

Pastor's Letter.

To the Members and Adherents of Cooke's Church:

DEAR BRETHREN,—It is now ten years and a half since I was ordained, and since I was inducted into the pastorate of Cooke's Church congregation.

Ten years ago, the revenue of the congregation averaged about twenty-one dollars a week. Since that time the congregation has raised, from all sources, the sum of \$111,187.42.

In 1887 the old church was renovated at a cost of \$19,000, but, becoming too small for the congregation, it was taken down in 1891, and a new church erected, which was opened on May 15th, 1892, by Rev. Dr. John Hall, of New York.

The year just closed has been a year of great financial depression in Toronto, and it is gratifying to know that during the year the congregation, besides meeting all its obligations, reduced its debt by nearly nine hundred dollars. What is still more encouraging is the fact that the contributions to Home and Foreign Missions and the other Schemes of the Church, for 1896, have increased sixty per cent. over the previous year, Let us take new courage, and do better in 1897.

The first time I preached in Cooke's Church, there were 87 people present, and when I received the call, it was signed by 80 members and 2 adherents. There were about 100 active members on the Communion Roll at that time, and since then 2,181 have united with the congregation—972 by certificate, from other churches, and 1,209 by profession of faith. Many of our people have had to leave the city to seek employment elsewhere, owing to the dull times in the city. I am glad to be able to say that most of them took their Christianity with them, and are now working for the Lord in their new fields. I rarely, if ever, go to any of the American cities without finding former members of Cooke's Church, who are now actively engaged in Christian work.

During those ten years there have been organized, in connection with the congregation, a Women's Foreign Missionary Society, a Young Woman's Mission Band, a Dorcas Society, a Missionary Association, a Young Men's Prayer Meeting, a Young Women's Prayer Meeting, a Junior Endeavor Society,

and a Senior Christian Endeavor Society, which is now the largest in the world. All of these Societies have done, and are now doing, most excellent work. The Women's Association, which was organized many years ago, and until this year was known as the Ladies' Aid, is still doing splendid work.

Three of our members are now doing Foreign Mission work—one among the Indians in the North-West, one in China, and one in Africa; nine are ordained ministers and are settled in churches; fifteen are studying with a view to the ministry and work in the Mission Fields during the summer months.

Many of our young people are actively engaged in City Mission work, and their efforts are being blessed. The work among the Chinese is very encouraging, and three of them were baptized and united with the church in October last.

Brethren, the Lord has done great things for us as a congregation, and blessed us in the past. He has also given us great opportunities of doing good, but with these opportunities comes great responsibility. The congregation has become so large, and the work so great, that it can only be carried on by the hearty co-operation of all the members.

I regret that there are so many families I have been unable to visit during the year, although I have made more than 1,400 visits, most of them being upon the sick.

I thank you all for your sympathy and help, and I think we all ought to thank God for His great goodness to us as a people. Let us be a worshipping and a working people. If we are worshippers we will attend the services when it is possible to do so, and we will pray for the prosperity of Zion. If we are workers, we will not have time to find fault with others. May we realize that the harvest is great, that the labourers are few, that our day of opportunity will soon be over, and we will then have to give an account to God, not as to how others have used their time and their talents, but as to how we have used our time and our talents. Every one of us shall give an account of himself to God.

May the Lord help us to be faithful to that which He has committed to our trust.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF

Cooke's Presbyterian Church

FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1896.

Minutes of the Forty-Fifth Annual Meeting of Cooke's Church.

Pursuant to notice duly given by the Pastor from the pulpit on the two previous Sabbaths, the Forty-Fifth Annual Meeting of the congregation of Cooke's Church was held on Wednesday, the 13th day of January, 1897, at 8 o'clock, in the lecture room of the church, Mr. P. G. Close, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, presiding.

The meeting was opened with devotional exercises.

Mr. Jno. P. Martin was appointed Secretary of the meeting. The Chairman briefly stated the object of the meeting in accordance with the usual notice given.

The Minutes of the last annual meeting were read, and, on motion, confirmed.

Mr. S. Wallace, clerk, submitted the report of the Session, which, on motion, was adopted.

The Treasurer, Mr. James Alison, read the Financial Statement for the year 1896, showing the receipts and disbursements from the various sources, copies of which had been distributed to the congregation, and after being fully discussed, moved that the report be received and adopted. Carried.

The election of three trustees was then taken up, the retiring members being W. L. Wallace, J. R. Milligan and Jno. P. Martin.

The Chairman asked Messrs. Young, Moffatt and Cringan to act as scrutineers.

The following were nominated: Messrs. John McLeod, W. L. Wallace, S. Egan, A. W. Stevenson, J. R. Milligan, Wm. Forster, W. G. Wilson, Jno. P. Martin.

The scrutineers reported the result of the ballot to be in favor of Ino. P. Martin, W. L. Wallace and W. G. Wilson.

The following reports and financial statements of the different organizations in connection with the Church were then read and, on motion, were adopted, and ordered to be printed in the annual report in the usual way:—

The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor.

The Junior Christian Endeavor.

The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society.

The Young Women's Mission Band.

The Woman's Association.

The Young Men's Prayer Meeting.

The Missionary Association.

Moved by Mr. Kinnear, seconded by Mr. S. Wallace, that Messrs. McConnell and Caswell be the auditors for the year 1897. Carried.

The notice of motion to change the night of meeting of the congregation from the second to the third Wednesday in

January, was withdrawn.

Mr. Thos. Humphries gave in the following notice of motion: "That at the next annual meeting of the congregation a nominating committee be appointed consisting of three members, whose duty it shall be to recommend those best qualified to act on the Board of Trustees, and that no candidate be balloted for whose name has not been submitted by the said committee."

Moved by Mr. S. Wallace and seconded by Mr. Thos. Humphries, "That the Chairman and Secretary of the Board of Trustees and John M. Poole be a committee to arrange for the printing of 1,000 copies of the Annual Report and have the same distributed to the members of the congregation as soon as possible." Carried.

Moved by Mr. Thos. Kinnear and seconded by Mr. A C. Kilpatrick, "That this congregation extend a hearty vote of thanks to our beloved Pastor, Rev. Wm. Patterson and his wife, and that the Secretary is hereby authorized to convey the same to them in writing." Carried.

Mr. James Alison moved, seconded by Mr. R. Gilday, "That this congregation place on record their high appreciation of the work done by the Woman's Association in raising so ably such a large amount for the Board, and desire to acknowledge the great services and abundant efforts on behalf of this society by its former president, Mrs. Samuel Wallace, feeling that its success was due largely to her ability, tact and energy during the thirteen years she occupied the position." Carried.

The following votes of thanks were then moved, seconded and carried unanimously:

To Mr. James Alison, for his efficient services as Treasurer; To Mr. P. G. Close, Chairman of the Board, and the members thereof;

To Mr. J. P. Martin, Secretary to the Board;

To Mr. A. E. Guest, Organist;

To Mr. Geo. McLeary, Caretaker;

Who duly acknowledged the same in short speeches.

There being no further business before the meeting, it adjourned after singing the Doxology.

May God continue to bless us in the future, as in the past, and even more abundantly, is the prayer of all the Session.

This department of our Church work has been carried on during the past year with, we believe, a deeper interest and a more earnest effort on the part of each member of the Association. The membership of our school has increased to 760, including the Bible Class, and the average attendance per Sabbath for 1896 has been largely in excess of that for 1895; and this, we believe, is greatly owing to the faithful efforts of the teachers and officers of the Association. We have supported, as usual, a cot in the Sick Children's Hospital and a pupil at the Pointe aux Trembles School in Ouebec.

The average attendance of the Intermediate Classes was 169, the smallest being 106 on August 23—the largest being 271 on August 30th.

The average attendance of the Bible Class was 160. The smallest being 60 on August 9, and the largest attendance 236 on November 22nd.

The average attendance of the Primary Class was 74. The smallest being 47 on August 9th and the largest 92 on April 5th, 12th and 26th.

Before concluding our Report we wish to mention, with deep thankfulness, that several of the scholars have during the year made an open profession of their faith by uniting with the Church.

"Go work to-day in My vineyard," is the command our Great Leader has given us. To obey this command is the aim of the members of the Christian Endeavor in their efforts to lead the young people of the congregation to consecrate their lives to His service. Realizing that in spiritual life, as in physical life, growth and strength come only by action, the Society seeks to have all its Active Members take a definite interest in some department of the work carried on by the Society. By doing so many members have for the first time realized the joy of active service for Christ.

Our Society is now the largest Christian Endeavor Society in the world. There has been a marked increase in Christian zeal and earnestness of purpose among the members, and there has been a great interest taken in missionary work, especially in this city. Gospel meetings are held in the King Street Mission every Friday evening, in the Haven once a month, in the Lombard Street Fire Hall every second Sunday evening after the Church service, in Temperance Hall every Sunday evening, and in the open air during the summer months when the weather permits.

The Chinese Class is held in the Lecture Room every Synday evening after the service. Those in charge of the class were encouraged by seeing three of the members publicly profess their faith in Christ at a recent communion.

Of the funds raised during the year, \$100 was given to Foreign Missions and \$100 to the Building Fund.

During the year 9,930 tracts were distributed, and from tento fifteen small bouquets of flowers, with Scripture texts attached, were sent every Sunday to those who were sick at the General Hospital or at their own homes.

A number of special meetings were held during the year. One was addressed by Mr. Gabriel McGuire, of Africa, and one by Mr. A. Sandham, of Toronto. A most enjoyable and profitable evening was spent in the month of August, when the members of Session responded to our invitation to meet with us and address us, the topic for the evening being, "The Duties and Joys of Church Membership."

A pic-nic and three socials were held during the year, when an opportunity was afforded of becoming acquainted with new members and strangers.

A hearty invitation is extended to all the congregation to attend our weekly services.

A kind Providence has brought us to the close of another year, and as we reflect on the work of the past, we feel that we have been abundantly blessed in our labors.

The Woman's Association, formerly known as the Ladies' Aid Society, has held its meetings monthly in the Church Parlor, and although the meetings have not been as well attended as could be wished, yet a spirit of harmony has always prevailed among the members.

We have not accomplished as much as we anticipated, but if more of the women of the congregation would meet with us once a month, we would be enabled to do a great deal more. We mourn the loss by death of a very old and faithful member of the Society, one who always took an active part in all work connected with the Church, and one to whom we always looked for advice and counsel—Mrs. George Patterson. But we know that our loss has been her gain. Mrs. Dickson, who was also a member of the Association, was called to join the hosts above. To the members of both families we extend our sympathy.

During the year two lectures were given under the auspices of the Association, one by Mr. Patterson, and the other by Rev. Dr. Withrow, the latter being illustrated with lime-light

views by Mr. Whittemore.

Several social gatherings were held in the Lecture Room, by which we sought not only a financial gain, but also a greater sociability andong the members of the congregation.

Several years ago the Ladies' Aid Society undertook to pay for the furnishing of the Church, which was remodelled in 1888. This debt was almost paid when the present handsome edifice was erected. This incurred a much heavier expenditure, which the Society promised to meet. With the assistance of a number of the ladies of the congregation we have raised \$3,371, leaving still a balance of \$1,150, which amount we hope to raise during

the current year.

The Association was formed about the end of February, and although about one-third of the year had passed before it got rightly started to work, the amount contributed for the Schemes of the Church was larger in 1896 than in any previous year.

One of the objects for which the Association was started was the dissemination of missionary information among the members and adherents of the congregation. Each Elder's district is in charge of one of the members of the Executive Committee. Collectors are appointed, who leave copies of the Presbyterian Record at the homes of the families and individuals connected with the congregation, whether they are members of the Association or not. The *Record* gives an excellent account of Presbyterian Missions in general, and we believe that much good has resulted from the reading of these papers.

Those of the congregation wishing to become members of the Association can do so by contributing any sum they wish to the funds of the Association, for missionary purposes. Those who wish to contribute should endeavour to give their contributions to the collectors when they leave the *Record* each month.

The money collected is devoted to such Missionary Schemes of the Presbyterian Church as the Association may decide, after recommendation from the Session; but contributors may, at the time of subscribing, designate any special scheme they wish to assist.

We hope that during the current year a deeper and a wider interest may be awakened, and that everyone connected with the congregation may become a member of the Association.

The sum raised by the Association in 1896 amounted to \$1,123.65. After paying for the *Records* and sundry expenses, the sum of \$1,059.59 remained, which the Association have allocated as follows:
