CHRISTMASTIDE IN THE OLD LAND IS CLOUDED THREE YEARS OF WAR AND THE END IS NOT YET

Process of Attrition Brings the Last Stand Perceptibly Nearer, and the Steadfast Loyalty of the Colonies Compensates for Recently Reported Reverses-Queen's Health Shows Improvement.

London, Dec. 25 .- "Christmas, for the third year in succession, finds the country engaged in war," that is the burden of the editorials in the London papers this morning, and regrets are expressed that the casualty list issued to-day totals 49 men killed and 71 wounded. Satisfaction, however, is found in the fact that the process of attrition brings the end of the struggle perceptibly nearer.
