Considering the remarkable result of the electoral contest, it seems rather a work of supererogation to explain that corruption in the province is a mere excrescence and has no real part in its economy. It was really the defenders of the government who professed to see in the scandals not the hand of the machine but the acts of irresponsible individuals trading upon a debased condition of public feeling.
