CANADA NOT SO ANXIOUS. Sentiment in Favor of Reciprocity is Growing Fairly.

Ottawa, Oct. 13.—William E. Brigham, secretary of the New England Reciprocity League, has received a letter from a high official source in Canada, of which the following is the most important part:

"It is, of course, undeniable that the anxiety for reciprocity in Canada has diminished very greatly and the country would not view the failure of negotiations in the same light as it would have done a few years ago, still I have every faith in the probability of securing the acceptance of a treaty if the Joint High Commission meets. I think it will be likely to do, by the first of December.

"Our session is nearing a close. We shall probably complete our labors some time this week. Protraction probably will be followed by a communication between Laurier and Senator Fairbanks. If all goes well the date for the commission will then be arranged.

"We will then get together and see what can be done. It will be a meeting of momentous importance, for we are either about to establish better trade relations between Canada and the United States or enter upon a career where we shall be governed exclusively by our own interests. I feel anxious to see the end reached and to know which one of the roads that lead into a parting of the ways we shall enter."

STOPPED HUNT FOR \$6,000,000.

Landslide Hurdles Expedition to Cocos Island After Treasure.

San Francisco, Oct. 13.—The British ship Lyttton has brought here the story of her recent expedition to Cocos Island, off Costa Rica, in search of \$6,000,000, which, it is asserted, was buried in a cave by Peruvians during the struggle of their country for independence. Rear Admiral Palliser (retired), of the British navy, commanded the expedition, which contained a number of prominent persons. When the Lyttton reached Cocos Island it was found that a great landslide had passed over the spot where it was supposed the treasure of Cocos Island was buried. The expedition did not have the necessary equipment to remove the great mass of earth, and came away without the coveted treasure.

NEGLECT COST \$2,000,000.

Loss That Has Defeated Certain Paris Museums.

Paris, Oct. 13.—The Paris museums of the Louvre and Cluny have lost \$2,000,000 because the authorities would not listen to the Marchioness Arconati-Visconti. The marchioness, who lives in Paris, is well known for her literary and artistic tastes, and when she married her will she left the sum mentioned to the national museums. But when there was a question of appointing a director to the Cluny Museum, she gave M. Roujon, Minister of Fine Arts, to understand that if the post of M. Roujon was given to the post instead of her candidate, M. Mollinier, she would tear up her testament. M. Roujon was, however, successful, and the marchioness has now made a new will, leaving \$2,000,000 to the City of Florence.

KEEP IN MIDDLE OF THE ROAD.

Request Merchants Make of Students for Halloween.

The Toronto branch of the Retail Merchants' Association of Canada, through its secretary, has forwarded a resolution to the Mayor of Toronto, requesting him to write to the principals of the various colleges of the city, asking them to have the students refrain from acts of violence and destruction to the property of merchants, on the evening of Halloween, and to request them also to walk in the middle of the road.

A resolution was also adopted, which will be forwarded to the Police Commissioners, asking the strengthening of the force be increased sufficiently for the necessary protection of the property of the retail merchants of Toronto.

Some where on the map of New South Wales is a place called Newcastle, where the proportion of the inhabitants who claim to be the descendants of the British is similar to what it is in the Borough of Manhattan. At a public banquet recently held there, when Dr. Margra, the mayor, proposed a toast at that part of the evening when the Anglo-Saxon toast usually is, "To the Anglo-Celtic Race." The innovation was greeted with enthusiasm. It is expected here that the toast will become fashionable near-by.

The Danger in Mob License.

From the Atlanta Constitution. Consider the action of lynchers in overthrowing the law and taking upon themselves the right to judge and punish for one crime, and they demand wider latitude and greater power. To the mob it is right in disregarding the courts and defying the sworn officers of the law in one thing, and it immediately declares itself superior to the law in all instances. If it is to be allowed to act as legislator in one thing, it seems no reason why it should not administer punishment in things according to its own pleasure. It requires no violent stretch of the imagination to put down, demanding a right that it is permitted to inflict its death penalty upon a man, because of his political or his religious beliefs. That has been the experience of the South, and human nature is not greatly changed in a few years, a few decades, or even a few centuries. This lynching mania has manifested itself in all parts of the country. The consideration furnished to merely local or sectional problems. It is a blot upon American civilization, a menace to the peace of the land. Instead of seeking to end revenge for all good people should join in condemning it and putting down, and keeping down, the mob every time it seeks to trample the law under foot.

Nothing is so rare for any evil; it is in itself an evil that is being done by some one American civilization, one that must be stamped out if civilization is to be so worthy of the name.
