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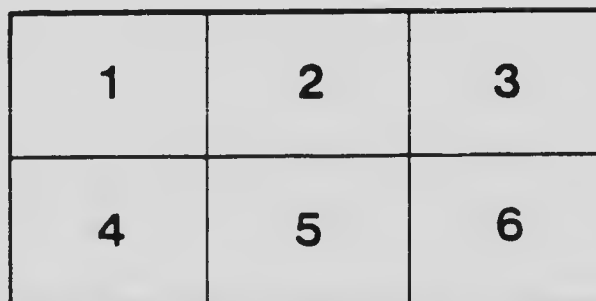
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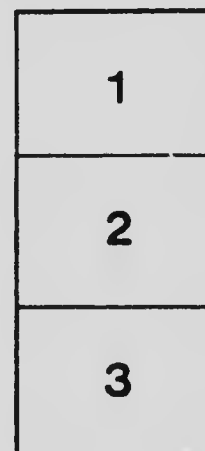

ARSENATE OF LEAD

SIR,—I have the honour to submit herewith a report upon eighty-two sample purchased as Arsenate of Lead in June, July and August of last year.

Consequent upon many complaints regarding the character of this article as offered on the Canadian markets, a collection of 26 samples was made in 1910 (see Bulletin No. 205).

Upon the work then done, and further study of the subject, the following standards were recommended and are incorporated into the fourth schedule to the Adulteration Act, by an amendment dated June 6 1913.

- ARSENATE OF LEAD.—1. An insecticide, containing at least 48 per cent of its weight of solids as a residue when dried to constant weight on the steam bath; and these solids must essentially consist of the pentoxide of arsenic in combination with the monoxide of lead. Water-soluble arsenic (expressed as the tri-oxide of arsenic) must not be present to more than one per cent of the weight of the insecticide as sold.
2. Arsenate of lead shall be regarded as adulterated if any substance has been mixed or packed with it so as to reduce, lower or injuriously affect its quality or strength.

The results obtained by analysis of the 82 samples now reported must be judged in accordance with the legal standards quoted.

The great majority of these samples are sold in the form of a paste, this being the form in which the article is most readily available for use as a spray. In order that the article may not dry out on the shelves of the dealer, it is usually put up in glass or tin containers, and hermetically sealed. Forty-one (41) samples of this collection were furnished to the analyst in the original container, and these are specified in the table. The remainder were furnished in glass bottles or in tins which had been filled by our inspectors from the larger packages of the dealer. Owing to the great difficulty of sampling a paste of this kind, some uncertainty attaches to the determination of the water content

in these cases; and where the containers used by our factors have been imperfectly closed, more or less loss of moisture occurs during storage in the interval between collection and analysis. Indeed many of the samples, as packed by the manufacturer, showed clearly that loss of water had occurred through imperfect sealing. Some of these, put up in tin containers, showed the tin rusted quite through, and the contents dry. This was particularly the case with sample 54148. In spite of these imperfections, a sufficient number of samples, (more than 30) were received in such good condition as to justify the conclusion that, so far as content of solid matter is concerned, the manufacturers of Arsenate of Lead endeavour to meet the requirements of the legal definition.

Water soluble arsenic varies considerably, but in no case does it reach anything like the permitted limit.

With regard to the content of Arsenate of Lead in Arsenic Acid and Oxide of Lead, which are the active ingredients of this insecticide, the following work reported by the New Jersey Experiment Station (Bulletin No. 222) is important. "Arsenate of Lead is prepared by the action of Lead Acetate or Lead Nitrate on Di-Sodium Arsenate. Using pure chemicals the product prepared from the Acetate contains theoretically 74.40 per cent of Oxide of Lead and 25.60 per cent of Arsenic Anhydride. At a conference of manufacturers and entomologists a standard agreed upon was that Lead Arsenate should contain not over 50 per cent water, and not less than 12.5 per cent. Arsenic Anhydride. Fifteen samples of the commercial article gave the following results, calculated to a dry basis:—

Arsenic Anhydride.....	17.94 to 33.30 per cent.
Lead Oxide.....	62.48 to 70.63 "

The great difference noted between theoretical composition and the composition of the manufactured article is due to the formation of basic salts whose amount and character vary with the method of manufacture, the mixtures of salts at different stages of the process determining (along with temperature and other conditions) the establishing of equilibria, which change with every change in the conditioning. It will be noted that the Canadian article, shows a greater uniformity and a nearer approximation to theoretical requirements than the samples analyzed at the New Jersey Station.

The results now placed on record indicate that this article, as offered for sale in Canada, is of very satisfactory character.

I beg to recommend publication of this report as Bulletin No. 234.
