The Butts to be Removed—Progress of Toronto's Great Fair.

"We desire to negotiate without any restriction of reciprocity," says Mr. Blaine to Mr. Baker.

Not only did Mr. Blaine "practically reject" one proposal by saying that he would not entertain a totally different one, not only did he perform this feat by writing to a person who couldn't have had any part in any Canadian proposal, but "it was very fortunate," says the Globe, that Mr. Blaine "practically rejected" the proposal that was "lying on his desk," i. e., the proposal for perfectly unrestricted reciprocity for a new Reciprocity Treaty.

"Very fortunate" is the excellent but slightly confused journal slap against Sir Richard, who appears to wish the people to believe that Mr. Blaine is fishing for unrestricted reciprocity. But enough of this—let us finish the selected sentence with the reflection that it may sometimes be worth while to express all one's feelings to the people by a statement cooked to imply a whole series of falsehoods.

A pet phrase of his in talking about the reciprocity treaty is 'the old man's wig.' Also for Sir John, he wriggled. He refuses to lie still and be admired.
