the table with a force that made the dishes rattle and attracted the attention of the other patrons of the place. The gentleman addressed simply smiled at him, attributing his strong language to the excitement under which he was laboring. Observing this he again ejaculated, "Yes, I will kill him, mind what I say. Unless he does he is a dead man."

Sketch of the Life of Carter Harrison. Carter Harrison was born near Lexington, Ky., Feb. 10, 1828. His great-grandfather was father of Benjamin, who was father of President William Henry Harrison. 


