That PANAMA TREATY... How Uncle Sam Gets Sovereignty Over the Proposed Canal.

Washington, Nov. 20.—Altho the Hay-Varela treaty has in substance been published the Associated Press gives herewith the text of the first five articles of the convention, which have to do with sovereignty:

Article 1.—The United States guarantees and will maintain the independence of the Republic of Panama.

Article 2.—The Republic of Panama grants to the United States in perpetuity the use, occupation and control of the zone of land and land under water, for the construction, maintenance, operation, sanitation and protection of said canal.

Article 3.—The Republic of Panama grants to the United States in perpetuity the use, occupation and control of the zone of land and land under water, for the construction, maintenance, operation, sanitation and protection of said canal.

Article 4.—As rights subsidiary to the aforesaid grants the Republic of Panama grants in perpetuity to the United States the right to use the rivers, streams, lakes and other bodies of water within the limits of the zone mentioned, and described in article 2 of this agreement, and within the limits of all auxiliary lands and waters mentioned and described in article 2 of this agreement.





tion to E. P. B. Johnson, and that it was the affidavit made by Callaghan that prompted Crossin to lay the charge of theft.

The contention of the prosecution was that the evidence should be confined to the charge of retaining the \$180, for which one certain piano had been sold by Callaghan to Mrs. Gardner, which had been secured from Crossin to be disposed of on commission.

An invoice, which Mr. Crossin admitted was in his handwriting, to Callaghan, for the purchase of a piano for \$180, was introduced by the defence, and supporting the contention of sale.

Mr. Crossin's story in brief was that he had sold the piano for \$180, purely on a commission basis. It was sold to him and admitted the sale. He wanted to pay \$100 cash, and give his note for the balance.

Where Mrs. Gardner Case in. The prisoner had brought Mrs. Gardner, the proposed purchaser, to his office. He had told her to make the deal thru Callaghan. Some time had elapsed after the sale of the piano and affidavit had been made concerning the stock deal.

Mr. Crossin admitted receiving a registered letter from Mrs. Gardner, which he had destroyed. He did not recall whether this letter had contained a statement by Mrs. Gardner ten per cent commission on the stock sold to Mr. Gibbs. The letter was important he said, and he had preserved it. This letter, according to Callaghan, is important, and does claim the commission.

The witness said he had given Callaghan a letter of introduction to E. P. B. Johnson, "that a couple of lines." The Crown Attorney objected since that had nothing to do with the "No, but it makes it look different," suggested the court, in admitting the question.

Mr. DuVerne read from a letter signed "E. Crossin, 'Any arrangement my old friend Callaghan makes with you will be satisfactory.'"

Continuing the cross examination, Mr. Crossin admitted he might have given Callaghan a statement showing the stock Gamay and others held in the company. This is in verification of the prisoner's contention, but the witness explained that it was only in a general way, for no particular purpose.

"Did you ever meet Callaghan in Johnson's office?" went on Mr. DuVerne. "As near as I can recall, I met him in the outside office. I have been talking to Mr. Johnson on the inside."

"Was that about the sale of the stock?" "I wasn't in Johnson's office with Callaghan at all," Callaghan said.

"You said you walked down with Callaghan," said the magistrate, "talking to him, didn't he know where you were going?"
