



Prussia Witnesses Scenes of Disorder Over Presence of Police

Berlin, Nov. 20.-The final Prussian Diet elections, which are usually sim ply quiet assemblages of the electors chosen at the polls, were to-day, in many districts, disorderly and even violent. The Socialists in the Second and Fourth Districts of Berlin refused to participate in the election until the police left the halls. The police heretofore had always been present by tolerance, but to-day were compelled to withdraw, when it was pointed out, after a controversy, that the law did not permit them to be present. The disturbances began in the Second District, owing to the overcrowding of a meeting hall by non-electors, who obstinately refused to vacate their places for electors. The election authorities summoned the police, but the electors and outsiders yelled in chorus: "Out with the bluecoats," and banged the tables with beer mugs until Herr Subeila, member of the Reichstag, pursuaded the police to retire, whereupon quiet was restored. In other districts, both here and in the provinces, the Socialists occupied the halls beforehand and occasioned similar scenes. If on the other hand the crop approximates 10,250,000, some evidence of that fact is most likely to make itself clear before the first week in December.

The statistical position for the week as far as visible supply is concerned, should have a rather quieting effect on speculation, as the amount brought into sight is about 120,000 bales in excess of last year. The extreme cold weather in the south will retard picking and marketing of crop according to all precedents.

The near future of the market may reflect a somewhat wider difference of opinion among graders and a less disposition to buy for the alvance which many seem to think inevitable.










Wellington, N.Z., Nov. 20.-The preerential trade bill, adopted Nov. 18, by the House of Representatives, places a duty of 20 per cent. on the following goods, now free from duty, when from countries outside the British empirte: Bicycle parts, gas engines, oil pirte: Bicycle parts, gas engines, oil engines, gum boots, iron and steel cordage, sheet, boit and bar iron, printing paper, railroad and tramway rails, sail cloth, canvas and duck and surgical and dental instruments.
