Annual Report.

To the Members of the Saint John Mechanics' Institute :

The President and Directors regret sincerely that they are again called upon to present to the Members of the Institute a Report which does not exhibit its affairs as being in a condition so prosperous as they could desire, or as they had hoped, when they made their last annual statement, to be able at this time to speak of. In spite of the most economical and careful management on their part, and of constant and anxious efforts to improve its financial position, the Institute still remains laboring under a floating debt of more than *Thirteen Hundred Dollars*. This debt it has been found impossible, by any ordinary means at the command of the Board, to reduce; and it has been even increased somewhat within the past year, although every available source of income has been improved to the fullest extent.

The expenditure during the year has been kept within the narrowest limits consistent with the efficient management of our concerns. A reference to the Estimate which was prepared and given at the last General Meeting as an exhibit of the probable revenue and outlay for the ensuing year, will show that the expenses have not been in excess of the amount there set down, and that the income from all sources has been nearly equal to the amount calculated upon. But in regard to the aggregate sum received from the sale of Members' Tickets, and of tickets for admission to the Supplementary Course of Lectures, the Board have to confess a serious disappointment. Their exertions to increase the receipts from these sources have, they are sorry to be compelled to say, been productive of no encouraging results. Notwithstanding the care taken to secure from abroad the services of eminent pro-

fessional lecturers, and the large outlay which their engagement necessarily involved, and notwithstanding the high character of the lectures, scientific and literary, fortunately obtained from gentlemen resident in our own Province and in Nova Scotia, the attractions we have thus placed before the public have not proved strong enough to realize the anticipated accession to our membership. In fact, the number of members who this year took out their tickets is but 284, a falling off of 66 from last year's number. The sum received from Members' Fees is \$1412, while it last year was \$1863. The deficiency thus created has been, it is true, in part compensated by the amount derived from the rents received for the use of the Hall, which has been by \$485 42 more than the estimated sum.

An examination of the Abstract of Receipts and Expenditures for the year, and of the Abstract of Liabilities and Assets of the Institute at this date, which has been made up in the usual form, and is herewith submitted, will fully explain the points to which reference has been made. It will also make clear to the Members the pressing necessity for some immediate and effective action in regard to our finances, if we desire to maintain in a position of usefulness an institution which has done so much good in the past, and which deserves so well of the present.

Last year your President and Directors, in their Report, brought this subject prominently before the Members at the General Meeting; and a Special Committee was then appointed, in accordance with a Resolution adopted by the Meeting, to solicit subscriptions in aid of the Institute's funds. The sum procured by that Committee was, in all, \$369, which was not half the amount required to effect the object proposed by those who supported the adoption of such a method of redressing our finances. The obstacle which the floating debt last year presented to our progress still lies in our way; and it rests with the whole body of the Institute's members to determine what course shall be pursued in order to accomplish its complete removal. And the Board of Directors, in thus directing your attention to

this subject, earnestly ask that it shall immediately receive at your hands a careful consideration and permanent settlement.

The necessity for the removal of this load from the shoulders of the incoming Board is rendered doubly imperative by the pressing requirements of the Institute in reference to its Library, its Museum, and its Buildings.

By a Report, which the Committee having care of the buildings laid before the Directors at their last regular meeting, it appears that at least \$660 ought to be spent, without delay, upon necessary repairs and improvements; and a considerably larger sum might be advantageously expended for those purposes.

The Library calls for the outlay of a much greater amount, in order to replace volumes which have been lost or entirely destroyed, to rebind and otherwise repair volumes which have been injured, to purchase new books, and so to render the collection equal in extent, variety and attractiveness to the wants of our reading community,

From a Report, prepared by the present painstaking and careful Curator for the Library Committee, and submitted to the Directors, it has been ascertained that of out of 4,203 volumes catalogued as belonging to the Institute there are now on its shelves in good condition 3,116; that 352 need repairs and are worth restoring; while 97 are not worth repairing, and no less than 540 volumes are altogether wanting, being lost or wholly destroyed. There are out, in the possession of members, or of former members, who, having been notified and requested to return the books, have neglected to do so, 207 volumes. The average number of volumes at present kept constantly in circulation, and exchanged from day to day, is 138.

The only additions made to the Library in the course of the year have been the handsome donations made by J. W.

Lawrence and John Boyd, Esquires, who each gave new books to the value of fifty dollars, and the gift of 34 volumes, out of his private library, by John Sears, Esq.

It will thus be seen that an amount far beyond the present means at the disposal of the President and Directors ought to be at once applied to the purchase of books; and that even for the restoration of the Library to a state equal to its former condition, more than they can spare for the purpose is wanted.

In accordance with a resolution passed several months ago by the Common Council, a Committee of that body, appointed for the purpose, met a Committee of your Board of Directors, to confer upon the subject of a Free City Library, and the terms upon which the Institute's Library might be transferred to the public as the nucleus of such an institution. As, however, no definite scheme had been prepared by any one to be submitted for your approval and concurrence, nothing determinate was done in the matter.

The Reading Room has been, it is conceived, rendered more comfortable and convenient to the members who visit it by the recent transfer of its desks and tables to the same room in which the Library is placed; and a saving, apart from the rent derived from the room formerly occupied as a Reading Room, has been brought about by the change of situation. The Committee having charge of this department report it as being in an excellent condition, and well taken care of by the Curator. Twenty-nine newspapers, including several of the best scientific and literary periodicals published in Great Britain and the United States, and several of the leading commercial papers issued abroad, and in other portions of the Dominion of Canada, as well as our own local papers, are regularly placed upon the files. And five Monthly Magazines and four Quarterly Reviews—selected from the principal ones printed in our language—are also laid upon the tables.

It is to be wondered at, as well as regretted, that a larger proportion of the Members do not avail themselves of the continual advantages which, at so small a cost, both the Reading Room and the Library afford. The annual fee which a member of the Institute pays for the enjoyment of all its privileges, including the Course of Lectures, is less than is often paid elsewhere as a yearly subscription to a Circulating Library or a Reading Room alone. Yet the Directors deem it highly important that both these departments should be maintained in a state of efficiency, and advisable that fresh efforts should be made to add to their attractions and to increase their usefulness as valuable means of public instruction.

The Committee to whom is entrusted the care and superintendence of that department, have reported that, in order to classify and arrange the articles in the Museum in a systematic manner, and to place them in cases properly constructed for their reception, an expenditure of about *Two Thousand Dollars* will be required. Your President and Directors, feeling the importance and desirableness of this suggested work,—a subject which their Report of last year put prominently before you,—again invite your especial attention to it.

The Board has great pleasure in acknowledging, in addition to the donations already mentioned, the receipt of *Fifty Dollars* from Silas Alward, Esq., who generously returned to the funds of the Institute the fee paid him for his excellent lecture, delivered in the Season's Regular Course.

In concluding their Report, the President and Directors have to suggest, as the only direction in which a diminution of our annual expenses may be effected, a reduction of the aggregate amount paid for lectures. This can be done by discontinuing the Supplementary Course, which during the past two years it has been attempted to carry on. The

experiment, contrary to reasonable expectation, has been in every respect unsatisfactory. Not only have the extra lectures, however excellent their character, failed to draw large audiences, but the unusually good and really admirable Regular Courses of Lectures, organized with great care and pains, and provided for the Members at a large expense, have not met with that appreciation and support which your Directors think they had a right to expect.

The President and Directors earnestly hope that, perceiving the absolute necessity for lending it their aid, all the sincere friends of *The Mechanics' Institute* will rally in its support; and that the incoming Board may, at the next Annual Meeting, be able to present a Report shewing a much improved state of its affairs.

MINUTES OF CERTAIN PROCEEDINGS AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERS OF THE ST. JOHN MECHANICS' INSTITUTE, HELD AT THE HALL OF THE INSTITUTE, ON MONDAY EVENING, 12TH APRIL, A. D. 1875.

The Chair was taken by the President, Mr. Gilbert Murdoch, at 8 p. m.

In the absence of the Recording Secretary, Mr. H. Lawrance Sturdee was requested to act as Secretary.

The Minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read and confirmed.

Read the Report of the Directors for the year ending April, 1875; also, the Report of the Auditors.

The following Resolution was moved by Mr. I. A. Jack, and seconded by Mr. John Magee:

Whereas, The necessity for establishing and maintaining a good Public Library for the City of Saint John, is becoming every day more apparent, on account of the growing literary tastes of the people, the absence of a large and respectable collection of books accessible to the general public, the difficulty, or impossibility, for persons with limited means, to supply themselves with reading matter, and the good results

And Whereas, The Common Council of the said City has, by resolution, signified its approval of the project of forming a Public Library for the said City,—

Resolved, That a Special Committee be appointed to solicit persons—particularly mechanics—to become members of the Institute.

The President nominates as the Committee: Messrs. Marsters, Alward, Butler, Everett, and Magee.

On motion it was

Resolved, That the meeting proceed to the Election of Officers for the ensuing year.

Mr. T. A. Rankine declines being again nominated as Treasurer.
