It is a single track, raised on a trestle, and in its curious cars, passengers are carried on a single rail. The cars are suspended from a single overhead wire, and the wheels are of a special design, which serve to maintain the equilibrium of the rolling stock, at about two feet.

The Nor-Wester, the pioneer newspaper of Red River, founded by William Buckingham and William Caldwell, made its first appearance on Dec. 28, 1856. It consisted of four pages of five columns. The lengthy prospectus published in the first number of the paper, which was edited by the Red, Assiniboine and Saskatchewan Rivers, is a most interesting and valuable document. It contains a full and complete account of the history of the settlement of the West, and the progress of the fur trade, and the early days of the settlement of the West.
