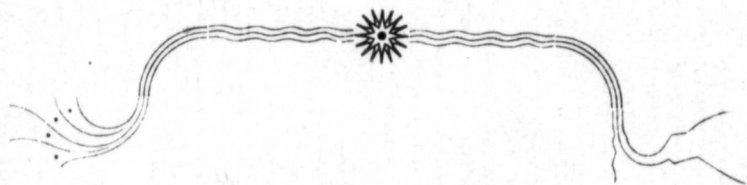

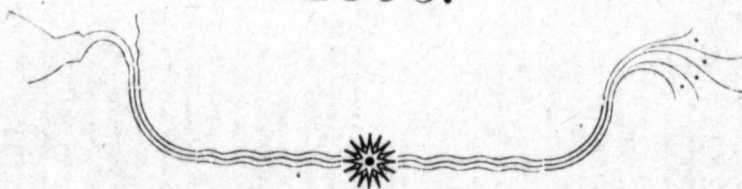

The TWELTH SESSION of the NOVA SCOTIA CONFERENCE was opened in the Methodist Church, Bear River, on Thursday, June 20th, 1895, at 9 o'clock, a. m., the President, the REV. W. H. EVANS, in the Chair.

After devotional exercises, the retiring President addressed the Conference.

STANLEY C. LEONARD, A. B.

STANLEY CHIPMAN LEONARD was born in 1866, and converted at the age of nineteen. This event of his spiritual life took place in Truro, while attending the Normal School of that town, and during revival services conducted there by Evangelist Meikle.

After proceeding to the degree of B. A., at Mt. Allison University, he offered himself for the work of the Nova Scotia Conference, and was assigned to the Digby Neck Mission, his first and only circuit. Here he labored for a year and a half. About the middle of the second year, a severe cold taken through exposure and overwork, confined him to the house, and finally culminated in obstinate lung disease. He was obliged, in the spring of 1894, to remove to his home, at Paradise, and there lingered for another year, sometimes with apparently increased vitality, but most of the time convinced that death must ensue. There he departed this life at the age of twenty-nine.

Though Brother Leonard's life and term of service were so short, the world was the better for his having lived in it. His heart was in his work, and that work was owned of God. His first sermon before entering Conference work was the means of the awakening and salvation of several persons. Though so brief a time was allowed him in the ministry of the Gospel, that ministry was not without its seals in his sole circuit. Quite a number of persons were added to our Church during his stay on that field.

Brother Leonard was of bright active mind, most agreeable disposition, and respectable ability. He was thoroughly respected on his charge as a man of God, and as a laborer in the Master's vineyard. Talents were only beginning to develop through study and the exercise of the ministry, which, with longer life, might have been of great service to the church. Testimony to his zeal and faithfulness was frequently heard from his appreciative people. He loved the Lord, and next he loved Methodism. That such an ardent soul should be taken from the toil he loved, such a promising worker from a share in the responsibilities of the coming years, and so choice a young man from his relatives and friends, must be classed among the things we are to know hereafter.

During his illness Brother Leonard manifested an eager desire to live, but was submissive to whatever might be the Divine will. Sometimes a faint hope would revive that his life might be prolonged; then would follow a season of trial, but never of doubt in regard to the wisdom and love of the Divine will, or his relation to God through Christ. He eagerly waited till "his great change should come," and, though he was not without sufferings, the joy of the anticipated issue was greater than the sufferings. So closed his brief life and briefer ministry, "Christ being magnified in his body both by life and by death."

JONATHAN C. OGDEN.

BROTHER OGDEN was born in the vicinity of Huddersfield, Yorkshire, England, June 4th, 1849, and was endowed with characteristic qualities which have won for Yorkshire men pre-eminence, the world over. He was accepted as a candidate for the ministry in 1874, the last Conference of Eastern British America. After two years of circuit work, he spent four years at Mount Allison University, dating from 1876. At college, Brother Ogden took rank as an earnest and successful student. As he had preaching ability of a high order, lofty aims and ideals, passionate devotion to ministerial duties, it was expected that his career would be one of distinction and usefulness. But early came interruption in circuit work and premonitions of fatal disease. Unfavorable symptoms yielded for the time to medical treatment, and for a few years his work was prosecuted with considerable vigor. He had just completed a three years term at Petite Riviere and was preparing for removal to a new circuit. His people doubtless anticipated a "farewell" sermon on that Sabbath, but instead came the monitory message that their beloved pastor had already said a last farewell to friends and scenes of earth. Suddenly came the closing scene. A ruptured valve, a severed tissue, a broken thread, and then the ministry of angels, the lifted veil, the fulness of beatific vision.

He labored with much acceptance on the Wentworth, North East Harbor, Bridge-water, Liverpool, Leicester and Petite Riviere Circuits and died at the last named place on Sunday morning, July 8th, 1894. His life, words, and work certify that Brother Ogden was a man of God.

REPORT OF STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report that the various schedules have been filled up with more than ordinary care and correctness by the several Secretaries of Districts. This made the work of your Committee easier than in some former years.

The membership of the Church appears to be, including those on trial, 14,629, an increase of 404. This increase occurs after making provision for losses by withdrawal, death, and removal amounting to 685.

The Official Board returns shew 126 Ministers and Probationers, and 1,456 as the net total of members of Quarterly Boards.

CONSTITUTION FOR SUSTENTATION FUND.

I.

This Fund shall be called "The Sustentation Fund of the Nova Scotia Conference."

II.

The general management of this Fund shall be in the hands of a Committee, which shall consist of a minister and Layman from each District, who shall be chosen at the Annual Session of the District, together with a Secretary-Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot by the Conference.

III.

The Fund shall consist of such monies as may be raised in the bounds of the Conference in the manner following, viz. :—

- (a)—By Legacies or Special Donations.
- (b)—By donations or Annuity.
- (c)—Subscriptions and Collections on various Circuits.

IV.

In making disbursements the Committee shall be governed by the following regulations :—

I.—Probationers shall be estimated to receive a salary of \$300. Ordained unmarried men in full connection \$350. Married men in full work \$650.

II.—Should there be any balance after raising the salaries to the above-mentioned figures, such balance to be divided *pro rata* until young men receive \$350. Ordained unmarried men in full connection \$400. Ordained married men \$750. Provided always no claimant receive from all sources beyond disciplinary allowance.

III.—The basis of distribution shall be the amount estimated by Financial District Meetings.

IV.—The Committee shall have power to consider any special cases which may arise, and to take such action as may be considered necessary.

REPORT OF SUPERNUMERARY FUND COMMITTEE.

The Committee rejoice in being able to report a substantial increase in the contributions of the Circuits to this fund, an increase which shews that greater attention than usual has been paid to the duty of explaining its nature and its claims to our people. Every district has participated in this increase except one, a district which had already reached the disciplinary and old fashioned requirement of ten cents per member. The total amount received from Circuits this year is \$1,481.61, which is \$59.11 over and above the amount required to meet the standard of ten cents per member on the membership returned to the last General Conference in 1894, and is \$151.77 in advance of the contributions of last year. Even when compared with the increased membership of this year, the contributions are still in excess of an average of ten cents per member.

 SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT.

The interest of the Sunday School Report centres this year in the fact that there are increases nearly all along the line.

Although there was a gain last year of 243 scholars, there is a further increase this year of 388, not counting those in Union Schools.

We rejoice that 455 have united with the Church, being only 14 less than were converted last year.

We call the attention of S. S. workers to the fact that our own periodicals are the best published on the continent, and that our schools have this year

increased their circulation, there being 335 copies *less* of other publications in use during the year. The increase is found in "Onward," "Happy Days," etc.

We direct serious attention to the fact that there is a decrease of 649 in the number learning catechism, and recommend this part of our work to the more careful consideration of S. S. Superintendents.

Very creditable increases are noted in sums raised for "School Purposes" and "Sabbath School Aid Fund." Amounts have also been raised for other specific purposes. We regret that these should interfere with Missionary Collections and that there is a further decrease this year of \$135.78 in this important fund. Let our young people be put earnestly to work and they will soon roll this decrease into a substantial increase.

Herd labored, your Committee find great reason to praise God for the large degree of success that has attended this part of our work. The encouragement and timely help afforded our pastors and people have in many cases enabled them to undertake special work that otherwise could not have been engaged in, resulting in the upbuilding of believers and the conversion of many unsaved ones.

At a meeting of your Committee held March 18th, 1895, correspondence from Bro. Wm. Ainley was held in reference to his purpose of offering himself as an evangelist.

The matter was discussed at some length. It was moved by Rev. F. H. Wright, seconded by Dr. T. W. Smith, as follows:—

That the Evangelist Committee recognizing the fact that a conviction such as that which has taken hold upon Bro. Ainley in regard to Evangelistic work is not to be lightly set aside, hereby expresses its opinion that it is desirable that Bro. Ainley be left without a Circuit for a year in order that he may devote himself more specifically to the work of an Evangelist. At the same time the Committee straitened by gradually lessening resources, and having on hand work which it cannot give up, regrets its inability to recommend to Conference that a guarantee of financial support from the Evangelistic fund shall be given to Bro. Ainley.

A NEW ENTERPRISE.

A proposal has been made during the year to the Evangelistic committee for undertaking evangelistic and colportage work on new lines; the evangelist to be furnished with a covered waggon, to have associated with him a college student. The proposed plan is to carry on the work through the summer months, hold evangelistic services through the territory traversed as they may be arranged in concurrence with the ministers of the circuits. It is proposed that the plan shall include a vigorous canvass for the *Wesleyan*, Sunday school libraries and Methodist literature supplied by the Book Room.

REPORT OF SPECIAL EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE.

The Committee appointed to consider and report on the recommendation of the Evangelistic Committee on the matter of securing a covered waggon for work throughout the province, begs to report heartily in favor of the scheme, provided the Evangelistic Committee can see its way clear to meet the expense of the undertaking.

This report was adopted.

EPWORTH LEAGUE REPORT.

Your Committee having carefully reviewed the reports from the districts, finds an increase in the number of Young People's Societies. The number of Leagues reported this year is 80, with a membership of 3,638, and \$1691.99 raised for various purposes. This is an increase of 12 in the number of Societies, 780 in membership, and \$597.51 in receipts.

The Committee recommends that the Epworth Leagues and other Young People's Societies meet in Truro in August, one day previous to Christian Endeavour Convention, to organize a Conference Convention, and that a Committee of five be appointed to secure the presence of Rev. A. C. Crews, the General Secretary of Epworth League Board.

The Committee would request the editor of the *Wesleyan* to grant more space for Epworth League matter, as necessity requires it, and urges the Societies to make use of the columns set apart for this purpose, and that they seek to increase the interest of the membership in the *Wesleyan* as an organ of the Young People's Societies.

Camp Meeting Association. The moral and spiritual results of the Camp Meeting service have been so marked as to justify its continued existence, and to deserve the confidence and support of both ministry and people. Some years the services have been attended with strong revival influences: and no year, in its history, has passed without some souls being saved, and many believers being lifted to a higher plane of christian living. The united efforts of the Rev. N. H. Brown of Norwich, Conn., and of the attending ministers of our own Conference were last year richly blessed of God. Bro. Brown has been engaged for the services of the present year. The new dormitory containing twenty rooms, and capable of accomodating sixty persons, will be under the charge of a matron, and will furnish additional facilities for the more successful prosecution of the work of the Association. And inasmuch as our work is increasing, with a larger number from the various circuits attending, your committee most earnestly urge the attendance of our ministers to help lead their own people to God, and to confirm them in a life of holiness. The Executive has decided to begin the services this year, on the 1st of August at 9 a. m. The Rev. William Ainley is recommended to the Conference as Superintendent of the services for 1895.

REPORT OF THE TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

1. Your Committee believe alcohol to be a poison, often harmful even when used as a medicine, and through the various beverages into which it enters terribly destructive to the bodily, mental and spiritual health of men; and that for a man to drink intoxicating liquors is to inflict an injury upon himself, and so to sin against God, his own soul and the state of which he is a subject.

2. They look with favor upon the work of the various total abstinence societies and W. C. T. U.'s, the lessons on alcohol and its effects upon the human system taught in the public schools, the pledging of the children in our Sunday Schools, and various other agencies now employed to spread knowledge and create sentiment unfavorable to the liquor habit and the liquor traffic.

3. No community can allow the traffic to perpetuate itself without sinning against all the highest and holiest attainments and possibilities of our nature.

4. Members of the Methodist Church cannot contribute by inaction, much less by voice, vote or influence to its perpetuation without incurring special guilt.

5. The most effective instrument of attack upon the traffic is a prohibitory law, but even a prohibitory law is practicably valueless unless resolutely and steadily enforced by a people who have made up their minds to crush the evil.

6. The prohibitory law for the whole country, so long desired by us, has not yet been obtained.

7. The speediest way of obtaining such a law would be entered upon if one of the great political parties should adopt the principles at once, and make it a leading issue until it carried the country.

8. Since neither party has consented to do this and the leaders of both regard the country as not yet ripe for such legislation, a slower method must be adopted by prohibitionists if anything is to be immediately effected; and this slower method was prescribed by Sir John A. Macdonald a few years ago, and again last winter by the present Government leader in the House of Commons—it is that of electing prohibitionists to parliament.

9. The election of prohibitionists to Parliament can scarcely be accomplished, except through the organization of the prohibitionists of the various political constituencies for the purpose;

10. *Therefore resolved*, That this Conference recommends that all the Methodist electors in each constituency within its bounds labor to secure the organization of all prohibitionists on any lines which may seem to them most likely to lead to success, and pledges its members to active work in this direction;

11. *Also resolved*, That while Woman Suffrage in general is a right based upon the grounds of our common humanity, the claim of woman to a voice in determining the fate of a traffic from which she and those she holds dearest have endured so much suffering is a thing too evident to be gainsaid;

12. *Also resolved*, That at least one Sunday in each year shall be observed on all our Circuits and Missions as Temperance Sunday; that this Sunday shall be either the one next preceding Christmas holidays, or the nearest available one preceding Dominion Day; and that the subject of Prohibition be discussed in all our pulpits in connection with each Dominion election.

UNLICENSED MINISTERS.

Whereas, From time to time persons who are strangers to our Conference come amongst us requesting access to our pulpits and soliciting letters of recommendation from our ministers ;

Resolved, That this Conference hereby urges upon the several Circuits that all such applications be refused, except to those who produce unmistakable credentials.

SPIRITUAL REPORTS.

Resolved, That written spiritual reports be required of Superintendents of Circuits as well as from Missions at the Annual District Meeting.

CORRECT STATISTICS.

Resolved, That the attention of the Chairman of Districts be called to the very serious delay and trouble caused by Circuit and District schedules not being properly audited as required by Discipline, and that they be urged not to sign any District Minutes in future until the schedules be completed and audited, ready for presentation to the Statistical Committee.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS.

THANKS TO EX-PRESIDENT EVANS.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Conference are due and are hereby presented to the Rev. W. H. Evans, who now retires from the presidential chair, for the valuable services rendered to the Conference and the Church during his year of office. Particularly would we place on record our appreciation of his unfailing Christian courtesy, his impartiality in ruling, and his faithfulness in the administration of the discipline of the Church.

GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT CARMAN.

Resolved, That the Conference of Nova Scotia, met at Bear River, has rejoiced to welcome Rev. Dr. Carman to its Sessions, feeling that his presence has been a benediction to the brethren. By exposition of the doctrines and polity of our Church, both in ordinary sessions and in the more public services of Conference, he has rendered us invaluable assistance. We beg to assure the General Superintendent of our sympathy with him in the onerous official duties which he is called to discharge, and we pray that he may be abundantly sustained in his work.

REV. DR. LATHERN.

The affairs of our Connexional Organ "THE WESLEYAN" having passed under review, the Conference desires to record:—

1st. Its high estimate of the earnest labor of the retiring editor, the Rev. Dr. Lathern, and to assure him of their sincere appreciation of his efforts to promote the interests of the Church of God, as editor of our paper. In welcoming Dr. Lathern back to the pastorate, we do so assured of his abilities as a minister of Christ and as a transparent devoted Christian, and pray that he may long be spared to serve the Church of his choice.

has attended the educational work in all departments, and for the encouraging outlook. It is a great gratification to know that the increased current expenditure, involved in the erection of costly buildings demanded for enlarged facilities of education, has been successfully met, and we beg to assure the honored President of our University and efficient coadjutors in the prosecution of this great enterprise of our Church, of our continued sympathy, and pledge ourselves to earnest and practical co-operation in meeting increased financial outlay.

SYSTEMATIC GIVING.

The Conference ordered that a circular letter be addressed to all our Quarterly Official Boards, urging upon them the duty of the Stewards of each Circuit to obtain as early as possible, not later than August in each year, pledges from the members of our congregations to contribute definite amounts, in a systematic way, towards the support of the Church and its ministry.

Revs. Jos. G. Angwin and J. L. Dawson were directed to prepare and issue such a circular in the name of the Conference.

PERMANENT DISTRICT RECORDS.

It was resolved that permanent record books for district minutes be prepared, and the Book Steward was authorized to secure them.

IRREGULAR DONATIONS.

Whereas cause exists for action, it was resolved that this Conference declares its disapproval of the institution or encouragement, by the members or adherents of our Church on any Circuit, of donation visits or anything analagous thereto, in aid of any preacher laboring on any charge other than that within which such aid is desired, and its disallowance of any preacher knowingly accepting any financial assistance proffered in opposition to the spirit of this deliverance.

LISTS OF MEMBERSHIP.

It having been brought to the notice of the Conference that, in certain cases, brethren, in vacating their circuits, have left in place of the record of membership required by discipline, lists written several years previous to their removal, to the great inconvenience of their successors on these Circuits.

Therefore resolved, That, in future, all such disregard of the disciplinary requirements be reported to the next annual meeting of the district in which the neglect shall have occurred.

HYMN AND TUNE BOOK.

The attention of the Conference having been directed to the fact of the publication of a hymn and tune book, and believing that it is well calculated to promote the interests of congregational worship, earnestly recommends its use in our Churches.

REV. C. H. PAISLEY, A. M., SUPERNUMERARY FUND AGENT.

Resolved, That we approve of the action of the General Committee of the Supernumerary Ministers and Ministers' Widows Fund in the appointment of the Rev. Charles H. Paisley, A. M., to the position of agent of that fund for a portion of the year, and that we promise to co-operate with him in his efforts to enlarge the capital stock of the fund.

Resolved, also, that we earnestly commend Mr. Paisley to our people and congregations and trust that they will manifest in this matter the interest which its great importance to the working of our itinerant system demands.

Following the suggestion made by the General Committee, the Conference initiated the movement by taking shares of the value of \$5.00 each, to be paid annually for the period of four years. Fifty-four shares were taken, representing ten hundred and eighty dollars for the four years.

JUBILEE.

It was brought to the attention of the Conference that Revs. G. O. Huestis and James Taylor would reach the jubilee of their ministry at next Conference, and the President and the Superintendent of the Conference Circuit were appointed to make suitable arrangements for celebrating the event.

APPEAL.

The case of A. W. Nicolson's successful appeal against the Conference was referred to the General Supernumerary Board for consideration and adjustment.

CONDOLENCE.

Letters of condolence were sent to the family and friends of the late Rev J. C. Ogden and Stanley C. Leonard.

REVS. JOHN AND GEO. F. JOHNSON, A.B.

Resolved, That the members of this Conference desire to express their Christian sympathy with the brethren, John and Geo. F. Johnson, in the death of their brother, Levi S. Johnson, of the N. B. and P. E. I. Conference, which has just taken place in California. The deceased minister was a son of Nova Scotia Methodism, and for a number of years labored successfully within the bounds of our Conference. The members of this Conference rejoice with the brethren named in the knowledge that the deceased brother awaited with Christian calmness the moment of departure, believing that heaven lay as near him in the milder climate in which he sought rest and health as in the home of his early days.
