## CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

---

### I.

The Society shall be called the **DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.**

### II.

No alteration shall be made in the Constitution of this Society, nor shall any Bye-Law, Rules or Regulations of the Society be repealed, annulled, or altered, except at a Meeting of the General Committee, by the vote of at least two-thirds of the members present, nor until it shall have received the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; which sanction must be given in writing, and delivered to the Secretary within six months of the said Meeting.

### III.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution, nor any repeal, cancellation, alteration or amendment of any Bye-Law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, shall be proposed or made at any Meeting, unless notice shall have been given in writing at the next previous Annual Meeting of the General Committee, or at the next previous Anniversary Meeting, of such proposed repeal or cancellation, nor unless the terms of such proposed alteration or amendment shall have been stated in writing at such previous Meeting; from which, without the unanimous consent of the members present, no deviation, except of a mere formal nature, shall be permitted.

### IV.

No repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment, shall be proposed, except by a member qualified to vote, at the Anniversary Meeting, whose name shall be en-

tered on the Minutes of the Secretary, together with the said proposition.

## V.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same, a Member of the Society. Provided that no member shall be qualified to vote at any General Meeting of the Society, unless of the full age of twenty-one years, nor unless he be a Life Member, or shall have subscribed and paid at least five shillings during the year preceding such Meeting.

## VI.

**OFFICERS.**

1. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, two or more Vice Presidents, a Treasurer, one or more Secretaries, and two Auditors of Accounts.

2. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the Society, and the Archdeacon the Senior Vice-President; and any Life Member may, at any Anniversary Meeting, be elected a Vice-President of the Society.

3. The Treasurer, Secretary, or Secretaries, and the Auditors, shall be annually elected at the meetings of the General Committee; and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the Province, of any such Officer, the vacancy shall be filled up by the Executive Committee, at its next or any subsequent Meeting within the year; and the Lord Bishop shall, if he see fit, call a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee, for the purpose of filling any such vacancy.

## VII.

**EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.**

All Clergymen resident in the Diocese, duly licenced by the Lord Bishop, and Subscribers to the Society.

And twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members, or Annual Subscribers of at least One Pound; to be annually elected, at the meetings of the General Committee, provided that no Annual Subscriber shall be qualified to be elected, unless he shall, during the year preceding each meeting, have paid the subscription of at least One Pound.

2. Five members of the Executive Committee, three of whom to be Laymen, shall form a quorum.

3. The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day next following the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

4. Special Meetings of the Executive Committee may be summoned by the President, or, in case of his death or absence, by any two Vice-Presidents of the Society, to meet at such time and place as may be fixed by the notice of meeting; but so far as may be, alternately at Saint John and Fredericton.

#### VIII.

#### SCHEDULE COMMITTEE.

There shall also be a Schedule Committee, to be composed of the following Members, viz. :

1. The President, Treasurer and Secretary or Secretaries of the Society *ex officio*.

2. Three Clerical and five Lay Members of the Society, qualified for election as members of the Executive Committee, who shall be chosen annually on the first day of meeting of the General Committee, by ballot, on nomination of each proposed member by two members of the General Committee.

3. The Schedule Committee shall have all such power relative to the preparation of the Missionary Schedule, and carrying the same into operation and effect;

and the appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society, as may from time to time be vested in them by or pursuant to any Resolution, By-Laws or Regulations of the General Committee.

4. Five members of the Schedule Committee, three of whom shall be Laymen, shall be a quorum.

5. The Schedule Committee shall meet whenever summoned by the President, Treasurer or Secretary of the Society, and at such place as may be fixed by the notice of meeting.

## IX.

**OBJECTS.**

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz. :

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships ; and assistance, when necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists.

4. The supply of such Books and Tracts as are on the Catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a Fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor ; and towards the education of the children of such Clergymen, and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.

8. The creation of a Fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy.

9. Aid to the Endowment Fund in particular Parishes.

10. The formation of a Fund for receiving Money or Securities as Special Trusts.

Aid to Foreign Missions of the Church of England: with the understanding that subscriptions for this object may be limited to any organization in connection with the Church of England, but if not so limited, will be forwarded to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, for the general purposes of that Society.

## X.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholars to his Lordship's approbation.

## XI.

It shall be competent to any member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

## XII.

**LOCAL COMMITTEE.**

1. The members of the Society in each Parish, or in each Mission, consisting of two or more Parishes, shall, at the discretion of the Missionary of such Mission, constitute a Local Committee; and so also the members residing in any District of a Parish set off under the authority of the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Rector and Church Corporation of such Parish (there being in such District a Church duly consecrated, and a resident Clergyman licensed thereto by the Lord Bishop), may, at the desire of such Clergyman, and with the approval of the Bishop and the Rector of the Parish, form a separate Local Committee; and in that case the District shall, for the purpose of the Society, be considered as a separate Parish.

2. Each Local Committee shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendations to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

3. Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society, to be elected at



the Annual Meetings of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

4. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

## XIII.

1. The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately, on the first Thursday in July in each year.

2. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence, by any two or more of the Vice-Presidents, four weeks notice being first given thereof by advertisement in one or more newspapers, published in Fredericton and Saint John respectively.

## XIV.

**THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.**

1. The General Committee of the Society shall be composed of the following members, viz.: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be the Chairman, the Vice-Presidents of the Society; in the absence of the Lord Bishop, the Committee may elect a Chairman from the Vice-Presidents present, and if none be present, from other members of the Committee; the Secretary or Secretaries, who shall also serve in that capacity at the meeting of the General Committee; the Treasurer and the Auditors, the Rector or Missionary of each Parish or of a Mission comprising two or more Parishes, and the Clergyman of any separate District of a Parish (provided that in the absence or sickness of the Rector of any Parish, the duly licensed Curate or Assistant Minister shall be considered *Pro hac vice* a member of the General Committee), and the Lay Deputies elected by the Local Committees as before provided; all such persons being Subscribers to the Society.

2. The members of the Executive Committee shall be *ex officio* members of the General Committee.

3. The General Committee shall meet on the two days next previous to the Anniversary Meeting to make the Annual appropriations of the funds of the Society; and a report of the proceedings of such meeting shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

4. The Order of Business in General Committee shall be as follows:

*Firstly.* Production of Certificates of Lay Delegates.

*Secondly.* Secretary's Report to be read, and also a report of the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year.

*Thirdly.* Report of the Auditors to be read and laid before the General Committee.

*Fourthly.* Such appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society as a majority of those present may determine.

5. The General Committee shall have power to adjourn its meetings for any special purpose from day to day, or to any day subsequent to the Anniversary Meeting of the Society, by a vote of at least two-thirds of the members present; and to determine by like vote, the place where such adjourned meeting shall be held. Provided that in every such case, a report of such adjournment, and the causes therefor, shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

#### XV.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion, for the general purposes of the Society.

**RESOLUTIONS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.**

That in future no application for grants shall be considered which is not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, or previously. (18th Report, page 24.)

That when a Missionary is absent from his Mission on account of ill health, with leave from the Lord Bishop, his Lordship be authorized in his discretion, to pay to him the whole or any part of the sum granted for such Mission. (22d Report, page 33.)

That the following be the form of draft for a Missionary's salary, to come into effect on the first of October, 1861, and that no draft be paid by the Treasurer, unless presented in person, or endorsed by the person to whom it is made payable, the Treasurer to take a receipt from the party to whom the payment is made on the same.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SCHEDULE COMMITTEE. (See 36th Report.)**

Whereas it is desirable for the better provision for the ministrations of the Church in the Diocese of Fredericton, that there be a systematic and permanent plan for the payment of the stipends of Missionaries ;

*Therefore Resolved,—*

1. That in order to encourage the established Missions to become gradually self-supporting, all grants made by or through this Society in aid of Missions (not including stipends secured to any of the elder clergy on the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel grant during life) shall from henceforth be made conditional on the contribution by the Mission itself of a stated sum towards the Missionary's stipend.

2. That all grants made by the General Committee be made subject to these resolutions, and be distributed under the direction of the Schedule Committee, who shall have at all times all such and like powers and rights with respect to the same, or any of them, as the General Committee of the Society would have if in session.

3. That the Schedule Committee annually present to the General Committee of the Society on the first day of their meeting, a full and detailed account of all business transacted during the expired year, and also a list of grants recommended for the ensuing year, with the conditions to be annexed to each, and shall also report to the Executive Committee at each quarterly meeting thereof.

4. That on the approval by the General Committee of the grants recommended for the year, the same shall forthwith pass into operation on the basis of the foregoing Resolutions, and subject to the following regulations :

(a.) The Schedule Committee (acting in conjunction with the Lord Bishop), shall forthwith after the annual Meeting communicate with the Wardens or other lay

members of the Church in each Mission, requiring them to enter into engagements (A) with the Society, to contribute the sum required of the Mission for the year.

(b.) Should such engagement not be entered into to the satisfaction of the Schedule Committee before the first of September then next, they shall communicate with the Missionary, requiring him to give each of his congregations notice (B) of withdrawal of all payments as a Missionary receiving stipend through this Society on 1st January then next, unless the engagement be meantime completed.

(c.) Should such engagement not be entered into to the satisfaction of the Committee before the 1st of January then next, all payments to the Missionary's salary, through the Society, shall be withdrawn, and no stipend shall thereafter be payable in respect thereof: Provided, that should the Missionary see fit to resign his cure he shall, if stationed for the remainder of the year by the Lord Bishop in any vacant Mission which may be willing to comply with the terms required of the defaulting Mission, be entitled in respect of the services to be rendered in such new Mission to such stipend as may be agreed upon between such Missionary and the Schedule Committee, not exceeding that provided for the continuation of his services in his former Mission, and upon the like terms and conditions. Provided also, that any such Missionary, if not so appointed to any new Mission, may nevertheless be permitted by the Schedule Committee, on special application, to draw on 1st April for a sum in their discretion; but not exceeding his previous quarter's stipend from the Society.

(d.) Where such engagement is entered into, the Committee shall forthwith notify the Missionary who shall thereupon (unless the terms of such engagement shall not be fulfilled as hereinafter provided) be entitled to draw upon the Society for the full amount of his quarterly salary, including therein the sum required for the quarter of the Mission itself.

case be remitted by the Wardens quarterly in advance to the Treasurer, and may consist either of money or written receipts of the Missionary, for produce furnished to him at the market rates: Provided that two months grace (but no more) may be allowed the Mission to make up such sum; that is to say, the sum required for the quarter of the ensuing year, ending 30th October, shall be remitted before the 1st September, and for the following quarter before the 1st December next.

(*f.*) Should the Missionary give any such written receipts for produce, he shall keep a record thereof, and shall make his next quarter's draft for such sum only as shall be due him, after he shall be debited with such receipts in the Treasurer's books.

(*g.*) Should the sum required from the parish not be remitted as aforesaid the Treasurer shall forthwith, on the expiration of the two months grace, give notice (C) to the Missionary requiring him to give notice (D) of withdrawal of stipend as such Missionary, and all such stipend shall be thereupon withdrawn pursuant to such notice; and unless the sum agreed to be paid for the quarter shall be forthwith remitted, no stipend shall be payable for such expired quarter beyond the amount agreed to be contributed on the part of the Society: and none whatsoever for the succeeding quarter: and the Committee shall appoint a deputation to enquire into the causes of such default, and shall report thereon at the next meeting of the General Committee.

Provided that in any case, on a Mission ceasing to be in default, though after the period for withdrawal of the stipend shall have arrived, such Mission may be reinstated by the Schedule Committee if they shall see fit so to do, under the regulations and conditions herein contained.

(*h.*) In the case of the Missions where the Missionary's stipend is secured for life on the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel grant, the Committee shall call on the Wardens to enter into the prescribed engagement only in case of the demise of the present Missionary; and those Missionaries shall continue to draw their

stipends as heretofore accustomed, unless any shall voluntarily come within the general system adopted for other Missions.

(i.) It shall be optional with the Schedule Committee to permit any Mission to make a quarterly, half-yearly, or yearly payment, at any period in advance, and these regulations, *mutatis mutandis*, shall thereupon apply, generally, to any such Mission.

(k.) The Schedule Committee shall have full power and authority to make all such further bye-laws, rules, and regulations, as may in their opinion be required for their guidance, and from time to time to alter or amend the same as they shall see fit.

5. That in every case of a Clergyman receiving a stipend through this Society, he shall be required to make to the Secretary of the Society according to such form as the Schedule Committee may from time to time require, half-yearly, on or before the first days of December and June in each year, a return for the preceding half year, shewing—

(1.) The general limits of his Mission.  
 (2.) The extent thereof in square miles.  
 (3.) The estimated number of members of the Church of England living therein.

(4.) The number of Churches, Chapels of Ease, and Missionary Stations respectively, within the Mission.

(5.) Whether or not there is therein a parsonage house belonging to the Mission or provided by the people.

(6.) The extent of Church and Glebe land connected therewith.

(7.) The income from such Church or Glebe land for the year ending 1st April last.

(8.) The amount contributed therein towards the support of the Missionary, from sources other than the grant through this Society.

(9.) The number of public services on Sundays and in the week respectively.

(10.) The average congregation in each place of worship.

Which returns shall be laid before the Schedule Committee forthwith, and before the General Committee on the first day of their meeting; and no grant shall from henceforth be payable to any Missionary in default of rendering any such statement or return so long as such default shall continue.

6. That the Schedule Committee shall, so soon as may be, after the first day of December in each year, make up from such returns, the printed returns and statement required annually by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, and forward the same, reporting specially to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel any Missionary who may be in default.

7. That those of the Clergy within the Diocese, not receiving stipends through this Society be requested to forward to the Secretary in like manner, on or before the 1st day of June in each year, the returns numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19, in order that a complete return of the Diocese in these particulars, may each year be published with the Society's Report, as hath been heretofore in part only accustomed.



8. That the Schedule Committee in conjunction with the Lord Bishop shall appoint deputations of Clergymen and Laymen for each Deanery, which each deputation shall visit, for the purpose of holding Missionary Meetings in the several Missions, and taking up collections thereat (not interfering, however, with the usual semi-annual collections, and annual canvass of the Mission on behalf of the Society); and further, of making enquiries as to the power of the Mission to contribute towards the Clergyman's support; such deputations reporting to the Schedule Committee, and through them to the General Committee of the Society.

9. That the Schedule Committee, in conjunction with the Lord Bishop, may further appoint special deputations to enquire into the causes of any deficiency of contributions or other pecuniary difficulties in any Mission, and shall have power to call for any returns they may think proper from any of the parishes receiving aid from or through the Society.

10. That the Lord Bishop be respectfully requested to transmit a copy of these Resolutions to the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, requesting their concurrence therein.

**PROVISION FOR THE WIDOWS AND ORPHANS OF  
THE CLERGY.**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

The following plan for a provision for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy, with the rules and regulations annexed, was adopted by the General Committee. (See 36th Report.)

1. The Church Society of the Diocese of Fredericton in the Province of New Brunswick, shall have a special Fund, to be called "THE CLERGY WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND," which shall consist of the present capital held by the Society for this object (subject to its present liabilities) of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, devises, and bequests, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special purpose, and of all payments received under these Rules; and this Fund shall be applied to the assistance of the families of deceased Clergymen, in accordance with these Rules, and to no other object.

2. Every Clergyman in this Diocese, duly licensed, whose widow is not already entitled to a pension from the SOCIETY FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE GOSPEL, wishing to share in the benefits of this Fund, shall within six months from July 5, 1871, or within one year from receiving Holy Orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary of the Fund for a certificate, and shall thenceforth pay annually the sum set opposite his age in the annexed scale. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive a certificate at the option of the Executive Committee of the Church Society, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

3. Every Clergyman, being a member of this Fund, shall make and forward to the Secretary a yearly collection from every congregation in his Parish or mission. Assistant Curates, serving under a Rector, or other assistant Clergyman, shall not, however, be required to make a collection, but shall forward only their own annual payment.

4. All payments shall become due on the first day of January, in each year, and must be paid within thirty days : and all congregational collections must be sent in before the first day of May. If this Rule is not complied with, the certificate shall be considered as forfeited, but may be regained at the option of the Committee, and the applicant shall pay for the new certificate at the rate payable at the age when the same is taken out, according to the annexed scale, together with such sum as the Executive Committee may require in lieu of payments and subscriptions in arrear.

5. Upon compliance with the above Rules, the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY undertakes to pay out of "The Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund," a yearly pension of One Hundred Dollars to the widow of each Clergyman holding a certificate, during her widowhood.

6. If the Widow die, or marry again, the pension shall be paid towards the support of such children of the Deceased Clergyman as may be under the age of eighteen years. In this case, when the youngest child shall have attained this age, the pension shall cease.

7. The Trustees named in the Will of a Clergyman shall be recognized by the Committee, in the event of the death or marriage of his widow, and shall receive the pension, to be applied by them for the support of the child or children ; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, or if Trustees should not have been named, then the Bishop of the Diocese shall himself act, or in writing appoint a Trustee to act, in the application of the pension.

8. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall at his death receive the pension, under the limitation as to age expressed in Rule 6.

9. No certificate shall be issued to any Clergyman over the age of sixty years, who is not already in the Diocese at the time of the formation of these Rules ; but any Clergyman already in the Diocese, over the age of sixty years, and whose widow is not entitled to a pension from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, shall be admitted a member of this Fund, on making

the annual payment for the age of sixty years, and otherwise complying with the Rules.

10. If a Clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diocese, after officiating in it not less than ten years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on continuing his yearly payment, and the amount of the average annual collection from his Parish or Mission, being a sum not exceeding Forty Dollars in all.

11. If a Clergyman is unable to continue his public ministrations through sickness or accident, upon the production of a medical certificate testifying the same, he may continue his connexion with the Fund, upon making his yearly payment.

12. Any Clergyman degraded or suspended from the ministry, or any widow or orphan who shall not be in communion with the Church of England shall be entitled only to such payment as the Executive Committee shall prescribe.

13. The pension shall be payable half-yearly, on January 1, and July 1, in each year; the first payment to be calculated for the interval from the death of the insured to the day of payment.

14. The Treasurer of the **DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY** shall be Treasurer of this Fund, and shall, from time to time, under the direction of the Loan Committee, invest every hundred pounds of surplus money, and add the same to the capital of the Fund. A yearly detailed statement of the income, payments, and invested money, shall be published in the Annual Report of the Diocesan Church Society.

15. The Secretary of this Fund shall be appointed by the Executive Committee, and it shall be his duty to issue certificates, receive payments, donations and collections, which he shall hand to the Treasurer every quarter, or oftener, if required by him.

16. None of the above Rules shall be altered, except at the Annual Meeting of the General Committee of the **DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY**, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

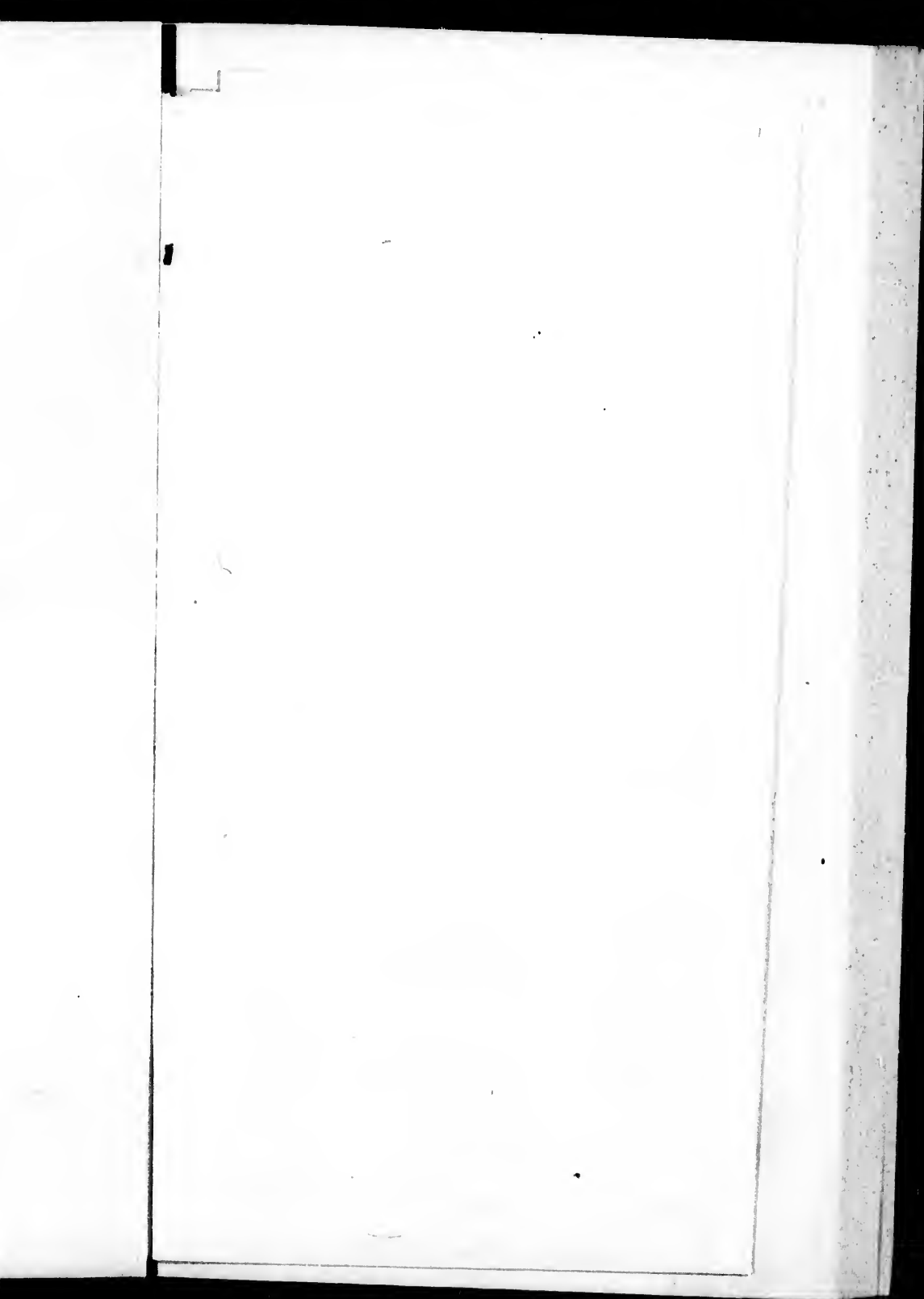

## REPORT.

---

With all that is deficient and wanting, the members of the Church have reason to be thankful for the work of the past year, and the present position of the Society. The Treasurer's accounts shew a satisfactory state of the funds, and the statement of the investments exhibits the careful management of the Loan Committee.

The Venerable Society in England has consented to continue its aid to this Diocese to the close of December, 1873, with an amount as large as could have been anticipated. This liberal grant, for the period named, £2,325, Stg., together with the contributions to this Society, and the interest of the investments, is barely sufficient to maintain the present missions.

It will be observed that a great part of the duty, in carrying out the objects of this Society, is intrusted now to the Schedule Committee. This duty is performed with much care and consideration. Those whose interests are most concerned may rest assured that, in acting under the regulations and requirements of the Society, it is the earnest desire of every member of this Committee to do what is best for the present and future position of the several missions and parishes. In some instances their action may seem hard to the Clergyman and his people. It should, however, be remembered that as the amount from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel is being diminished without a corresponding increase on the part of this Society, a reduction must be made every year in some of the grants, and an increased amount required from the people. Some of the old and more wealthy parishes would do well to come forward *voluntarily*, and relinquish at least a portion of their present allowance, and make it up by increased offerings among themselves. The present incomes of the clergy cannot be reduced;

their limited amount in consideration of the necessary outlay is, in many instances, a great wrong.

But what should weigh most upon the minds of every member of the Church in this Diocese is, that with all the exertions made by this Society and the liberal aid still afforded from England, the Church is so slow in occupying new ground, and in supplying the crying need of so many who want the ministrations of the Church.

An endeavour has been made by the Schedule Committee to obtain fuller statistical information with reference to the work and progress of the Church in this Diocese. The Clergy who receive support through this Society feel bound to make their returns, and it is hoped that those also upon whom this claim does not rest will afford such information regarding their several parishes, as to aid in making the Report of the Society, in this particular, of increased interest and importance.

From the following abstracts from the Reports of the Missionaries, it will be seen that their work goes on increasing year by year, and that additional fields of usefulness are all the time being made apparent.

ANDOVER, GRAND FALLS, &c.—Rev. Leo A. Hoyt writes as follows:

“The work of this mission is, with God’s blessing, progressing favorably. The services have been held regularly, and I am glad to say that, notwithstanding the almost unprecedented severity of last winter’s storms, we were enabled, with very few exceptions, to preserve the continuity of our Sunday services. The labor of this mission, however, is daily increasing. Last year I made an appeal for the services of a clergyman at Florenceville. Every day I see more and more the necessity of filling this post. I hope the Society will not allow this appeal to degenerate into an annual offering. This upper part of Carleton County is confessedly one of the finest agricultural sections of the Province. Settlers have crowded into this County very rapidly within the past few years. A fair proportion of these settlers are connected, with more or less attachment, to the church.

My own labors here are necessarily inefficient, and the addition of this field to the mission of Victoria is at the expense of justice both to the mission and myself.

Though at the risk of prolixity, I must refer to the state of affairs in the northern part of my mission. The recent colonization of New Denmark demands, I think, some consideration.

The present effort is merely tentative, but if the pioneers in this enterprise find their spiritual wants in some degree supplied, it will go far to render the experiment successful. The Danes, it is true, are not Episcopallians, but their use of a Liturgy, their custom of wearing vestments especially adapted for divine service, their strict habits respecting a form of confirmation, all combine to cause a sympathy for our church. And it seems to me a duty on our part to see that they are not neglected. If the lower part of this mission be taken from it, I shall have some time to attend to this settlement at present; but if New Denmark shall prove a success, it will necessitate at no distant day the establishment of a clergyman at Grand Falls.

During the past year I have performed 33 baptisms, 11 marriages, and 12 Burials. Contributions amount to \$124.75."

**BATHURST, NEW BANDON, &c.**—Rev. W. Le B. McKiel has inclosed the following report:

"Mission work has been prosecuted under great difficulties here during the last winter, owing to the great depth of the snow, and the often impassable state of the roads. It was sometimes quite impossible for me to meet my appointments in distant parts of the mission, and more than once or twice, after overcoming the difficulties of the road, the toil was fruitless, it being impossible for the congregation to assemble the next day, and for me to return to Bathurst, owing to a renewal of the storm. Now, however, the usual services are held, and are well attended."

**CANTERBURY.**—Rev. T. Hartin reports contributions to the amount of \$37.50.

**CAMPOBELLO.**—Rev. John Simes Williams reports that he has forwarded to the Treasurer \$90 from this parish, for the general purposes of the Society.

**CARLETON, SAINT GEORGE.**—Rev. T. E. Dowling reports contributions from this Parish from Christmas, 1871, to the amount of \$42.34. Next year he believes that they shall both be able and willing to send larger offerings.

**CHATHAM.**—Rev. W. S. Neales writes that the interest in the Diocesan Church Society continues unabated in this parish. The annual meeting of this Local Committee was held on the 21st May, when motions were passed embodying the feelings of the committee as to the work, the necessities, the claims of the Society, as well as the broad and liberal basis upon which they are all founded and conducted.

Contributions amount to \$241.72.

**DERBY, NELSON, &c.**—Rev. W. Cruden reports contributions to the amount of \$95.50, and writes that the increase in the amount of the contributions proves that the interest in the Church



work in this mission is steadily increasing. The addition to the amount this year has been owing to valuable aid afforded by lady collectors.

"Owing to the stormy weather of last winter," Mr. Cruden adds, "some services had unavoidably to be given up; but I am glad to say that there is a warmer feeling than ever for the services of the Church, and an earnest desire on the part of all to have the word of life spoken in their midst; a conviction that in this age of trial, each one must be ready to do battle for 'the faith once delivered unto the saints.'"

An application was made, on the part of this committee, for aid in the erection of a Parsonage at Derby.

**DALHOUSIE.**—Rev. Philip H. Brown reports contributions to the amount of \$54.65, to which is to be added a donation of \$50 from the Lord Bishop.

**DOUGLAS AND BRIGHT.**—Rev. J. H. Saturley writes as follows:

"I enclose the semi-annual returns required by the Society.

"Since I have had charge of this mission, the services, with very few exceptions, consequent on the severity of the weather and the bad state of the roads, have been regularly performed.

"On moving here I was very kindly received by the parishioners, many of whom manifested their kindness in a substantial, and to me, pleasing and acceptable manner, which I am glad to avail myself of this opportunity of acknowledging. A very good horse was given me for use in the mission, towards which the people of the Cross Roads and Keswick gave \$37; while His Lordship the Bishop added the generous donation of \$40. From his Lordship I received also a very good buffalo robe. There was given me also a carpet and overcoat by the ladies of St. John's Church, and a good supply of wood by the men of the Cross Roads. These, and many other manifestations of kindness and good will, on the part of my parishioners and others, I have received, for which I am very thankful."

Contributions amount to \$136.56.

**FREDERICTON.**—Rev. Canon Lee reports contributions to the amount of \$746.92.

**NEW MARYLAND.**—Rev. J. Pearson reports the amount from this mission, \$44.50.

**GAGETOWN.**—Rev James Neales writes as follows:

"I have again to congratulate the Society upon an increase to the subscriptions for the present year. Notwithstanding some cares and discouragements, yet by the good hand of our God upon us, we have been enabled to afford the Society a larger contribution than has ever before been sent, at one time, from this parish."

**GRAND LAKE.**—Rev. B. Shaw has written as follows:

"I enclose returns from my mission for year ending May 31st, 1872. The congregations are as great as ever, and the people generally attend the services in a regular manner. We managed to make our quarterly payments to the Society, although, in one instance, it was delayed longer than the time required. I believe that the system of making the engagements with the wardens will work well in time; but like all new regulations, it requires a little patience before the people can be taught the benefits accruing from it, both to themselves and the church generally. The great desideratum in a large and scattered mission like this, is to get energetic collectors, for the people are always ready with an excuse, and very few of them are prompt in their quarterly payments.

"Last year's subscription from this mission was not so large as I could have wished, being only \$80; for I felt sure we should manage to get \$100; however, I trust we shall make up the deficiency this year. The new church at Mill Cove was consecrated last fall, when we enjoyed a visit of two days from the Bishop, who was accompanied by Canon Medley and Mrs. Medley.

"We are also looking forward to another visit, on July 26th, from His Lordship, for the purpose of administering the right of Confirmation. The candidates at present are not numerous, but I trust they will prove earnest Christians and staunch members of our church. The work in a country mission like mine is of the same character from year to year, so that I have nothing interesting to offer for members of the Church in other parts of the Province. Travelling over the same roads, meeting the same small number of worshippers; generally taking three services on Sunday, and one or more on week days, at certain seasons of the year,—there is a sameness about it, which would be depressing, were it not that we feel, that in God's temple, the humblest artisan is rewarded if he works honestly in the service, as well as those who occupy prominent positions, and have the charge of directing and controlling large masses of men."

**GREENWICH & WICKHAM.**—Rev. D. W. Pickett reports contributions not less than \$80.

**HAMPTON.**—Rev. Canon Walker reports \$89.50 as the contributions from this parish, to which an increase may yet be made.

**KINGSCLEAR.**—Mr. A. Rankin Bedell, one of the Lay Delegates, reports contributions to the amount of \$91.64.

**KINGSTON.**—Rev. W. E. Scovil writes that the contributions from this parish, for the general purposes of the Society, are \$141.00. In consequence of his absence and sickness last year, the subscription list was not made up in time to be published in

the Report, but the money was paid to the Treasurer, and the list and statistics will be included in the Report of this present year.

**LANCASTER.**—Rev. W. S. Covert reports that, through the kind efforts of Mrs. S. G. Andrews, a large increase has been made in the contributions from this parish, which are \$62.64.

**MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.**—Rev. R. Simonds reports contributions to the amount of \$130.03.

**MONCTON.**—Contributions are reported from this parish, amounting to \$70.20.

**NEWCASTLE AND GLENELG.**—Rev. G. H. Sterling reports as follows:

“In addition to the usual work required by a Missionary in a large parish like this, I have been engaged in superintending the repairs of St. John’s Church, Glenelg. The work, which was commenced last September, was so far completed by November, as to allow us to occupy the building for Divine Worship.

“This summer, I trust, we shall get the Church quite completed. I am happy to be able to report increased contributions from my mission. From Newcastle, \$201.14. From Glenelg \$45.11, being more than double that of last year. Total, \$246.25.”

**PETERSVILLE, &c.**—Rev. Charles R. Matthews writes that the parish church has been completed at a cost of \$3,200. It was consecrated by the Bishop on the 19th inst. “There is a debt of some \$600, which has,” Mr. Matthews adds, “been assumed by a few of us, and which I trust, through God’s blessing, will soon be discharged.”

Mr. Matthews mentions the great loss the mission has sustained by the sudden and mournful removal of the senior Church Warden, Mr. C. R. Bayard. He not only took a deep interest in the church’s welfare, but was ever “ready to give,” and most hospitable to all comers, especially to the clergy. As the disease which clouded his latter days crept over him, he seemed to turn more for consolation and support to the Word of God and prayer.

There was no collection made in this mission for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, as for some years past contributions have been made to the Church Missionary Society, and in aid of its missions the sum of \$31 was forwarded during the present season.

Owing to absence from the mission last autumn, and the inclement state of the weather during the late winter months, the record of parochial duty fell rather below the usual average.

Contributions amount to \$62.

PETITCODIAC.—Rev. C. Willis reports that the services at the different stations in this mission have been performed when it was possible to reach them. Owing to the unusually severe snow storms in the spring, and the dreadful state of the roads ever since, the attendance has not been so large as it would otherwise have been; for this reason the quarterly collections have not been so regularly made.

The Contributions amount to \$50.42.

PRINCE WILLIAM AND DUMFRIES.—Rev. E. A. W. Hanington writes, that "in reviewing the past year there is very little to record.

"Death, ever removing some of the congregation of the Church upon earth, has, this year, taken from us four of our old and faithful communicants. Of them, Thomas Jones, Esq., is particularly missed, as in his removal we lose one of the most zealous and earnest supporters of the Diocesan Church Society."

Mr. Hanington mentions the benefit of special services held in his mission in August last, and adds, "Although we have felt the loss of some loyal members, we have had many new subscribers added to our list, bringing the amount collected slightly in advance of last year."

Contributions amount to 98.03.

QUEENSBURY.—Rev. W. H. Tippet writes that the contributions from this parish amount to \$73.98.

RICHMOND.—Rev. W. Henry Street reports that the contributions are \$80, and he writes as follows:

"The sad want of suitable buildings for Divine Worship, to which I referred in my last report, has, thank God, been supplied in one portion of this mission, by the completion and consecration of a neat and handsome Church, at Richmond Corner. The consecration took place on the 30th ultimo. It was a consummation for which, during the last year, we had worked hard.

"Joyfully and thankfully, therefore, did we all go to the House of God to join in the solemn service and listen to the wise teachings and kind admonitions of our beloved Bishop. The Congregation was large and attentive, a goodly number remaining to participate in the Holy Communion.

"Nothing has been spared within the compass of our means and ability to make the building churchlike. It is a Gothic structure, finished in the interior with ash and butternut. All the windows are memorial, of stained glass. The East window is in memory of the late Rector of Woodstock.

"With all this, I have the satisfaction of adding, that the Church is entirely free of debt. For church purposes, including the sum required by the Society towards the clergyman's salary, and the subscriptions to the Society itself, between *ten or eleven hundred dollars* has been raised by this small parish during the past year.

"Before closing this report, I beg to bring before the notice of the Society a new church in another part of my Mission, viz., South Richmond, which we shall endeavour, this summer, to push forward toward completion, although I fear we shall struggle in vain, unless we obtain some outside help. In that part of the Mission there is but a very small body of church members, and the want of a consecrated building interferes much with their progress. Cannot the Society assist this necessary work, and encourage these people by making a grant to their Church?"

ROTHESAY.—Rev. Francis Partridge has inclosed the following report:

"You will naturally not expect a very long report from me this year, since I have been but a short time in the parish. There are, I think, about 90 church families, representing, perhaps, 400 or 500 persons. I find everywhere in making my visits a strong feeling of attachment to the Church, and appreciation of the privilege of frequent and regular services and ministrations. There is a cordial feeling of goodwill between the various bodies of Christians.

"There are in the Parish 2 consecrated churches; one at Hammond River, the Parish Church, dedicated to the Holy Trinity, the other at Gondola Point, called St. Luke's. Besides the regular services every Sunday in these, there is a third congregation in Rothesay proper, at present worshipping in a Presbyterian Kirk, of which the Church has had the use for several years. A movement has been set on foot for some time past to purchase this building from the Presbyterians. Some influential parishioners are opposed to this, and wish to build a new church. The latter would be, I think, decidedly the more satisfactory course to adopt; still there are many grave reasons in favour of the former. The matter is not settled yet, and it is at present uncertain which way it is likely to turn.

"The Bishop held a Confirmation here in May, on Ascension Day, when 38 candidates were presented for that Holy Rite, of whom 34 are communicants. There should have been at least 50 candidates, but the snow was so deep this winter, that many of them were unable to attend the classes.

"I am happy to say that there is every prospect of the Parish of Rothesay, so far as I can judge, becoming a united and consistent branch of the Church. I am beginning to know the people, and to like them more and more. I have experienced uniform kindness from all since I took charge of the Parish.

"I am afraid that the subscriptions to the Church Society this year will not be so large as I could wish. The Parish has borne a good deal of expense during the past year. The Rectory has been built, at the cost, with land upon which it stands, of \$4000; a barn and outhouses are now in course of construction, which, with proper fences, will cost \$500 more. The clergyman's salary, at the rate of \$800 a year, has also been contributed to, and while these heavy expenses press upon us, our efforts

in aiding the D. C. S. will be less than might be expected. When, however, these are tided over, we shall trust to be, at least, not behind other parishes in similar circumstances.

"I hope in a short time to have three Sunday Schools in full work. I cannot hope to superintend them all myself, but there are faithful and true fellow-helpers, some of whom have had much experience, who will assist me in carrying them on.

"The musical part of our services is fair, and the responses becoming very hearty. With God's blessing on our work, I shall hope to send you a more full, and in every way more satisfactory Report another year."

**RICHIBUCTO.**—Rev. N. A. Coster writes, that through the kind assistance of Miss Mary Foster and Miss Taylor, the subscription list in aid of the Society has this year been doubled.

"It is," Mr. Coster adds, "especially gratifying to me to be able to show that church contributions have been steadily increasing for the last few years, notwithstanding the many members we have lost. The parish has given according to its means to the missions of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, and to the deficiency fund of this Society.

"A new Sunday School room is being erected immediately among the houses of the labouring class belonging to the Church, who are shut out from the old church by the miserable pew system. The erection of this building was a vast undertaking after our late sad changes, for it is larger than our old church, and yet it is far advanced without our being in debt. In a few weeks it will be fit for use."

Contributions are \$85.44.

**SACKVILLE AND DORCHESTER.**—Rev. G. Goodridge Roberts writes as follows:

"There have been, of course, the usual difficulties, drawbacks and discouragements, but none, I am thankful to say, of a special character. While we ourselves, as well as our flocks, fall so far short of the standard of zeal and holiness which our Divine Master sets before us, we can never review our work with unmingled satisfaction, and still less write of it with self-complacency. Yet for such signs of progress and improvement as God, from time to time vouchsafes to us, we may fitly express our gratitude to Him, and draw from them courage and comfort for the future. One most encouraging event of the past year has been the improvement of St. Ann's Church at Westcock, the old parish Church of Sackville. With the full consent of all the pew-holders, and by means of the liberal contributions both in money and work from those in the neighborhood who had formerly been unable to obtain sittings, the entire interior of the building has been re-arranged. The old pews and gallery have been removed, and two blocks of plain, open, *free* seats have been substituted, leaving a broad centre aisle, and two narrow aisles next the walls. The seats are neatly stained and varnished,

and the rest of the interior painted a stone colour. A partition has been removed by which about ten feet is added to the interior length of the Church, and a porch eleven feet square erected at the west end. The porch has an open roof, is ceiled with pine, stained and varnished. The chancel end is vastly improved by a new prayer desk, altar rails, carpets, and especially by a handsome east window, the last named, which cost, with expenses, about \$100, being the gift of personal friends outside of the parish. I am very happy to say that the free seats have answered my hopes and expectations, by inducing the attendance of many in the neighbourhood who have seldom attended any place of worship for years past. The week-day services during Lent and the Friday afternoon Litany in this Church have been quite as well attended as similar services either in Dorchester or Sackville, and the congregations on Sunday are much larger than ever before.

"Another very gratifying circumstance which I cannot refrain from briefly mentioning, was the presentation to me, by my Sackville parishioners, in January last, of a purse of \$105, besides a considerable quantity of provisions, accompanied by an affectionate address.

"I have to report \$200 as our subscription to the Diocesan Church Society for the present year."

**ST. ANDREWS**—Mr. G. D. Street, Secretary of this Committee, reports contributions as follows: St. Andrews, \$204.47; Chamcook, \$78.63; total, \$283.10.

Rev. Francis Partridge, for several years assistant minister in this parish, accepted the rectorship of Rothesay in January last. In many ways Mr. Partridge's work here has been a great benefit, and his departure was universally regretted. His place has not since been supplied.

**ST. GEORGE AND PENNFIELD.**—Rev. R. E. Smith.

"I hope that our contributions may amount to \$170 or upwards. They are \$175.80

"As a rule, I have held 3 services on Sunday, with the exception of once in the month. During the solemn season of Lent our services here are more frequent, being held twice a week or oftener, besides Sundays and on Holy Week, daily service. Our celebrations also were more frequent. We made use of the Lenten Office compiled by His Lordship the Bishop with much benefit. Twenty-two persons were confirmed by His Lordship on June 2nd. The greater number becoming full members of our Church. About 10 candidates were prevented from attending by the very inclement weather, they living at a distance.

"St. Mark's Church, St. George, has been thoroughly cleaned, stained and painted inside, making it look, at all events, decent.

"At Pennfield the new open sittings have been in use since

August last. They look very well indeed, and I think that our congregation have almost doubled since they were put up.

"We intend this summer, (D. V.,) to add a chancel. The present antique pulpit and reading desk are to be replaced by new ones promised by the Bishop. The chancel window has been promised by Mrs. Neville G. D. Parker, of St. Andrews, late of St. George, and the lumber by Mr. James Gillespie, Church Warden. Then we will be likely to worship in a church made more church-like and more suitable to God's service.

"The whole number of communicants' names on my List is 130; 25 of whom were added since my last report.

"Number of Baptisms 39, 3 of whom were adults. One of the latter, aged 75, a person much respected in the church and our community, was baptized and confirmed by the Bishop on June 3rd. Number of Burials 16, Marriages 6.

"This is a brief summary of the principal points in my year's work, on which work, imperfectly and feebly done, we would humbly crave God's blessing and mercy, the only means of making it of any benefit to the souls of those under my spiritual care."

**ST. MARK.**—Mr. T. B. Hanington, Sec. of this Committee, reports that the contributions will amount to about \$300.

**ST. MARY'S.**—Rev. W. Jaffrey has forwarded his returns, but has not yet finished his collections. The Society may expect the usual amount of \$90.

**SHEDIAC.**—Rev. G. S. Jarvis, D. D., reports an increased amount of contributions: it is \$84.50.

**ST. PAUL'S, PORTLAND.**—Rev. Canon DeVeber states that the contributions for the Society are not fully completed. They will equal the amount of last year, which was \$721.

**ST. JAMES.**—Rev. W. Armstrong reports contributions amounting to \$160; to which he hopes more may yet be added.

This amount is smaller than last year on account of the extra collection in aid of the deficiency fund, and a collection this year for the Missions of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel.

**SIMONDS.**—Rev. G. Schofield reports as follows:

"The contributions from this parish to the D. C. S. for this year amount to \$134.91; to the schedule fund \$120.00, and to the India fund \$12.42; making a total of \$267.33.

"In the month of May last I had the pleasure of presenting to the Bishop eleven candidates for confirmation. By the kindness of the Rev. Canon DeVeber these persons were confirmed in St. Paul's Church, Portland, along with the candidates belonging to that Parish. This united service was very solemn



and interesting. Nearly all those confirmed belonging to both parishes afterwards partook of the Lord's Supper."

**SPRINGFIELD AND JOHNSTON.** — Rev. G. Rogers writes:

"My subscription list is not yet complete; but I do not anticipate so large an amount as last year. If this be the case, it will arise from the expenditure of a large sum, \$260.00, in the purchase of a cabinet organ for the Church at Springfield. Our little band of worshippers has been thinned by death. Three of our young people at Springfield have been taken early to their rest. All of them most estimable persons, and a serious loss to the Church Militant. At Johnston, three of our old men, full of years, have also received the call. They were among the pioneers of the settlement. Their departure has created a blank, like the removal of some old landmarks, which time alone can remedy.

"The violent storms of last winter prevented me fulfilling all my appointments at distant stations; but now my services are regularly performed."

**SUSSEX AND STUDHOLM.** — Rev. Canon Medley reports contributions to the amount of \$241.45, and has forwarded the following report:

"I had good hopes that when the time came for sending in my annual report to the Diocesan Church Society, I might have been able to have given the General Committee an account of rough work in some of my out stations, and also another report from personal observation of the present destitute state of the few scattered families of church people in the forsaken and neglected County of Albert. The season, however, has been so very late, and the country roads so almost impassable, that my good intentions have not been carried out thus far. I have found it quite as much as I could do to keep up the work in my three churches and two stations. Notwithstanding the frost, snow, wind, rain, and mud, which have met us in lively succession with scarcely any intermission for the six months past, I have only been forced to give up, I am thankful to say, two Sunday services and one week day service; and what is more satisfactory, where I have gone, no matter how bad the roads or how inclement the weather, I have always found a congregation to worship with me.

"For the last nine months at Studholm, we have worshipped, first in a barn, and then in the railway station, during the building of the new church. This was inconvenient, and a source of annoyance to some, but I am thankful to say the difficulty has been removed, and we now have the privilege of a newly consecrated church, and the Holy Eucharist is again celebrated in a place which is called by God's name. We have every reason to be extremely grateful for the help which has been given by our fellow churchmen in this work, and especially to our Bishop, who not only gave liberally in money, but also presented an organ to the church, free of all cost to the

parish, and intends, moreover, to join Mrs. Medley in giving a memorial window for the sanctuary. A portion of the parish of Studholm, which joins Mr. Willis's parish of Havelock, I have been unable to do much for, but I hope in a few months to be able to establish two stations in that direction. This will, however, depend upon my succeeding in securing the services of a Divinity Student, who will assist me on Sunday in holding public services, and also take charge, during the week, of a church school. This school will be opened in Sussex in July next, I trust, and will be assisted by a very generous grant of the Madras Board; and in consequence, the Madras system will be faithfully carried out. Such an institution is very much needed amongst us, and I hope it may meet with fair support.

"At Sussex the difficulty of a site for a new church still retards progress, but through the diligence and perseverance of the ladies, a considerable fund has been realized, and we are hoping that the obstacles may be removed before very long. The desolate tumble-down appearance of the old church, now, I believe, the last relic of the zeal of the Loyalists, does not encourage people to resort to it, and in winter it is not safe for delicate persons to remain in it for the whole length of the service. I should be thankful indeed if the wisdom of the General Committee of the Diocesan Church Society could untie this dreadful knot, which the experience and work of five years does not seem to have loosened much. However, it will not do to be discouraged, and I humbly thank God that there is greater harmony and a better feeling amongst us than there was a few years since.

"At Dutch Valley, some improvements have been made in the church, and the congregations are good. I regret much that I am unable to establish a Sunday school there, which is much needed, as many, even of the grown up persons, have had no education at all, and the children have not even a day school to go to. They have been very prompt in this district in meeting the required sum of \$50 from the Diocesan Church Society — quite a large sum for them — and have also kept up the offertory collections to what they were before this sum was imposed upon them. This is only another proof of what can be done by our church people in the country districts, if the matter is only put before them. Now one last word about Albert. Is anything being done by the Schedule Committee for this part of our mission field? The people are ready and willing to raise the sum required, \$200. Could they do this if there were no church people there? They may be few indeed, and my wonder is there are any left; but must not their hearts be still warm if they are willing to meet the Diocesan Church Society requirements; and, more than that, have they not souls as well as the missions whose wants are supplied, and whose readiness is sometimes brought out almost by compulsion? Let the Diocesan Church Society send a deputation to Albert, if there is

a doubt as to the statements I have made from time to time, (for it seems now as if I was almost the only Churchman, outside of Albert, who cares whether the County has a Missionary or not), and I am quite satisfied the field will not be found altogether barren. There are now three Churches unserve d, and Mechanic's Settlement is ready for a fourth."

**ST. STEPHEN, CHRIST CHURCH.**—Rev. Joseph Rushton reports contributions to the amount of \$29.00. He regrets that "owing to the various calls for other objects, the amount is not greater."

**TRINITY, ST. JOHN.**—Mr. Sturdee, Secretary of this Committee, reports \$407.02 as the amount of the contributions.

**UPHAM.**—Rev. S. J. Hanford is thankful to report that the contributions amount to \$169.29.

"I may add also," Mr. Hanford says, "with a feeling of thankfulness, that the several parishes in this mission have been able to pay in their stated amounts for the missionary's stipend required by the society."

**WELLINGTON AND DUNDAS, &C.**—Rev. A. H. Weeks reports that the removal of several regular contributors has reduced the usually small annual offerings. They are \$22.

**WESTMORELAND.**—Rev. D. M. Bliss cannot state the exact amount of contributions from this parish. The people seemed to have agreed to the necessity of replacing the present old parish church by a more suitable building, though a difference of opinion as to the site may delay the work.

**WOODSTOCK.**—Rev. T. Neales writes as follows:

"The Society is well aware of the great amount of missionary work which ought to be done here, and how impossible it is for one clergyman to carry on this work, to say nothing of the progress which it is the earnest desire of us all the church should exhibit. Much is theretore undone; but, while I humbly endeavor, according to my strength, to perform my duty, I cease not to pray the Lord of the harvest that He will send forth more laborers into His harvest."

"It is proposed to sell the glebe and church land, as the parsonage is inconveniently situated.

"It was not without comfort to me to find the regard which, during the past year, has been paid to the teaching of the church, manifested by the increased and steady attendance at the special services during the holy seasons of Advent and Lent, and more particularly through Holy Week, and I am willing to look upon this as a token that the Saviour's parting blessing is still aiding us.

"Contributions amount to \$309.05."

From the foregoing reports, it will be observed that the income of the Society for the current year is but little over that of last year, and falls far short of what is plainly required by the Church in this Diocese.

Since the last meeting of the Society it has pleased God to call hence another of the clergy—the Rev. John Black, for many years a Missionary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, and lately Rector of Kingsclear. Increasing infirmities have, for some time past, hindered Mr. Black from much active employment. He will be remembered by those who knew him as the courteous Christian gentleman, and the well-read theologian.

There are among the clergy several instances of advanced years, and health so impaired as to incapacitate them from that arduous labor which was readily performed in earlier life. The Church would do well to consider the propriety of making special provision for such cases, without a diminution of the present funds. It is clearly an act of justice not only to supply the needs of the widows and orphans of the clergy, but also to provide what is necessary for the worn-out servants of Christ. By securing in this way small retiring allowances, missions could be more rapidly supplied. New zeal, vigor and activity would, in many cases, make up all that the church would require to expend in the way referred to.

Mainly it is the business of this Society to supply the means for the support of those who are sent forth to do their Master's work. In this, it feels justified in calling upon every member of the Church for continued and increased offerings. The time, however, now has come when something more valuable than offerings of money must be looked for. The Church now *wants men*. Those most prominent among her members should dedicate to this holy service the best, the wisest, the most of their sons to fill up the failing ranks of the clergy, and to form a fresh and advancing force "to help of the Lord against the mighty."

The Lord Bishop read the following letter from the Secretary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, when, on motion of Mr. Frith, it was resolved that the same be inserted in the printed Report, as a part of the minutes of this meeting :

SOCIETY FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE GOSPEL,  
20 Duke Street, Westminster, S. W.,

29th May, 1872.

MY DEAR LORD:

1. I have the pleasure of announcing the amount of assistance which the Society can promise for the year 1873. The terms of the Society's Resolution are:

(6.) That the sum of £2,325 be granted for the Diocese of Fredericton, in the year ending 31st December, 1873, to be administered by the Bishop and committee, in accordance with the Society's Bye Laws and Regulations: that this grant be also charged with any claims for pensions which may arise in the year and be admitted by the Society; with any expense for the passage of missionaries from this country to Fredericton, which may be incurred here in accordance with the Regulations; and with any other expense strictly appropriate to the Diocese and sanctioned by the Society.

That the *pensions* of Mrs. Arnold and Mrs. Milner (together amounting to £100) be paid in 1873 as heretofore.

That the sum of £120 be granted for six *Divinity Exhibitions* at King's College in 1873; three of £25 each, and three of £15 each.

2. Last year the Society made an appeal to the Christian sympathy of all our friends and fellow-labourers in foreign parts, by proposing that "*in every Christian congregation, which derives help from the Society, an annual collection should be made, to assist the Society in its missionary work among the heathen in India.*" In some colonial dioceses this appeal has met with a hearty response, as the enclosed "List of Foreign Contributions to 31st December, 1871," will show; and the offerings have been acknowledged already, in each case, with the thanks of the Society. It is much to be desired that the sympathy thus called forth partially, should spread farther, and should continue so long as the great common duty of proclaiming the Gospel of Christ to our heathen fellow-subjects claims the co-operation of every Christian abroad as well as at home. I am instructed to express a hope that the Society may receive at least some small token of sympathy in missionary work from every congregation, assisted by the Society, in your diocese. I would further ask you to let me hear, before the end of this year, what reception the proposal meets with in your diocese. We trust that by stirring up the zeal of many hearts in this cause, the progress of missions throughout the world may, by God's blessing, be accelerated.

3. We are sure you will agree with us in thinking that growth towards a state of independence of extraneous support is the proper accompaniment of missionary efforts. Progress is essential, though it may be rapid or slow, according to Providential circumstances. The Society has thus stated, in two Regulations, what is generally expected:

(a). "The time during which a Christian congregation or mission is allowed to receive grants from the Society, does not, under ordinary circumstances, exceed nine years; in which time it is expected that a church, a parsonage, and an endowment, will be provided."

(b). "Where the population is mostly heathen, as they are converted and gathered into congregations of native Christians, the Society requires that such native congregations shall build and maintain their own churches, and contribute towards the support and endowment of native pastors."

If there be in your diocese any congregations which does not comply with the conditions of the Society's assistance, I am desired to request that in each case a special enquiry be made this year of the reasons (whether special privileges of, or covenants with, the clergy or other reasons) which have prevented compliance, and that you would have the kindness to communicate them to the Society. The Society, on the one hand, cannot continue to support the ministrations of the Church in any one place permanently; and on the other hand, it does not contemplate a reduction of the salaries received by missionary clergymen, which are now, in almost all cases, fixed at the lowest possible rates. But it requires, in all cases, that local Sustentation Funds and local contributions of Christians should gradually take the place of English alms as a support of the Christian ministry, and that this should be aimed at from the beginning, constantly pursued, and effected within a reasonable time. Where this is not done, the clergyman who is partly or entirely supported by the Society should be transferred, with the Society's concurrence, to some other field of labour.

In making this request we are actuated by no other motives than these: First, a desire to see our sister churches in a state of independent reliance on the resources with which God endows them; and secondly a desire to be enabled to send the message of salvation from our English Church to new fields Providentially opened to us from time to time.

*To the General Committee of the Diocesan Church Society.*

As Secretary of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund I beg to report that, in accordance with the rules, I have issued fifteen certificates of membership, and that the payment made by the clergy, together with the collections in the churches, amount to \$293.51, which sum has been paid to the Treasurer by me. Since the first of May I have also received several collections, which will appear in the account of next year.

I regret that so few of the clergy have availed themselves of the benefit of the fund, but trust, that as its advantages are better understood, the number of members will be largely increased.

The Committee have had under consideration applications for an assistant clergyman at Woodstock and Florenceville, and for other assistance to the Parishes of Derby, Richibucto, Sussex, Centerbury, and Blackville.

They regret that, as the payments on account of missionary societies exceed the estimated income by about \$750, they cannot recommend any grants for local purposes.

The Committee feel that there is a great necessity for the services of a missionary in many parts of the Diocese, which are so far from any resident clergyman, that they very seldom have any one to minister to them. They therefore recommend that a sum be placed at the disposal of the Schedule Committee, to enable the Bishop to employ a travelling missionary. The Committee hope that an earnest effort will be made to increase the income of the Society, so that there may be more new missionary work done, and that the grants may not have to be reduced in consequence of the want of funds.

merging the Society in the Synod, and of clothing the Synod with all the powers now vested in the Society; and further resolved, that the said committee also then report as to the necessary legislation to carry such change into effect; and that they be instructed to inquire and report as to the mode in which the proposed change has been effected, and with what result in other Colonial Dioceses; and on motion resolved, that Mr. Travis, Hon. Mr. Justice Allen, and Mr. W. M. Jarvis, do compose the said committee.

Mr. Travis gave notice of the following alterations in the Constitution of the Society, to be proposed at the next annual meeting of this committee:

“That the Constitution, Bye Laws, Rules and Regulations of this Society be repealed, cancelled, abrogated and annulled, with a view of vesting the rights and funds of this Society in the Synod of this Province.”

A resolution with reference to glebe lands was proposed by Mr. Jack; whereupon, it was moved by Mr. Jarvis, and resolved, that the matter be referred to the Executive Committee, with full power to deal with the subject included in Mr. Jack's resolution.

On motion of Mr. Jarvis it was

*Resolved*, That the thanks of this Society be given to the gentlemen controlling the various lines of railway and steamers, for their kindness and courtesy in permitting the Clergy and Lay Delegates to pass on their lines at reduced charges, during the present week.

On motion of Rev. S. J. Hanford, it was

*Resolved*, That the thanks of this committee be presented to the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of Trinity Church, for the use of the school room for the late meetings of this Society.

The Lord Bishop left the chair, and, on motion, Mr. Jarvis, V. P., took the same.

Whereupon, on motion of Mr. Wilkinson, seconded by the Rev. Dr. Jarvis, it was resolved unanimously, that the best thanks of this meeting be tendered to his Lordship for his kind and patient conduct in the chair.

The Anniversary Meeting was held in the Trinity Church School Room, at 4 o'clock P. M.

The Lord Bishop addressed the meeting.

The Secretary read an abstract of the Annual Report.

It was moved by Mr. John Sears, seconded by Mr. Geo. D. Street, and resolved unanimously, that the Report be received and printed under the direction of the Executive Committee.



**REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE, 1872.**

The minutes of this committee, at its meeting on the 7th July, 1871, are published in the 36th Report, pages 50-51.

The committee met at St. John, Oct. 4th, 1871, Rev. Canon Scovil, V. P., in the chair. In the absence of the Secretary, the Treasurer acted in his place.

The Chairman reported that the Loan Committee had not had opportunity to make an enquiry with reference to the application from the Parish of St. Mary's, and asked for further time, which was granted.

Mr. G. A. Schofield reported verbally from the committee on glebe lands, and that all steps possible had been taken to ascertain the position of a large quantity of glebe lands, immediate attention to which, they understand, is required.

Ordered that the following bills be paid :

Messrs. Barnes & Co. for printing the Annual Report,....	\$163 37
Messrs. J. & A. McMillan, printing,.....	14 50
Mr. G. A. Schofield's account, printing, &c.,.....	7 35

The Treasurer submitted his quarterly statement, showing a balance on hand of \$5119.39.

A form of certificate was submitted to be issued by the committee, for making provision for the Widows' and Orphans' fund, and authority was granted to the Secretary to affix the seal of the Society thereto.

Authority was given to the Secretary to procure sufficient number of postal cards for notices of the meetings of the Society, and also 500 copies of a form of returns, requested from the missionaries of the Society.

Mr. G. Sidney Smith submitted correspondence from Mr. J. G. Woodward, respecting the DeWolf lease held by him.

The Chairman reported that the Loan Committee had effected insurance for \$4000 on the reversionary interest of the Society, in buildings on the North Market Wharf,

left to the Society by the late S. Scovil, Esq., of Cambridge; and it was resolved that the action of the Loan Committee be approved.

The next meeting of this committee was held at Fred-erickton, on the 3d January, 1870.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

A statement of the Treasurer's Account was read, and also a report from the Loan Committee.

It was ordered that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the sum mentioned in the said Report, to the Rector of St. Mary's, towards the local endowment of that parish.

Mr. I. Allen Jack submitted a report from the committee on glebe lands, whereupon it was ordered that the same be received, and the committee be requested to continue their inquiries.

It was also resolved, with reference to the glebe land report, that the 3d tract therein mentioned be conveyed to the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of St. Peter's Church, Kingsclear; and that tracts 21, 22 and 29 be conveyed to the church corporation of St. Andrew's Church, in the Parish of Salisbury, and tract 25 to the church corporation of St. George, Moncton, upon their respectively paying the expenses.

It was ordered that the following bills be paid:

The Lord Bishop read a letter from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, respecting the renewal of the Grants to this Diocese; whereupon, it was resolved that His Lordship the Bishop be requested to ask for a continuance of the same.

It was ordered that the Treasurer do remit to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, the collections made in the Diocese for foreign missions; and it was further ordered that he be authorized to pay to the widow of the late Rev. John Black, the quarter's salary due on the 1st inst.

The next meeting of this committee was held in St. John, on the 6th March, 1872.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

A letter was read from the widow of the late Rev. John Black; and it was thereupon resolved, that this committee do recommend the General Committee that a pension of £50 sterling per annum be granted to Mrs. Black, to commence from the 1st January last, and that till the next meeting of the General Committee, the Treasurer be authorized to pay the amount above-named as it may become due.

The Treasurer submitted a statement of his account made up to the 4th March inst., shewing a balance on hand of \$939.96, exclusive of a balance of \$2000 at interest in the Bank of New Brunswick.

A committee was appointed to make arrangements for the annual meetings of the Society, composed of the following members: Rev. Canon Lee, Rev. T. E. Dowling, and Messrs. W. M. Jarvis, G. A. Schofield, Hurd Peters, R. T. Clinch, H. W. Frith, W. Carman, T. W. Daniel, G. W. Whitney.

Read an account from the Secretary for postage and incidental expenses from July last to this date, amounting to \$15.87. Ordered that the same be paid.

Mr. G. A. Schofield, from the Schedule Committee, reported that the Parish of Westmoreland had failed to enter into an engagement with the committee, and in paying the amount required in aid of the missionary's support, and that the payment of the Grant from the Society ceased from the 1st January last.

A motion was made by Mr. I. Allen Jack to the effect that an action of ejectment should be brought by the Society to recover certain lands to which the corporation of St. George's Church, Moncton, are entitled, upon the execution on the part of the said corporation of a bond to indemnify the Society from any cost in the suit referred to. Whereupon the said motion was decided in the negative.

It was ordered that a bill of Messrs. McMillan for printing be paid, on the approval of the Chairman of the

The committee met at Fredericton on the 5th June, 1872, when the report of the proceedings for the past year was submitted and ordered to be laid before the General Committee.

A report of the Loan Committee was also presented and received, and also a statement of the Treasurer's account.

A report from Mr. I. Allen Jack on the part of the Glebe Land Committee was read, and it was resolved that the committee be requested to continue their valuable services, and that tract No. 5 be conveyed to the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry of the parish church at Andover.

Application was made on the part of the Rev. C. Matthews for a certificate from the Widows' and Orphans' Fund; and it was resolved, that if Mr. Matthews joins the association before the 1st July next, he can be admitted upon his paying the full annual sum required by the rules of the Society, and one half more of that amount, and also upon his furnishing a medical certificate to the Secretary of the state of his health.

The committee met at St. John the day after the Anniversary Meeting, (July 5th, 1872). The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The following motion was made by Mr. G. A. Schofield :

*Resolved*, That 3,500 copies of the Annual Report be printed, and that the Rev. W. H. DeVeber, the Rev. Dr. Lee, Mr. G. S. Smith, Mr. W. Carman, and the Secretary, be a committee to attend to that duty, and that it be an instruction to the committee to ask for tenders, and in case the tender made by a churchman be as low as any other, he shall have the preference.

Whereupon, it was moved, in amendment, by Mr. Jarvis, to strike out the words after "duty," which amendment was carried in the affirmative; and, on motion, it was resolved to add the name of the Rev. T. E. Dowling to the said committee.

It was resolved that the Rev. Canon Scovil, Messrs. W. M. Jarvis, B. Lester Peters, G. Sidney Smith, J. Travis, and the Treasurer, do form the Loan Committee for the ensuing year.

It was resolved that the Rev. J. Pearson be the Secretary of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund for the ensuing year.

On motion of Mr. Frith the following resolution was adopted:

*Whereas*, A lot of land, situate in the Parish of St. Martin's, in the City and County of St. John, was conveyed by deed, dated 11th June, 1847, to the Bishop of Fredericton, his heirs and assigns, intended to be held by him in trust for church purposes; and whereas His Lordship being desirous of correcting the error in the mode of conveyance to him, and to place the title of the said premises in the Diocesan Church Society for the purposes of such intended Trust, has made a conveyance to the Diocesan Church Society for the uses and purposes intended; Therefore

*Resolved*, That the deed from His Lordship be received and duly registered in the said City and County of St. John.

The following resolution referred to this committee by the General Committee, was moved by Mr. I. Allen Jack:

*Resolved*, That application be made to the legislature of this Province, or to the legislature of Canada, as in the opinion of the Executive Committee may seem advisable, for the passage of an Act enabling the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick, by the vote of the General Committee or of the Executive Committee of this Society, to sell absolutely, or to lease in such manner and for such rentals and terms of years as either of the said committee may deem advisable, all or any of

the said lands now held by the Society under Chapter 76, 34 Victoria, of the Statutes of New Brunswick or otherwise, the proceeds of such sales or leases to be applied in accordance with the original trusts upon which the same are held, or in such other manner as either of the said committees may think best, and the legislature passing the Act may permit or approve.

To this the following amendment was moved by Mr. Jarvis, and carried in the affirmative: that the Glebe Land Committee, to be appointed at this meeting, be requested to report specially at the next meeting of this Committee, on the reason and necessity for the legislation, proposed in the above resolution.

It was resolved that Messrs. I. Allen Jack, J. R. Ruel, G. A. Schofield, C. W. Weldon, and G. Sidney Smith, be appointed a committee to carry out the recommendations contained in the report of the Glebe Land Committee appointed last year; and that the resolution moved by Mr. Jack at this meeting be referred to the said committee.
