But we will suppose that our farmers are all cash men and have no need to ask for credit from any man. If so, what is to hinder them from buying their binder in the United States, where it can be got for almost half price? According to Mr. Conant's statement a binder in the United States only costs \$110, the Canadian Government only exacts 35 per cent. duty, er \$38.50 toll upon it, and the freight charges would probably, on account of


