Admiral from Venezuela to the 8th report a desperate battle in the Province of Barquisimeto, between Government troops under Marquez and the insurgents under Colinas. The engagement lasted 84 hours. Between 700 and 800 men were killed and wounded on both sides. Both parties claim a victory.

STRAWBERRY BLOSSOM IN DECEMBER.—On Thursday last, Mr. C. J. T. Fox brought us a fine strawberry blossom which he picked on that day in his garden on Cape Fear, not far from the Light House. A strawberry blossom growing in the open air in the month of December is something we have never before known in Nova Scotia, and is at least very unusual.—*Yarmouth Herald.*

A father in consoling his daughter who had lost her husband, said: "I don't wonder you grieve for him, my child, you will never find his equal." "I don't know as I can," responded the sobbing widow, "but I'll do my best!" The father felt comforted.

By returns made by the head constable of Liverpool, England, it is shown that since the hours in which liquor may be sold in that city have been increased by one hour, or 7 per cent., drunkenness has increased one-tenth, while arrests on Sunday have increased about 60 per cent.

BURNED TO DEATH.—A Bridgewater N. S. despatch to the *Halifax Chronicle* says:—The house of James Fitch, at Conquerall, in this county, was destroyed by fire yesterday morning. The owner while attempting to save some papers, remained too long in the building, and was burned to death.

Governor Dix has removed two of the Commissioners of charities for extending too much leniency to Tweed. The latter is hereafter to be subjected to regular prison fare and discipline.

If a person in a house on fire has the presence of mind to apply a wet cloth or handkerchief to his mouth, or nostrils, a passage can be effected through the densest smoke without any serious inconvenience.

It is stated that there will be an Australian team at the Wimbledon meet next year. Some hopes are entertained that an American team will also compete.

The first levy for the Russian Army which is now taking place, will raise 150,000 men. The new military system provides Russia with 1,000,000 defenders in case of war.

A colored barber who died in Pittsburgh, Penn., the other day, left \$300,000, all gained by shaving of some kind.

An Ohio Sheriff felt a good deal of embarrassment on having to take to the penitentiary a man who had been convicted of voting for him three times.

Artificial ice-making in San Francisco is a paying affair. The patent brought \$150,000 to the manufacturers last year.

During the third quarter of the present year 1555 horses, mules and asses were slaughtered for food in Paris.

Two Italian physicians are said to have discovered a liquid which instantly stops the flow of blood from any kind of a wound.
