CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

—•••••—
CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "THE ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
2. That the membership fee be \$1 per annum, and that all memberships be paid at that rate.
3. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.
4. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling the Association to a badge, and to free entrance for Team Prizes in the Affiliated Associations Matches.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council. The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Ontario for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
6. There shall be a President.
7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Military District.
8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows :
 - 1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected at the annual meeting.
 - 2nd. The ex-Presidents of the Association.
 - 3rd. The Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia for Ontario.
 - 4th. The Brigade Majors of Militia for Ontario.
 - 5th. The Presidents of local Affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association.Five of whom shall form a quorum ; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. Members of the Council may be represented at its meetings by written proxies, containing limited or full powers as may be expressed therein.

Such proxies to be held by members of the Association only, the signature to be duly witnessed, and no member to hold more than one proxy.

10. The Council shall select from its members the President of the Association.

11. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such District, and who shall be elected by the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any way altered, nor new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

15. The annual prize meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

16. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

17. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

18. There shall be an annual meeting to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

19. No change shall be made in the Constitution, except at the annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been sent to the Secretary three months previously, and also posted on the Bulletin Board at the opening of the annual matches.

— o —

BY-LAWS.

The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, on the second day of the Annual Match.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council ; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meeting.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be tendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION

FOR YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1890.

Your Council has the honour to submit the Twenty-second Annual Report of the proceedings of the Ontario Rifle Association.

The Annual Prize Meeting was held on the Association Ranges, Garrison Common, Toronto, on Monday, August 25th, and three following days. The weather was fine and the arrangements such that each match was fired well on time. The attendance was about the same as last year. The number of entries was 297 as against 302 in 1889 and 267 in 1888. Last year the scores made were on an average higher than were ever made at any of the Association's meetings. This year the average scores were not quite as high as last year, this can perhaps be accounted for, as on two days high winds prevailed. In the Tait-Brassey Match for Battalion Teams, 655 was made last year and 576 this year. In the Mulock Aggregate 230 was made last year and 216 this year.

The number of affiliated associations is 46 as against 46 in 1889 and 37 in 1888.

The Treasurer's statements of receipts and disbursements, duly audited, is herewith submitted, shewing a cash balance of \$50 on hand.

As per resolution passed at last Annual Meeting of Members, the accounts are given in greater detail and a statement of assets and liabilities also published.

Your Council desires to acknowledge with thanks the following grants :

His Excellency the Governor-General, silver and bronze medals.

The Dominion Government, its annual grant of \$1,800 ; the Ontario Government, an annual grant of \$1,000 ; the Canada Company, its annual grant of \$127.75 ; Wm. Mulock, Esq., M.P., President, a grant of \$100 ; Colonel Sir C. S. Gzowski, A.D.C. to the Queen, \$50 ; the municipalities of Hamilton, Toronto, Oxford, Norfolk, Victoria, Wentworth and Wellington, grants of \$10 each.

Good arrangements were made this year for the convenience of the Representatives of the Press, and your Council desires to thank the *Mail*, *Empire*, *Globe*, and *World*, of Toronto, and the *Canadian Militia Gazette* of Ottawa, for the full and complete reports furnished by these respective papers.

MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

HELD AT

*Canadian Military Institute, 94½ King St. west, Toronto, Thursday,
June 12th, 1890, at 11 o'clock a.m.*

PRESENT.—Lt.-Col. Otter in the chair; Lt.-Col. Gibson, Lt.-Col. Alger; Major Dunn, Major McSpadden, Capt. Walter Macdonald, Capt. Bruce, Lieut. Rennie, Lieut. Brown, Capt. Harston, Mr. J. Crowe, Staff-Sergt. Bell, Staff-Sergt. Thos. Mitchell. *And by Proxies*—A. J. Green, Essex Centre; Lt.-Col. Caverhill, Montreal; Lt.-Col. Rogers, Peterboro'; Lt.-Col. J. Vance Gravely, Major J. J. Mason, Lieut. E. A. Macnachton, Lt.-Col. John Macpherson, Capt. George Hays, Mr. George Sleeman.

Moved by Major McSpadden, seconded by Major Dunn,

“That Lt.-Col. Otter take the chair.” Carried.

The minutes of meeting held Aug. 27, 1889, and Aug. 28, 1889, were read confirmed.

The Secretary, in the absence of the President, presented proof copy of the printed proceedings of the Association, which was considered by the Council, when it was

Moved by Major McSpadden, seconded by Staff-Sergt. Thos. Mitchell,

“That report and Statement be adopted.” Carried.

The Council then considered the following recommendations to the Council, and the following action was taken:—

1. That unlimited entries be allowed in team matches. Carried.
2. That in M. H. Matches the price of ammunition be included in price of firing ticket. Carried.
3. That ammunition coupons be done away with. Referred to Programme Committee.
4. That registrar keepers be provided with a firing detail memo. Referred to Programme Committee.
5. That, if possible, that the annual meeting be held at night down town, instead of in the afternoon on the range. Carried.

The question of numbering the firing points and lettering the targets was discussed and referred to the Programme Committee.

Moved by Staff-Sergt. Bell, seconded by Capt. Bruce,

"That the Annual Prize Meeting be held the week before the Dominion Rifle Association Matches, and that the following be a committee to draft Prize List, and to appoint Match Staff, viz.:—The President, Lt.-Col. Otter, Lt.-Col. Gibson, Major Delamere, Major Mason, 13th Batt., Capt. Bruce, Asst.-Surgeon McLaughlin, Lieut. Macnachten, Lieut. A. D. Cartwright 47th Batt., Mr. J. Crowe, Guelph, the Treasurer and the Secretary. Carried.

A letter was read from Dr. De La Hooke and was considered, when it was, Moved by Major. McSpadden, seconded by Major Dunn,

"That a bonus of \$30 be granted to Surgeon-Major De La Hooke." Carried.

The Chairman then reported, That at the Council Meeting held March 15th, 1889, a committee, consisting of the President, Lt.-Col. Otter, Lt.-Col. Gibson, Major Delamere and Capt. Bruce, was appointed to meet a committee from the City Council and to receive any proposition from the City Council with regard to the ranges, or to make any proposition to the City Council the committee should see fit in the matter. This committee met in June, 1889, and with His Worship the Mayor, Ald. McMillan and others, went over the ranges and consulted together. The result was a proposition from our committee, dated June 10th, 1889, as follows:—

TORONTO, 10th June, 1889.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you herewith copy of a letter addressed to the President of the City Council of Toronto, respecting the use by the Industrial Exhibition Company of the Garrison Common, &c., together with a copy of the rough sketch and memo. therein referred to.

TORONTO, 10th June, 1889.

To the President City Council, Toronto.

DEAR SIR,—The Committee of the Ontario Rifle Association Council to whom was referred the question of allowing the Industrial Exhibition Association of Toronto the use of an additional strip of the Garrison Common to the south-east of the existing fence, and the further use during Fair time of the remainder of the West Common for the purposes of a horse ring, have given their best consideration to what has been proposed and have concluded to recommend to the Council of the Ontario Rifle Association the adoption of the following basis of settlement between the parties, if acceptable to the City Council:—

1. The present Exhibition ground to be enlarged by removing the present fence eastward to a line running at a distance of fifty feet from the present fence at the north end to a point at a distance of one hundred and fifty feet from the present fence at the south or lake shore end.
2. The use of the western part of the Common to be allowed to the Exhibition Association during the ten days, or at most two weeks during which the Exhibition will be actually held, the Exhibition Association to have the right to enclose that portion of the Common during such time by means of temporary fencing, which shall be removed by the Exhibition Association at the close of the Exhibition each year.

3. The construction, establishment and maintaining of such necessary spar buoys on the lake in front of the line of fire, as may be thought necessary by the Militia Department, and the construction of so much coil work along the shore as may be necessary in order to protect the east end, or that portion of the Common near which the parapet shall be erected, from destruction by washing away at the shore.

4. In consideration of the above the Exhibition Association are to build a new line of rifle butts from about the position now occupied by the middle butt, from the shore at or about right angles to the proposed line of fire, extending a distance of four hundred feet westward according to the rough plan showing general idea of butt, &c., herewith submitted.

5. The same butts to be enclosed by temporary fences, or by using watchmen, or a combination of the two during the continuation of the Exhibition, so they cannot be damaged by the general public.

6. In further consideration the Exhibition Association are to level the Common and drain same with tile drains, and so far as may be necessary to construct such firing points as may be needed, but if the Common shall be properly levelled, firing points will probably be unnecessary.

7. These privileges are to be in the shape of a lease or agreement to be drawn as approved of by the Council of the Rifle Association, such lease to be for a period of five or perhaps ten years, and be subject to the approval of the Militia Department.

MEMO. WITH RANGE SKETCH.

An embankment to be built consisting of a stone wall laid in Portland Cement, of sufficient strength to retain an earthen parapet of not less than 34 feet in height, as per sketch.

The markers' pit to be made on principle and detail the same as present ones, but to be faced with masonry, laid in Portland Cement; flooring to be 9 inches of concrete. Three store rooms, each 16 x 12 feet, with stone walls and concrete floors to be built. The markers' pit, store rooms to be properly drained.

The uprights, standards and gates (of wood) for thirty targets to be made and placed in position.

A crib work to be built for sufficient protection to bank at end of parapet.

A copy of this proposition was sent to the President of the City Council (in the absence of the Mayor). A copy was also sent to Mr. Hill, Secretary of the Industrial Exhibition Association, but as yet no reply has been received.

Col. Otter referred to a resolution passed by the Council June 27th, 1888, throwing the responsibility of the ranges on him as officer in command of the district. He explained that a wharf was being built by the city at the foot of Dufferin street, and running at an angle eastward so as to overlap the property of the Association. He stated that the doing away with the ranges was being unfairly discussed by several newspapers, and an injunction was threatened by the Executive Committee of the City Council to stop firing on the ranges. He said that on account of the Niagara Camp he would be out of town for the next two weeks and therefore did not care to continue the responsibility of the ranges during his absence.

It was decided that no practice should continue after Saturday, 14th June, until Saturday, July 5th, 1890.

The matter of the ranges and the building of the wharf at the foot of Dufferin street was then discussed, when it was,

Moved by Capt. Bruce, seconded by Major Dunn. and carried,

"That the attention of the Minister of Militia be called to the fact that a wharf is being built by the City of Toronto in close proximity to the Rifle Ranges of this Association; the consequence of which will be to increase very much the danger of rifle practice on the rifle ranges. That the position of this wharf and the direction in which it is being extended out into the lake opposite the shore line of this Association's land, combine to make its use as a point for landing passengers dangerous when rifle practice is going on, while general public convenience would be better consulted by placing such wharf at a point further west, out of danger of proximity to the ranges. That in reference to an application for additional room for Exhibition purposes, a proposition was made by this Association meeting the views of a committee from the City Council, on terms which were fair and reasonable, but such proposition has been ignored, and it is now plain and evident that nothing short of the expulsion of the Militia from the common will satisfy the City Council and the Exhibition authorities: It is hereby resolved that the Militia Department, as the lessors to this Association and to the City Council, be asked to interfere and require the Exhibition Association to desist from a course which is obviously intended to prevent the Militia from further having the benefit of the use of the ranges on Garrison Common, and that the attention of the Minister of Militia also be called to the report of the Board of Officers dated 1888, and that a copy of the proposition of this Association of 10th June, 1889, be forwarded to him herewith."

Moved by Staff-Sergt. Mitchell, seconded by Major McSpadden,

"That the following be a committee to proceed to Ottawa as a deputation to wait on the Minister of Militia at as early a date as possible, viz.:—The President, Lt.-Col. Otter, Lt.-Col. Gibson, Lt.-Col. F. C. Denison, Capt. Greville Harston, Capt. Walter Macdonald, Major Delamere, Major Mason, Royal Grenadiers. Major Dunn, Capt. Brock and the Secretary." Carried.

Moved by Capt. Walter Macdonald, seconded by Lieut. Brown,

"That the President be requested to obtain a renewal of the terms mentioned in the existing lease in accordance with its provisoes." Carried.

Meeting adjourned at one o'clock p.m.

ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING

OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

HELD ON THE ASSOCIATION RANGES TORONTO.

25th August, 1890, and following days.

I.—AFFILIATION.

1. The affiliation fee is \$5 (payable by 18th August), irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, which entitles an Association to a medal, and free entrance for team prizes in the "Walker Match."
2. Competitors on affiliated teams must have been members in good standing of such Association for at least thirty days previous to the match, and no competitor can enter as a member of more than one Association.

II.—MEMBERSHIP.

The fee for membership is \$1, irrespective of entrance fees; and all competitors must be members of the Association.

III.—ENTRIES.

Entries, accompanied by the fees, for the first seven matches, must be made (upon forms to be obtained from the Secretary) on or before Wednesday, 20th August; other matches during the first two days of the meeting.

IV.—POST ENTRIES.

1. Post entries (*10 per cent. extra*) will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.
2. Post entries will be detailed to fire according to the number on the ticket issued, but the Council cannot hold themselves responsible

should the holders of such tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.

3. No post entries will be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

V.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Competitors *who are prevented from being present* at the Meeting can have the entrance fees they have paid returned after the Meeting, provided that they return their firing tickets.

2. Competitors who attend the Meeting, but who are prevented from competing by illness, will receive back their entrance fees on production of a medical certificate and their firing tickets.

VI.—TRANSIT.

By arrangement with the Grand Trunk, and Canadian Pacific, Railways, competitors will be carried to and from the Meeting at reduced fares on being furnished by the Secretary of the Association with certificates.

VII.—QUARTERS.

1. Competitors desirous of being near the ranges may obtain a tent and ten blankets on payment of \$1.50, or a Tent alone, \$1.

2. Meals can be obtained on the ground.

VIII.—EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates competing in the "Canada Company," "Tait-Brassey," and "Gzowski" Matches will be required to produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

IX.—RIFLES.

Rifles will be classified as follows :

CLASS I.

MILITARY BREECH-LOADERS.

1. Snider (S.) or Martini-Henry (M. H.) Rifles of *bona-fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Imperial Government viewer's mark.

2. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
3. Sights must be strictly in accordance with Government pattern, and may be *temporarily* coloured with black or white, so long as no application of a permanent nature is used; they may also be shaded by any extemporized means. The sliding bar may be reversed; *temporary* marks or lines removable at pleasure, may be used.
4. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt, admitting, of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock, will be disallowed.

X.—UNIFORM.

Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men competing for prizes restricted to the Militia, must appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps, with a waist belt. Officers need not wear sword belts, nor Officers of Rifle Corps cross belt. Cap covers may be worn. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing. Part uniform and part plain clothes will not be allowed on the ranges.

XI.—AMMUNITION.

1. In all competitions except the revolver, the cost of ammunition will be included in the cost of entries. The register keepers will furnish competitors with the necessary number of rounds at each range. No other ammunition shall be used.

XII.—POSITION.

In no matches will the "back" position (feet to the target) be allowed; and the word "any," relating to position, herein used, shall be considered subject to this qualification.

XIII.—TARGETS AND MARKING.

1. The size of the targets will be for regular matches:—
 - At 200 yards—
 - 4 feet by 4 feet wide; Bull's Eye, 8 inches; Inner, 16 inches; Magpie, 24 inches; Outer, remainder of target.
 - At 400, 500 and 600 yards—
 - 6 feet square; Bull's Eye, 2 feet; Inner, 3 feet; Magpie, 4 feet; Outer, remainder of the target.
 - At 800 and 900 yards—

6 feet by 12 feet wide ; Bull's Eye, 3 feet ; Inner, 4 feet 6 inches ; Magpie, 6 feet square ; Outer, remainder of the target.

For "Gzowski" Match—

Target with two full-sized black silhouette figures on it. One figure of man standing and one kneeling ; a hit on either figure to count one mark.

For "Revolver" Match—

The Standard Revolver Target will be used. Diameter, 12½ inches ; Diameter of Bull's Eye, 1¾ inches. Remainder of Target divided into 6 rings, each ring to count from 1 to 6, Bull's Eye, 7.

2. Hits will be signalled at the butt and entered on the firing ticket according to the following scale :—

HITS.	SIGNAL.	SCORE.
Bull's Eye.....	White disc.....	5 Marks.
Inner.....	Red disc.....	4 "
Magpie.....	White and Black disc.....	3 "
Outer.....	Black disc.....	2 "

3. When two shots strike the target simultaneously, both hits will be marked, and that which has the highest value will be given to the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire.

4. The marking as signalled cannot be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled and the range officer is satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may telephone to the Non-Commissioned Officer at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination shall be final.

5. The competitor challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents, which will be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

6. All claims for shots signalled must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.

XIV.—PENALTIES AND FINES.

Disqualification.

1. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name any other than his own ; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so ; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target ; or

- (d) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind to an employe of the Association, under any pretence whatever ; or
- (e) Who, being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association, shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council or to the Executive ; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable ; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid ; offences ;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.

2. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle within the enclosure, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the firing points in use, and within the hours of shooting ; or
- (d) Who shall discharge his rifle accidentally, either by his own want of care, or by reason of any defect in the rifle ; or
- (e) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous ; or
- (f) Who shall refuse to comply with any order that may be given by the officer in charge of the firing point to which he is detailed ;

shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

Disallowance of Score.

3. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize ; or
- (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize ; or
- (c) Who when competing for an aggregate prize shall omit to enter, or enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the ticket provided for the purpose ;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

Fines.

4. Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar.

XV.—TIES.

Ties will be decided as follows :

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

1. When the firing takes place at more than one distance—
 - (a) By the range totals in inverse order.
 - (b) By the fewest..... *Outers.*
 - (c) By the fewest..... *Magpies.*
 - (d) By the fewest..... *Inners.*
 - (e) By the inverse order of shots.
 - (f) By division if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot at the longest distance, if for prizes in kind.
2. When firing takes place at one distance only—
 - (a) By the fewest..... *Outers.*
 - (b) By the fewest..... *Magpies.*
 - (c) By the fewest..... *Inners.*
 - (d) By the inverse order of shots.
 - (e) By division, if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot, if for prizes in value.

IN TEAM COMPETITIONS.

- (a) If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.
- (b) By the fewest..... *Outers.*
- (c) By the fewest..... *Magpies.*
- (d) By the fewest..... *Inners.*
- (e) By the total of each round in inverse order.
- (f) By the highest scorer in each team shooting off three rounds at the longest distance.

IN AGGREGATES.

1. By score at each match in inverse order.
2. By following the rules for individual ties.

The names of competitors who have to shoot off ties will be posted up daily at 8.30 a.m. and 12.30 noon, on the Ties Notice Board.

XVI.—PRIZE WINNERS.

1. Winners of Prizes must apply to the Treasurer's Office on the ground for them, and on receiving the amount of such prizes sign a receipt for the same
2. All prizes not claimed before the 31st December, 1890 will be forfeited to the Association.

XVII.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The meeting will be under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of the chairman and two members of the Council, to be nominated by the Council, whose decision shall be final and binding in all matters submitted to them for their consideration; but they may, at their discretion, refer any questions to the decision of the Council, in which case the decision of the Council on such questions shall be final.

1. All competitors will be subject to the Executive Committee, Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the Camp Police, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the meeting.
2. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the meeting, as also with the conditions attached to the prize or prizes for which they have entered, *as the plea of ignorance of such regulations and conditions will not be entertained.*
3. They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original details.
4. They must attend at the firing point punctually at the hour detailed and deliver their tickets to the Register Keeper. Unless a competitor produces his firing ticket at the firing point, he will not be allowed to fire. Should a competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so *by his own neglect* miss the opportunity given him of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, his claim on the Association in regard to such compensation will be cancelled.
5. The Matches will take place, if possible, at the time named. Any deviations from the rule will be posted on the Board at the Secretary's Hut. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
6. The firing will begin daily at 9 a.m., and cease when the mid-day gun is fired. It will be resumed at 1 p.m., and cease at 6 p.m.
7. Two guns will be fired for the "Fire," one ten (10) minutes before the named hour, to warn competitors to move to the firing points: the second being the signal that firing is to begin. Two guns also at the "Cease Fire," one ten (10) minutes before the named hour, after which no competitor will be allowed to begin his score; the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun, are completed.

8. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.
 9. No hair triggers will be allowed.
 10. Slings may be used as an assistance at all matches ; but in those restricted to the Militia the slings must be of regulation length and pattern, and attached to the rifles, as in Government arms.
 11. No "sighting" or "fouling" shots will be allowed.
 12. Competitors may wipe out or clean out their rifles, during any competition between distances only.
 13. No two competitors shall shoot with the same rifle in the same match (except in the "Martini-Henry"); nor shall a competitor change his rifle during a match, unless it becomes unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Range Officer.
 14. Every competitor must enter and shoot under his own name, and unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.
 15. No Member of a squad or firing party shall absent himself without leave during firing. Any Competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.
 16. No competitor shall load his rifle until called to the front to shoot.
 17. In all competitions competitors will be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*, but only one file at a time will be allowed within the firing ropes ; and no person, except the Register Keeper, will be permitted to speak to a competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point, except in cases hereafter specified.
 18. Where only one competitor is present he must necessarily fire his shots consecutively and without undue delay.
 19. A competitor may have any one present within the ropes to see that the scores recorded by the Register Keeper are in accordance with the signals from the butts.
 20. In individual competitions, a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so is not allowed to delay the shooting.
 21. No person, except as provided in clause 19, will be permitted within the ropes, or allowed to offer advice or give instruction to competitors.
- Any violation of this rule, or any part of it, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on a repetition of the offence, shall report the same to the Executive Committee, who will deal with the case as laid down in the Regulations under the head of Penalties, and may remove any person advising or instructing a competitor from the ground.
22. Any competitor protesting against the ruling of the Officer of the Range, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way, must make a statement of his grievances in writing (upon forms to be had at the office) giving

the names of two or more members of the squad who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it to the Secretary ; but his firing must not be delayed for that purpose.

23. No practice will be allowed on the ranges during the continuance of the meeting, either before or after the day's firing.
