

After Matriculation, the Course of Study embraces four years, and on the satisfactory completion of the Curriculum, Students are admitted to the degree of Bachelor in Arts.

All candidates for this degree are required to attend the daily instructions of the lecture room, as well as to pass the terminal and annual examinations.

Where the age and standing of the student, or facilities for private reading warrant the belief that the usual examinations may be passed without attendance on the university lectures, a dispensation from such attendance for a period not exceeding two terms during the four years may be granted by the Faculty.

Any student not intending to graduate, may pursue a special or elective course, selecting such subjects as may be best adapted to his circumstances.

DEGREE OF M.A.

This degree is conferred in course on all Bachelors in Arts of three years standing, whose mental improvement and moral character have appeared satisfactory to the authorities of the University. Application must be made by letter to the President, one month prior to Convocation. The fee is five dollars.

No Honorary Degrees in Arts are conferred by this University.

TERMS AND VACATIONS.

The Collegiate year begins on the *last Thursday* in August, and ends on the *first Wednesday* in May.

This period is divided into two Terms, between which there is a recess at Christmas of one week.

Convocation is held on the last day of the Collegiate year; and is followed by the Summer Vacation.

Candidates for admission are examined on the first Saturday of the Session.

CABINETS.

The Cabinets of the University embrace about 4,000 specimens of Minerals, Rock Formations, and Fossils. Every specimen is mounted and distinctly labelled. The specimens are accurately classified, and afford a very full illustration of European as well as American Geology and Mineralogy. A class in Practical and Determinative Mineralogy will be formed whenever necessary. The Lectures on Geology and Mineralogy are all delivered in the Museum.

HONORS, MEDALS AND PRIZES.

Through the bounty of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, on the occasion of his visit to this Province, the authorities of the University have been able to establish two medals, styled respectively The Prince of Wales Gold Medal, and The Prince of Wales Silver Medal.

The Prince of Wales Gold Medal will be awarded to that student of the graduating class who may have obtained the highest standing in all the prescribed subjects of the curriculum, during the four years of study.

The Prince of Wales Silver Medal will be awarded in the same way to the second best student of the graduating class.

In addition to the above, three prizes have been established by John George Hodgins, Esq., LL.B., Deputy Superintendent of Education.

The first of these is styled the *Ryerson* prize, the second, the *Webster* prize, and the third, the *Hodgins* prize. The *Ryerson* prize will be annually awarded to that member of the Freshman class who may evince the best knowledge of Scripture History; the *Webster* and *Hodgins* prizes are open for competition to the Junior and Senior classes, and will be awarded to the respective authors of the first and second best English Essays on such subjects as may be assigned by the Senate.

DISCIPLINE.

Students connected with the College will be expected to conduct themselves with propriety, and to observe all regulations imposed by the President and Faculty.

A record is kept of each student’s deportment, and will be furnished to parents when it is deemed necessary.

Students whose conduct or progress in study is unsatisfactory, will not be allowed to remain in the Institution.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

All students are required to attend Divine Service on the Sabbath, at such Churches as their parents or guardians may prefer.

They are also required to attend daily prayers, with the reading of the Holy Scriptures, in the College Chapel.

On the Lord’s Day there are several Bible-classes conducted by officers of the College; there are also prayer-meetings and other religious services for such as desire to attend.

EXPENSES.

Rooms provided with stove, mattress, bedstead and table may be had in the College at a trifling rent. Fuel supplied at cost.

Students who lodge in the College may make convenient arrangements in private families for their board.

Where it is preferred, board, with lodging, may be had in private families, at prices varying from \$2 to \$3 a week.

Tuition, \$10 per annum, and no extras.

Incidentals, \$5 per annum; or \$3 for one term, in advance.

The total expense for tuition, board, incidentals, &c., &c., need not exceed \$100 per annum.

Cobourg Grammar School,**IN AFFILIATION WITH VICTORIA COLLEGE.**

By an agreement between the College Board and the Trustees of the Cobourg Grammar School, this School has been adopted as the Preparatory Department of the University. Pupils will be instructed in the various branches of a Grammar School education, and special classes will be formed to prepare students for matriculation in the University. The School is conducted in a suitable building in the immediate vicinity of the College, and pupils from a distance will, as heretofore, be under the discipline and care of the Faculty.

The fee for tuition and incidentals is \$3.50 a quarter. The terms and vacations are the same as in the other Grammar Schools of the Province. The Winter Term begins on the seventh of January, and the Summer Term on the second Monday in August. These are the most suitable dates for entering, but pupils will be admitted at any time.

Faculty of Medicine.

TORONTO BRANCH.

This Faculty will be conducted in Toronto, as heretofore, and those who complete the prescribed curriculum, and pass a satisfactory examination, will receive the degree of Doctor of Medicine from the Senate of the University.

The WINTER Session always begins on the 1st of October in each year, and ends on the 30th of March following.

The SUMMER Session immediately follows, and continues till the 30th of September following.

The usual vacations at Christmas and New Year's are allowed.

The fees for two Winter Sessions, \$186; for one Session, \$100; Summer Session, \$35.

Although students are not required by any statute, yet they are strongly recommended by the Faculty to attend the classes in Arts at Victoria College, Cobourg, by which course they will derive important advantages in the pursuit of their medical studies. Besides matriculating in classics, they would acquire a knowledge of Natural Philosophy, and by the study of Chemistry and Physiology they would pass one year out of the four required by the curriculum.

The Matriculation Examination (giving satisfactory evidence of the student's classical and general attainments,) may be passed at any time before graduation; and the following works in the classics are recommended, out of which the pupil may choose the one in which to be examined, viz:—The London Pharmacopœia, Gregory's Conspectus, Sallust's Catiline, or any other Latin author.

He will also (before graduation) be required to compose a *Thesis* upon some medical subject, approved by the Faculty.

Theoretical Chemistry, both inorganic and organic, is taught; and the student is fully instructed in organic Chemistry as applicable to medicine and toxicology. The Lectures are illustrated by experiments, and by an ample laboratory.

The Museum is under the care and superintendence of the curator, and will contain not only illustrations of natural history, but whatever is deemed most conducive to the study of medical science in its various branches.

The Demonstrator of Anatomy will give personal attendance in the dissecting room, to superintend and assist the students in their pursuit of practical Anatomy, from 9 o'clock, a.m., till 3 o'clock, p.m.

There are two Scholarships open for competition at the Annual Examination, which takes place at the close of each session. The competition is restricted to medical students of the first year, they being undergraduates in Arts of one year's standing in Victoria University.

DEGREE OF LL.B.

To obtain the degree of LL.B., it is necessary to pass the Examination for Matriculation, and the four subsequent annual examinations prescribed below.

A Graduate in the Faculty of Arts in the University of Victoria College may enter the Faculty of Law at the third year's examination.

A Student of two years' standing in Arts may enter the Faculty of Law at the examination of the second year.

A Student of one year's standing in Arts may enter the Faculty of Law at the examination of the first year.

Any person who has been admitted a Barrister by the Law Society of Upper Canada may enter the Faculty of Law at the examination of the first year.
