Mortality from cold is not confined to children whom the misery of their parents cannot guard from the rigor of the weather, but it operates to a great ex-tent, without being perceived or suspected, in families enjoying affluence, and in which it is believed that the necessary precautions are taken, because, cold being relative, it is difficult from our own feeling to judge of its effects on others. Children may not feel the position which arises from it; their coustitu-tions become deteriorated by passing through the alternations of health and disease, and they sink under the action of an unknown cause. 
