**HUMAN SACRIFICE IN BRITAIN.**  
It has been asserted on competent authority, that within the last century such a human sacrifice took place in Calcutta, before the shrine of Kalee, the blacke, or most terrific form of Deevy; and the records of the Indian government might unfold a tale regarding a similar alleged sacrifice at Baroda, within a still more recent period. Our readers may at first be startled at such an allegation, and be sceptical as to the existence of such atrocities under the British rule; but the discovery of the true system has placed it beyond a doubt, that the doctrines of this old worship still live amidst the bosom of the Indian community; that thousands of systematic murders have been recently perpetrated, year after year, in the name of religion; and other proofs are not wanting, that however abscond from the general character of the people, this dark notion of the efficacy and lawfulness of human sacrifice, has ever survived in certain classes of the community, and that it exercises its influence over the minds of the people, in a striking evidence of the recent prevalence of this practice, or at least of this notion, is to be found in the imputation, universally current against the Kurrade Brahmins, of poisoning their guests, especially their own sons-in-law, as an offering to Deevy, the spirit of the evil. This imputation is not cast upon them, it must be observed, by Europeans, or other parties prejudiced against the Hindu religion, but by their own brother Brahmins. The feeling is so strong on this subject, that many of the latter will not, to this day, eat in their houses. This prejudice so late to be grounded in the present day, especially as regards the Kurrade Brahmins of Bombay, amongst whom are to be found many men distinguished alike for their learning and humanity of character; but, as the secret worship of the Shuktae, or female deities, and the human sacrifices, has long been prevalent amongst the southern Brahmins of this class, there is every reason to suppose it originally rested upon some very strong foundation. At all events it shows the familiarity of the people with such ideas; and it is a lamentable fact, that the influence of such notions is extensively prevalent in India, one ramifications, indeed, of the Thug system consists, or consisted of a society of poisoners.—*Dublin University Magazine for March.*

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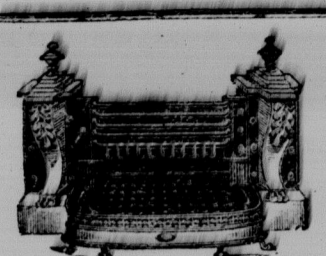
