

REPORT OF AUGMENTATION COMMITTEE.

(EASTERN SECTION.)

In pursuance of the liberty granted by last Assembly, the Committee at its semi-annual meeting in October, made grants as follows:—

The Committee submitted to Synod as usual a statement of the affairs of the Fund. After full discussion it was agreed to allocate to Presbyteries to be raised for the Fund, \$8000, and to draw upon the balance in Fund to pay the grants in full amounting to \$9219.45, and also expenses of \$430.55,—making a total of \$9650.00, or \$1650.00 more than was asked from the people. The Synod made the allocation on the same principle as of previous years. The following tabular statement exhibits the result:—

Seven Presbyteries and I61 Congegations raised all that was asked from them; Twenty-five other Congregations made collections, and several of these very nearly reached the allotment. Had the remaining ten done even fairly well more than the \$8000 would have been raised.* Enough, however, has been done to show that the scheme has a deep hold on the hearts of the people, and that there is promise in it of a successful future. In addition to the \$7864.64 contributed by congregations, as such, there were donations and small bequests amounting to \$112.50 and interest to \$105.00, making a total of receipts of \$8082.14. Thus the Fund has been drawn upon beyond what has been raised to the extent of \$1567.86, and the balance now in hand is \$344.85 less than the \$4000.00 of a working balance with which the scheme was started. In other words the Fund is really in debt \$344.85. This fact, taken along with that shown in the tabulated appendix that \$9500.00 will be needed to cover the expenditure of the present year, shews that a gross revenue of \$9800.00 will be called for this year to put everything on a satisfactory footing.

The Committee is not without anxiety on this subject; yet it believes that when the matter is fairly laid before the Synod some plan can be devised to meet the demands and still retain the working balance in the Fund. Its hope lies not so much in the line of increasing the contributions to the Fund as in that of lessening the demands upon it. This must be done by a general advance in self support on the part of the supplemented charges. In this way the salaries would not be lowered, whilst the grants could be reduced. Eighteen hundred dollars spread over 60 supplemented congregations only gives an average of \$30.00 apiece. Of course this average cannot be always obtained, or even the proportion of it which corresponds to the proportion of the present grant to the total outlay, but in many cases much more than that proportion can be secured by the visitation of a Presbyterial, delegate who will lay the matter fully before the people, and canvass them either personally or by members of their own Committee. In many cases much has already been accomplished. Since the scheme came into operation 6 supple mented congregations have been fostered into complete self-support, and there has been a total increase in local support of \$4686.00 The past year shows an increase to stipend of \$930 by the supplemented Congregations, and also two Congregations, viz., Parrsboro and Loch Lomond, which together received last year \$200, that have retired from the benefits of the Fund. This decided step in advance the Committee thinks can yet be followed by others equally great and gratifying; and the purpose of the Committee is to urge them forward, so that the Fund shall serve as a stimulus to Congregations willing to help themselves, and not as an endowment on which indolent and selfish ones feel that they have a right to lean, no matter how illiberally they themselves may be giving. It is pleasing to note that increase of liberality to the schemes is keeping pace with the growth of stipends. Last year the supplemented charges contributed to the Augmentation Fund \$1,185 as against \$1,090 the year previous and \$3,358 to the other Funds as against \$3,213.

The Committee respectfully asks leave of Assembly to deal with all the cases marked in the appendix as deferred, amounting in all to 15, should there be found necessity for so doing. It also asks the Assembly to sanction the grants already made to 46 Congregations, subject of course to the rules for payment prescribed by the Assembly. In a few instances grants have been made where the Congregations do not quite qualify, but these are either special cases, or have had the most careful investigation and consideration from the Committee, and are believed to be really, if not technically, entitled to share in the benefits of the Fund.
