

LONG AND SHORT WAVE MESSAGES BY WIRELESS

A new feature in the operation of "the wireless" on Trans-Atlantic liners has developed as the result of a statement by Mr. Kurt Shoenherr, the operator on the Hamburg-American steamship Cincinnati. Interviewed on his arrival in London, Mr. Shoenherr said that he caught the C.Q.D. call from the Titanic at a distance of 450 sea miles and that the Amerika of the Hamburg-American steamship Cincinnati.
