MOONEY NOT TO HANG, BUT SERVE FOR LIFE

Sacramento, Cal., Nov. 28.—The sentence of Thomas J. Mooney, sentenced to be hanged on Dec. 13 for the deaths of ten persons killed by a bomb explosion in San Francisco during a preparedness day parade, July 1916, was commuted by Governor W. D. Stephens tonight to life imprisonment. Court action to save Mooney from the gallows was exhausted by the prisoners' supreme court of the United States having recently decided it could not review the case.

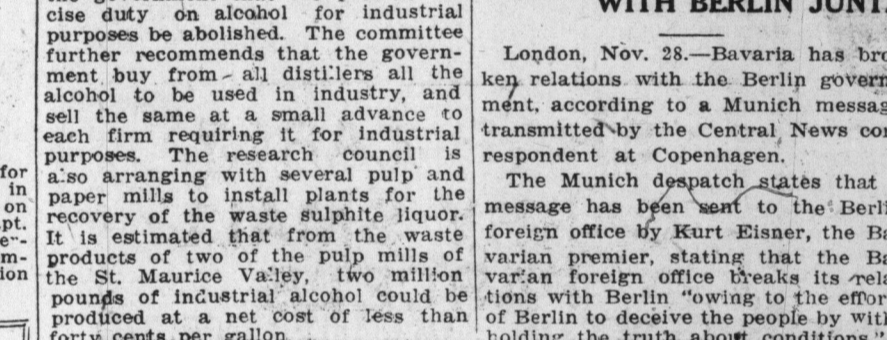

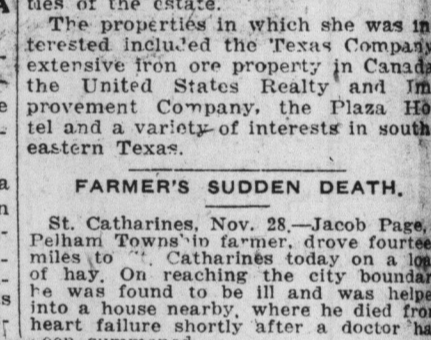

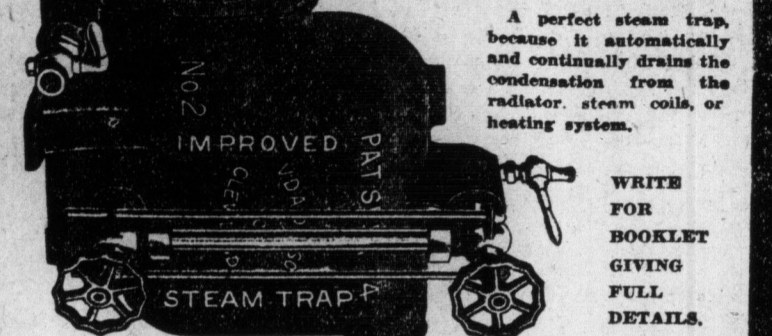
