ACCESS TO MOUNT PLEASANT.

Township Council Again Considers the Question—Brimley Disappearing—Question of Route is the Crux.

Another attempt was made yesterday in the solution of the problem to obtain city street car accommodation to Deer Park, with the effect of defining the position of the Township Council in the matter, to which might be almost considered a certainty.

After touring the proposed route, by way of Avenue-road and Heath-street to Yonge-street, the members of the Council were unanimously of the opinion that no obstacle should be placed in the way of obtaining the railway communication; they were also of the same frame of mind as regards the maintenance of the railway roadbed, and decided that it was entirely out of the province of the township to be responsible for its keeping up.

The present condition of the route showed the absolute necessity of some improvement, and if the railway is built the travelled portion of the road will be placed in good condition by the municipality. This will mean considerable outlay, and in doing this the Council contend that they are doing all that they can legitimately be asked to do.

Discussed by the Council. The meeting of the Council was held at the Deer Park Hotel. The whole of the members were present, with Bruce Duncan presiding.

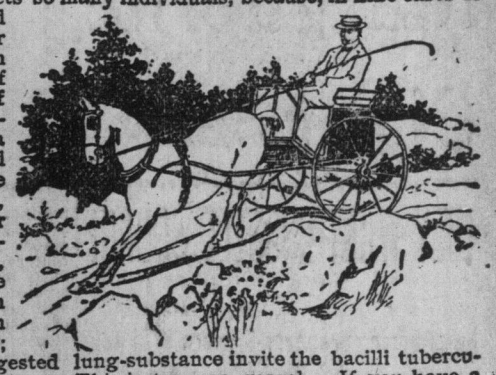

FOR CHRISTIAN SCIENTISTS

Erection of the First Church in the British Dominions.

Story of Their Progress in Toronto—Yesterday Morning's Early Ceremony—The Solemnity of the Occasion—The Presence of the Bishop of Toronto—The Presence of the Bishop of Toronto.

An unusual hour, that of 7 o'clock of the early morning, was chosen for a session of the Christian Scientists of the city for the ceremony of laying the corner stone for the first Christian Science church built in British dominions.

The ceremony, which marks a red-letter day in the history of the Scientists in Toronto, was opened by Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Stewart, and consisted of Scriptural readings; also selections from the Christian Science text book, "Science and Health, with Key to the Scriptures," by Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy, the founder of this interesting sect.

Before the corner stone was swung into place, a copper bolt, containing a copy of the Christian Science text book, "Science and Health," copies of the Bible and the Christian Science Journal, the addresses of Mrs. Stewart and the clerk of the church were placed in the cavity. The stone was formally laid by Mrs. Stewart, who is the leader of the work here, and who will have an organ, supplied by Lye of Toronto.

The new church, which occupies the site of the old Reformed Episcopal Church, on the corner of St. James and Queen-streets, will have a seating capacity of 250. It will be finished in oak, and will have an organ, supplied by Lye of Toronto.

Not a Cent of Debt. To the World Mr. John O'Connor, the clerk, gave some interesting facts in connection with the Scientists and their methods of building. For example, that no Christian Science church has ever been dedicated with a cent of debt upon it.

The work of the Scientists was introduced in Toronto ten years ago by Mrs. Stewart, who was a personal student of Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy, the founder of the religion; its members then could be counted on the fingers of the hand, and today this First Church boasts over 400 members. These, however, are by no means the only Christian Scientists in Toronto, for there is a second branch, which meets on Yonge-street, of whose plans Mr. O'Connor knew nothing.

Speaking of the spread of Christian Science, Mr. O'Connor said that in America alone there are over 1,000,000 believers, and the work is spreading in France, Germany, and in England. Although they worship in churches, the Scientists have no preachers; the service is very simple and dignified, consisting of hymn singing, silent prayer and reading from the Bible and from their great text book "Science and Health."

These are alternately read by the first and second readers, who also take up the International Sabbath School lessons and elucidate them according to the Bible and "Science and Health."

The management of the church is under the hands of the men and women, and although Mrs. Eddy is the head and founder of the movement, Mr. O'Connor said that the Scientists are not under any personal subjection to her.

The Six Tenets. Asked for the main beliefs, Mr. O'Connor said that those uniting with the First Church of Christ, Scientist, must subscribe to the following tenets and rules, laid down by Rev. Mary Baker Eddy:
