Canon Macnab appeals for more workers in the various activities in connection with the Cathedral Congregation. Several teachers, both male and female are needed in the Sunday School. A Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent for the Junior Branch of the Girls' Auxiliary. A more zealous participation and interest in the Anglican Young People's Association is urgently desired. The Executive of the A.Y.P.A. hope to arrange at the next meeting, Monday Evening, 7th Oct. an attractive programme of Meetings and Subjects for the coming season. Persons desirous of using the Sunday offertory envelopes (the best system we know of) can secure the Calendar outfit from Canon Macnab or any of the Sidesmen. Strangers and newcomers in the Congregation who wish to be visited by the Clergy of the Cathedral are asked to give their name and address to any of the Sidesmen or Ushers.

The notable event of the past month has been the visit to Canada of the Bishop of London, who was accorded an enthusiastic reception at all places, and not by Anglicans only but by many others as well. He spent three or four days in Toronto, the guest of the Archbishop at the See House, and attended the morning service at the Cathedral on Sunday 15th, being the Celebrant in the Holy Communion. The preacher at this service was Bishop Reeve, who thus made his first official appearance in the Diocese. The congregation, as might be expected, was very large, but the Sidesmen did their part so efficiently that all were seated without confusion. The music was excellently rendered by the Choir, so that, on the whole, the service was one to be remembered.

Many compliments have been paid to our choir from time to time, and we have seldom thought proper to refer to them, but we feel that we should not omit to note that the Rev. E. P. Anderson, Chaplain to the Bishop of London, who is an acknowledged authority on Church Music, stated that the music in St. Alban's was the best he had heard in Canada, a compliment which was fully endorsed by Bishop Winnington-Ingram.

#### CHORISTER'S SCHOLARSHIPS

For some time past it has been thought that much more could be done for the benefit of the choir and the improvement of the services, if an arrangement could be made whereby all, or most of our choir boys could attend the Cathedral School. These arrangements have now been made by the management of the School. At the

annual meeting of the corporation, presided over by the Archbishop, a resolution was passed to the effect that an, 'Loys of the Cathedral Choir who qualify, may be admitted to the Cathedral School at half the ordinary fees. The conditions of qualification to be arranged by the Principal and the Choirmaster.

It is hoped that the parents of the boys will avail themselves of this opportunity, and do what lies in their power to support this movement, both for the betterment of their boys and the improvement of the Choir.

Sincere regret and sympathy with the bereaved has been felt in the congregation on the occasion of the death, after a very brief illness, of Mr. John H. Butler, and on the same day his little daughter Beatrice Kathleen. Mr. Butler possessed special aptitude and skill in Sunday School work, and for a long time conducted a large Bible Class in S. Stephen's. He was acting Superintendent of the Cathedral Sunday School during the summer months, and as it was understood that he was about giving up his work at S. Stephen's, we were in hopes that we would have had the advantage of his services in St. Alban's in a more permanent manner.

The medal of the Royal Canadian Humane Association was presented at the School Residence on 26th ult. to Guy Armstrong for conspicuous courage and persistence in endeavouring to save the life of Russell Armstrong, drowned at the Island on 22nd July last.

Parochial Missionary Collections for July, August and September, amount to \$31.25.

The accounts of the Sylvan Féte given June 26th, at Ravenswood, having been closed, the Finance Committee have the very satisfactory sum of \$682.27 to the good. This amount has been divided as follows: \$636.27 to the Women's Branch Cathedral League; \$24.20 to the Sunday School Pier Fund; \$21.20 to the St. Alban's School Pier Fund; these two latter amounts being the face value of the tickets sold by the children.
