

# GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

The Most Worshipful Grand Master delivered the following address:

# BRETHREN,-

By the loving care of the Great Architect of the Universe, we are again permitted to assemble at this our Eleventh Annual Communication, and we should with grateful hearts offer to Him our heartfelt thanks for His watchful care over us during the past, and humbly pray for a continuance of His blessings in the future, and let us implore this guidance in the important duties now devolving upon us.

I am happy to say our Lodges are working amicably and fraternally, and that nothing has occurred to interrupt the harmony and fraternal relations existing with other Grand Lodges.

The Grand Lodge of Vermont has sustained a serious loss during the past year in the death of its Grand Secretary, R. W. Bro. William H. Root, who died in the city of Burlington, on the 11th March last. In the memorial notice of his death, it says: "Bro. Root was an upright citizen, a man of unswerving integrity, and of earnest devotion to the cause of Freemasonry."

M. W. James Hamilton, Marquis of Hamilton, and Duke of Abercorn, Grand Master of Masons in Ireland, died on the 31st October, 1885. He had been many years Grand Master, and had gained the confidence and affection of the brethren over whom he presided.

R. W. Orelio Almeida, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Colon and Cuba, died at Havana, June 25th, 1885. He was an enthusiastic Mason.

M. W. Benjamin A. Botts, Grand Master of Texas, died in the City of Houston on the 24th September, 1886. He was most assiduous in his devotion to Masonry, and his death was a severe affliction to the brethren over whom he presided.

R. W. Florencio Suzarte, Junior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of Colon and Cuba, died at Cindad, April 21st, 1886.

To the brethren of these sister jurisdictions we tender our fraternal condolence.

In March last, R. W. Brother Deputy Grand Master Crabbe, accompanied by R. W. Past Deputy Grand Master Wakeford and other Brethren, paid an official visit to several of the Lodges in the western section of the Province. I had the pleasure of being present with them in their visit to Alexandra Lodge, Port Hill, Mount Zion Lodge, Kensington, and at Prince Edward Lodge,

Stanley Bridge. In consequence of indisposition, R. W. Bro. Crabbe was unable to visit the latter Lodge. I issued a commission to R. W. Bro. Past Deputy Grand Master J. W. Morrison, to officially visit St. John's Lodge, No. 1, Charlottetown. No doubt these Brethren will give a report to Grand Lodge as to the working, and other information respecting the various Lodges visited by them.

I have not been called upon for any decision of any consequence in the past year.

By recommendation of the M. W. Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Oregon, I have issued a commission appointing W. Brother William Armstrong the representative of this Grand Lodge near that Grand Lodge.

On my recommendation W. Brother Roderick McNeill, W. M. of Prince Edward Lodge, has been appointed the representative of the Grand Lodge of Oregon, and W. Bro. A. H. McPherson, W. M. of Victoria Lodge, has been appointed representative of the Grand Lodge of Michigan, near this Grand Lodge.

I have granted three dispensations during the year; one to install officers at other than the stated time; one to confer the third degree at a shorter interval than required by the constitution; and one for Brethren to appear in regalia at Divine service

I have received a communication from the newly formed Grand Lodge of the Federal district of the U. S. of Mexico, asking for recognition and an interchange of representatives with this Grand Lodge. This communication has been referred to the Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence, who will doubtless report thereon.

In conclusion, I beg once more to thank the officers and members of Grand Lodge, and all the Brethren with whom I have been brought in contact for the courteous treatment and fraternal kindness which they have upon all occasions extended to me.

BRETHREN,-

On the 1st July last, in company with Bro. P. D. G. M. Wakeford, I officially visited Prince Edward Lodge, at Stanley Bridge, dedicated their Hall and duly installed their officers. This new Lodge starts out with very fair prospects of success, being located in a settlement from which good material can be drawn.

On the 15th March, in company with several members of Grand Lodge I officially visited King Hiram Lodge, at Summerside, as there was no candidate I requested the W. M. toexemplify the F. C. degree, which was fairly done. I find their minutes show eight communications, average attendance eight.

At the same time and place Mount Lebanon Lodge was also convened. I requested the W. M to exemplify the E. A. degree, which he did, but I should like to see a little more effort put forth by the Summerside Lodges to perfect themselves in the ritual of our time-honored institution.

This Lodge held ten communications, with an average attendance of ten; at one meeting only six were present.

Tuesday, March 16th, I visted Alexandra Lodge, which claims our Grand Master as a member, and Bro. Yeo may well be proud of Alexandra Lodge. I found the officers all in their places, well up in their work, and very anxious for information.

At this point I had to stay my visit, having contracted a severe cold. The Grand Master kindly consented to visit Prince Edward Lodge, and P. D. G. M. Wakeford to visit True Brothers Lodge, from which I have no doubt a favorable report will be submitted.

On April 8th, I visited Victoria Lodge, Charlottetown. The Grand Secretary kindly attended with me. This Lodge at the present time is blessed with having a good set of officers, punctual in their attendance, and well posted in their work. I examined their minutes previous to my visit, and found them well and correctly kept, having held twenty-two meetings, with an average attendance of about sixteen.

I intended to visit the Lodges in the Eastern part of the Island, but was unable to overtake the work. I would strongly recommend a yearly visitation being made by some of the principal officers of Grand Lodge.

I cannot close this imperfect report without returning my thanks to the members of the different Lodges I had the pleasure of visiting, they all treated me and the Brothers accompanying me with the greatest kindness and courtesy.

#### GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the M. W. Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island:

I herewith submit my Annual Accounts and Report for the year.

As soon after the Annual Communication as possible I prepared the Proceedings of the Grand Lodge for the printer, and when completed I forwarded three copies each to the different Foreign Grand Lodges with whom we are in communication, also forwarded copies to all the members of the Grand Lodge.

By vote of the Grand Lodge I issued a charter to Prince Edward Lodge, holding at Stanley-Bridge, U. D.

By order of the M. W. Grand Master I have forwarded a commission to Bro. William Armstrong, appointing him the Representative of this Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of Oregon.

I have received a Commission from the Grand Lodge of Oregon appointing Bro Roderick McNeill as the Representative of that Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of P. E. Island, also a commission from the Grand Lodge of Michigan appointing Bro. A. H. McPherson the Representative of that Grand Lodge near this Grand Lodge. These commissions I have delivered to the Brethren.

By order of the M. W. Grand Master a commission was issued to R. W. P. D. Grand Master J. W. Morrison to visit Victoria Lodge, No. 2, officially.

The following Dispensations have been granted during the past year.

To Zetland Lodge, No. 7, to install officers at other than the regular time, also a dispensation to raise a Brother at shorter interval than required by the constitution.

To Mount Zion Lodge, No. 12, granting leave for the Brethren to wear Regalia at Divine service on a special occasion.

The printed copies of our early records being nearly exhausted, I have had two complete sets bound.

During the year I have received the proceedings of the different Grand Lodges. I annex a statement of cash received during the year showing the amount to be \$286.20.

I also annex an abstract of returns received from the Lodges and I am happy to say that there has been an increase of membership during the year, 33 Brethern raised, 10 admitted, 3 reinstated, making 46 new members; 34 members have demitted, 16 of which affiliated with Prince Edward Lodge, so that the actual number demitted is 18, suspended for N. P. D. 6, Died 4, leaving the actual number of Master Masons 448.

R. W. G. W. Wakeford presented the following report.

To the M. W. Grand Lodge.

In March last I had the pleasure of accompanying the R. W. Deputy Grand Master, on his official visitation to the Lodges west of Charlottetown, taking in King Hiram and Mount Lebanon Lodges, Sammerside, Alexandra Lodge, Port Hill, and Mount Zion Lodge, Kensington. The Deputy Grand Master suffered from a cold on the second day, and after visiting the above mentioned lodges was compelled reductantly to return home.

On Thursday, March 18th, I accompanied the M. W. Grand Master to Stanley Bridge, where we met the brethren of Prince Edward Lodge, No. 14, at 4 o'clock p. m., and witnessed an exemplification on part of the E. A. degree. The members of this Lodge attend very regularly and from all appearance have the right material on which to erect a superstructure which will last for ages. There are many things that might be mentioned here with advantage to the brethren,—but as it is our youngest lodge and the errors which they have allowed ocreep in having been brought before them at the time of visit, I do not think it necessary to refer to same in this written report. By their records, which are well kept, I find that they held 16 communications from May 1885, to time of visit, with an average attendance of 11.

The M. W. Grand Master having to return home deputed me to risit True Brothers Lodge, No. S. Tryon. which I did on Friday, the 19th of March, and found a very good attendance, some brethren having travelled 7 miles for the purpose of being present. At this Lodge a candidate was initiated and a F. C. raised, so that there was sufficient work to keep the lodge opened to a late hour. This lodge states, that they made returns and forwarded amount due to the Grand Lodge of England some years ago but did not receive diplomas applied for. I advised them to lay the matter before our Grand Secretary, giving full particulars of date when sent and list of diplomas required, when I have no doubt the Grand Secretary of England will forward those wanted as he has done heretofore. This lodge held 12 communications, average attendance 12.

During the week occupied in visiting we had a very enjoyable time and could not fail to observe that such great interest manifested by the members of Grand Lodge to our constituent lodges is of great good, and trust that same will be continued. It brings those together who have not met for years, and may never meet again on this side of the grave. The joyous welcome and hearty shake hands is recompense sufficient for the slight trouble occasioned by a run around.

In the discharge of the duties intrusted to me by the commission of the M. W. Grand Master of date the 8th day of April last, as his Representative, to visit St. Johns Lodge, No. 1, located in this City, to examine the Books etc., of the said Lodge, and to report to this M. W. Grand Lodge at this Annual Communication,

I beg to submit the following report.

The R. W. Grand Secretary notified the W. Master of St. Johns Lodge that it was my intention to visit them-on the 13th of April instant, being their stated meeting and in a secondance with the said notice (the Grand Secretary being unavoidably absent) R. W. D. G. Master Crabbe kindly offered his services on the occasion, and having been duly announced I was cordially received with all the honors and escorted to the chair. 

# Pacisions Randened bu Crand Masten.

PHYSICAL QUALIFICATION.—There is nothing in the constitution or landmarks for disqualifying a hunchback from being initiated into Masonry, provided he could comply with all the ceremonies of the initiated in the several degrees.—(Proceedings, May 1877.)

LODGE BUSINESS.—It is not competent for a Subordinate Lodge at an emergent meeting to enter on any other business than that specified on the summons.—(Proceedings, 1877.)

RESTORATION.—A brother who has been indefinitely suspended, can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication that a motion to that effect would be made.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

MASONIC BURIAL.—The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues, cannot, by paying his dues, entitle him to Masonic burial.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

MOTIONS.—A brother who gives notice of motion to amend the constitution cannot delegate another brother to move in the matter in his absence.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

Demits cannot be granted to entered apprentices or Fellow crafts,
