UNIVERSITY CONSOLIDATION. Some of the speakers from the other side of the water, at the convocation of Trinity University on Tuesday, threw out suggestions that the university should in some way consolidate with the University of Toronto, and in that way increase the efficiency of both institutions. We can well imagine that the suggestion was not very well received by the warmer friends of Trinity.
