A sermon Delivered at Union Chapel, Manchester, on Sunday Morning, May 27, 1894, by the Rev. Alexander MacLaren, D. D.

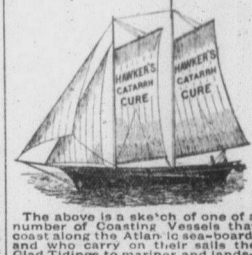

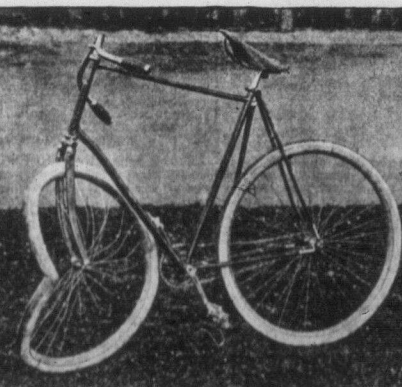
