WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The Bishop of Qu'Appelle and Mrs. Grisdale, before leaving Toronto, paid a visit to our parochial branch of the WA. The Bishop gave an interesting address on the growth and prospects of his diocese. He spoke particularly of the Gordon schools for Indian boys, in which our branch has taken a lively interest, and warmly thanked the members for the good work which they had done for so many years, in clothing four boys and sending two bales every year.

The sewing meetings are now held on Monday afternoons, with a good attendance of members and satisfactory progress in the work. The Rev. M. Hare at one of the meetings gave an informal "talk" on Missions.

The annual meeting (D.V.) will be held on Wednesday, March 27th, in the school-room at 3 o'clock. It is hoped this important meeting will attract a full attendance of members and others interested in the work of their parish branch.

Parisk Hotes

On Feb. 9th the Rev. F. C. C. Heathcote, Rector of St. Clement's Church, preached on behalf of the Diocesan Mission Fund. The response to the appeal amounted to \$240. The amount allotted to St. George's Parish is \$497, towards which we can count upon \$430, made up as follows: balance in hand \$30, W. A. subscriptions \$75, collection on Thanksgiving Day \$85, the recent promises and payments, \$240.

The attention of parents, young people and children is called to the Children's Service during Lent on Tuesday afternoons at 4.30 o'clock. Mr. Hare is giving a course of short interesting talks to the young folk.

The Clergy of the Parish have their hands full during Lent. The number of the sick is unusually large, and besides the parochial services and Confirmation classes, they are preaching courses of sermons outside—the Rector at St. Mark's, Parkdale, on Thursday afternoons; Mr. Hare at St. Matthias' on Fridays.

The Rev. G. F. Davidson's course of sermons on Friday afternoons is of somewhat unusual It is a grouping together of the various aspects of the Church of Christ as given in the Bible, viz.—The Kingdom of Heaven, the Pillar and Ground of the Truth, an Army with Banners, the Body of Christ, the Bride of Christ, the Mother of us all.

The problem of the Mothers' Meeting has been solved. Mrs. Ritchie has most kindly undertaken charge of it, to the great satisfaction of the mothers, and is assisted by Miss Cayley

As the school-house is open on Monday and Thursday afternoons either occasion may be utilized by the charitable and kindly disposed to send cast-off clothing for the benefit of the needy. Numerous applications are made at the Rectory for clothing, especially at this season. Boots and shoes have a way of wearing out at the close of the winter. Anxious as men may be for work, what can a man do in a worn-out gaping boot! And the children, how many of them cannot get to school because they have no boots or shoes to go in!

On St. Valentine's Day the choir boys had a sleigh drive under the care of Mr. Willoughby Norrie. On their return they were feasted and warmed with cake and coffee under the kind management of Miss Street and Miss Wyatt.
