HOUSEHOLD HELPS

How To Boil Rice

Put 8 quarts of boiling water into a kettle, add a teaspoon of salt and let the water boil rapidly. Wash one cup of rice, sprinkle the rice so gradually into the water that you will not stop the boiling. When you have it all in give the water a twirl with a fork, cover the kettle and boil rapidly 20 minutes, then pour into a collander to drain. Place the collander on a tin dish, stand it in the oven for five minutes to dry, leaving the door wide open, then turn it carefully into a heated dish. Serve without a cover. Boil rapidly from the time you cover the kettle till you take it off. The rapid boiling allows each grain to swell to three times its normal size and the motion prevents the grains sticking together. Do not stir it, as this will cause it to fall to the bottom and burn. The drying in the oven with the door open evaporates the moisture, leaving the rice soft, snowy white and perfectly dry.

Neapolitan Ice Cream
Scald one quart of cream in a double boiler; do not boil it. Beat the yolks of six eggs with one cup-of sugar until light and foamy. Beat the whites of three eggs until stiff, and fold into the yolks and sugar. Add a pinch of salt. Pour the hot cream into the eggs—a little at a time and beating constantly. Turn back into the double boiler and cook very slowly until of the consistency of custard. Strain and allow to get perfectly cold. Flavor and freeze.


Pastry Recipe



NORE EVIDEDCE OF DEFECTIVE GEAR

Crew of Collier Alden Noticed Empress Zig-Zagging Down St. Lawrence - Captain Murray's Experiment

Quebec, June 19-The alleged defective eering gear of the Empress of Ireland nd the rapidity with which she went o the bottom of the St. Lawrence after eing struck by the collier Storstad on May 29, formed the two most conspicu-ous details connected with the calamity enquired into today by the dominion commission sitting in the court house

On the first of these two points, evidence was submitted by a number of sailors and Pilot Napoleon Lapierre, who were on the collier Alden, which was based by the Empress around the time that she was said to be steering badly by James Galwoy, a quartermaster, who claimed yesterday that the liner's helm immed for three minutes on the night of the disaster. These witnesses all agreed that the Empress, as the pilot but it, zig-zagged down the river, though they all had to confess that while still a good distance away she showed red to red in conformity with navigation aws and passed more than a cable's ength away.

laws and passed more than a cable's length away.

Captain Murray, a former commander of the Empress of Ireland, described how he had experimented with her sister ship and had put her from full speed ahead to full speed astern in two minutes and fifteen seconds.

After a close cross-examination by Mr. Haight as to whether such a severe strain was usually put on the engines under normal conditions, and after Captain Murray had said it was not, the witness explained that the officer on the bridge could indicate the necessity for hurry in going astern by simply giving two rings on the telegraph.

Napoleon Lapierre, the pilot on the collier Alden, swore that the Empress of Ireland, as she approached the ship he was in charge of on the night of May 28, zigzagged, showing first her red light a couple of times and then her green. At one time she was showing both her red and green together. Ultimately she went by a cable's length away.

Ottawa, June 19—Colonel, the Hon. Sam Hughes, has got his political and his military tactics badly mixed up. As a result he is unprotected against a lively cross fire.

The colonel's explanation of the apparent "mutiny" of the 65th regiment of Montreal, in carrying rifles in the Corpus Christi procession on Sunday of last week, contrary to regulations, has not appeased the Orangemen of Ontario, who are now attacking him through the Orange Sentinel. His abortive attempt to prevent the regiment from following its time-honored custom and "presenting arms" to the Host has brought him trouble from Quebec.



The work is naturally of a most varied kind, and the trustee's powers are very wide, as they need to be; the funds are usually small—often as low as £20, and rarely higher than £700. Work of this character is troublesome, and the fees charged for its performance do not actually cover expenses, but the trustee is content. The fees paid by the wealthy people help to eke out the definiencies of the fees paid by the poor.

The lady visitor goes into the homes of the wealthy and of the moderately wealthy, to see how the children who benefit under larger trusts are progressing. She sees them off to school, too, and meets them when school term comes to an end.

In the Wake of Disaster.


A new but very useful side of the public trustee's activities is associated with what are known as "disaster funds." It is becoming the practice where funds are raised by public subscription to place the money in the hands of the public trustee for distribution. The most noticeable case of this class with which he has dealt is the "Titantic" Fund, amounting to £418,210, which was raised for the benefit of the widows and dependents of the crew and passengers who lost their lives in that terrible disaster. The Mansion House Committee, who received the subscriptions, decided to ask the public trustee to undertake the permanent administration of the fund as co-trustee with the lord mayor, and steps were promptly taken to organise a practical scheme. Local committees were set up; local lady visitors were appointed to visit the claimants on the fund, to ascertain the details of each claim, to verify the facts, and to keep in touch with the varying circumstances of the claimants.





When the rich Russ hears a song, ung or a guitar played, in a way which sung or a guitar played, in a way which pleases him, he commonly lays a fifty or hundred rouble note (\$25 or \$50 on a plate, and sends it to the performer. Vialtseva once received \$2,000 on a single night. So while the indifferent Russian singer spends everything and often ends as a hanger-on of charity, the successful gipsy performer owns big apartmenthouses, landed estates and mills; and one famous gipsy girl of forty years back, after her retirement from the stage established the biggest brandy distillery in East Russia.






