New Line of Steamers.—We mentioned a short time age that an effort was being made by some American capitalists to start a new line of Ocean steamers to ply between New York and some of the European ports. At that time it was thought that Congress would not grant a direct subsidy, but make (the proprietors a handsome remuneration for the carrying of the United States mails, in fact if we remember distinctly, it was proposed to give them the total amount of the postage for this service. The amount, however, has been fixed in a bill which passed the Senate a few days ago, and the new line is to receive the sum of \$600,000 per annum for mail service to the United States. This subsidy is certainly a liberal one, and should contribute materially to the support of a line of steamers sailing under the American fiag.




