3. Give some general rules for economy in housekeeping, and mention some common wasteful habits.

4. Describe how to mend stockings (7 common ways) and how to mend shoes (7 common ways).

5. How do you wash plain, white, plain, but brushed? How and why do you air a bed room?

6. Give the necessary directions for making and baking a loaf of bread.

7. What suggestions can you give as to the utilization of (1) broken bread, (2) fragments of cold meats, (3) cold vegetables?

8. Do you put vegetables into cold or hot water to cook them? Why? Do you wash your vegetables in cold or hot water? Why?

9. Give the necessary directions for washing flannels. State how you would get rid of paint, ink or fruit stains on garments.

Six questions make a full paper.

Part II. Material—1 yard undressed white cotton.

The following questions on the cotton furnished you.

1. Put a patch 2 in. by 2 in., cut on the bias.

2. Work two ordinary sized button-holes.

3. Cut your material in the shape of the letter "V."

4. Hem one end of your cotton.

5. Gather and put a band on the other.

Four questions make a full paper.

Gen. Campos has asked Premier Sigaut to accept his resignation immediately. The latter will not accept the resignation and officially announce the crisis in the ministry.

Several members of the Irish National League have been arrested in Ireland. The arrests are the result of recent inquiries. Some of the persons taken into custody were charged with obstructing the evidence of a trial of various offenders.

Causes of infectious diseases.

Inquiries issued to twenty-eight medical colleges elicit the common response that "most, if not all, infectious diseases are caused by the growth of microscopical organisms."

It is a subject of study in the public schools there was a wide difference of opinion. But most of the medical schools are giving more or less attention to the subject. It is very evident that, as soon as possible, our physiology and hygiene courses, in our colleges, when it is taught at all, should include the subject of infection and the dangers from this class of microscopical foes to life.

The battle for life is to be fought on a narrow, not so much with wild animals and huge monsters, but with enemies so minute as to escape all ordinary means of detection. Science says "quite a number of special bacteriological laboratories are already established in connection with our larger medical schools." It is clear enough that medical education should include this subject, and in the not distant future we shall all be students of medicine. —Globe-Democrat.
