THE YUKON TRADE.

The Victoria, B. C. Times, which, of course, understands the situation in the Yukon better than the people down here, calls upon the Government to take immediate steps to regulate trade and remedy the abuses that exist and have existed in the district for several years.

Great Britain is now called upon to do the duties which she should have done in 1860, in order that she might be free to adopt a larger measure of protection. Great Britain might well do the same. She continues to receive "most favored nation" treatment from France, although France is not bound by treaty to grant it.

THE THOMPSON-ATEAFI AFFAIR.

The disgraceful showing of the John Eaton Co. at the meeting of creditors yesterday suggests a number of needed changes in our laws in regard to credit, preferred claims and insolvency generally.

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The statement of the affairs of the concern shows that the English creditors had put \$40,000 of their goods in the store; Toronto creditors \$35,000; and others \$20,000, and that the bank which made advances to the company took an agreement from the Thompsons, for "the John Eaton Co., Limited," is another way of spelling "Thompson."

We are not at this moment blaming the bank for its misadventure and the loss of its money, but we do say it is high time that the law should be altered so as to prevent one creditor from taking the goods put in by all the other creditors to secure himself.

It is certainly very desirable to have the country accessible during the coming winter. It would give Canadians an opportunity of getting a foothold in the district before it is entirely occupied by foreigners.

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JOHN EATON'S CREDITORS

Gathered in Mr. Clarkson's Bankruptcy Parlors

To SEE HOW MATTERS STOOD

Assignee's Statement Shows a Deficit of No Less Than \$101,828.

The Thompsons Were Not Present Because

They Fought Back on the Ground

That the Insurance Policies to the Bank of Toronto—Claim of the Bank to the Insurance Money May Be

Attacked by Some of the Unsecured Creditors—An Unexplained \$50,000 in the Statement

The meeting of the John Eaton creditors took place yesterday in Mr. Clarkson's bankruptcy parlors over the Ontario Bank. The large room—once the dining room of the bank manager when bank managers lived over the banks—was crowded with actual creditors and those who represented them.

Mr. Clarkson, an expert who has been in the Yukon country ten years, stated that the trip between Victoria and Klondike can be made in ten days provided light draught steamers are placed on the upper river. There is no doubt that by next spring the Canadian cities on the Pacific will be able to compete with the United States cities in the Klondike trade.

Mr. Clarkson further intimated that he had no objection to the English creditors intended to attack the claim of the bank to the insurance money, but no definite statement was made at that meeting. A good deal will depend on the English creditors' advice.
