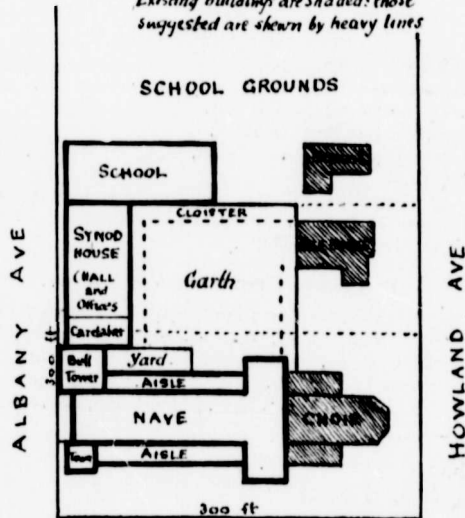

The Rev. Canon Harding of Apsley died on 26th April last.

The Bishop has appointed the Rev. Thomas Clark Street Macklem, Provost of Trinity College, to be Chancellor of the Cathedral.

On Sunday 28th May, the Bishop resumed his place in the Cathedral. He had been present informally at the Services on the previous Sunday. He has arranged to leave on 15th inst. for England, with Mrs. Sweatman and the Misses Sweatman.

The regular quarterly meeting of the Chapter was held on 11th May. Treasurers' and Auditors' Annual Reports were presented. From these it appeared that during the year there had been received from the Bishop's Fund \$1,245.65, subscriptions and donations \$1,022.50, and from other sources \$543, in all \$2,811.15. These items which are independent of and unconnected with the "Service Account," have been applied in payment of interest and reduction of debt.

On 1st June a joint meeting of the Residuary Chapter and members of the congregation was held for the purpose of considering the question of enlargement of the building, the need of which is so greatly felt. The congregation was well represented by a large number of members.

His Lordship, the Dean of the Cathedral, was unable to be present on account of his recent serious illness. Canon Macnab was appointed Chairman of the meeting and opened the proceedings with prayer for guidance and blessing on their consideration of this most important matter.

The Treasurer informed the meeting that he had made efforts to recover Mr Windeyer's original structural plans of the fabric, which have been missing since some time before Mr. Windeyer's death, but so far without success, and explained the difficulties of proceeding with permanent work of construction in the absence of the original plans. He also explained a suggested plan of enlargement by work of a temporary character, and gave such information regarding probable cost of permanent work and temporary work so far as at present ascertained or estimated.

Mr. Coney spoke in favour of making such changes as would add the library to the space for seating. The Treasurer, however, informed the meeting that a plan practically identical with Mr. Coney's suggestions had been fully considered some years ago, and definitely decided against, so that it could not now be reconsidered.

Several members having spoken to the general effect that, while it is much to be regretted that any work done should be of a temporary character merely, in view of the unavoidably heavy cost of permanent work and difficulties and delays which must attend the undertaking and execution of such work, it is better for the present to make an effort to secure enlargement on the plan of a building extending westwards from the

choir about forty feet or more with a width which would leave room outside the walls for permanent work to go on whenever practicable. Such a building would contain space underneath which could be used for a Chapel and Choir room, both of which are much needed, the present accommodation being quite inadequate. It would also give an additional entrance to the building. The Treasurer stated that so far as he was at present able to form an estimate of the probable cost of such building, he was of the opinion that it could not be built for much less than \$5,000. It was also explained that no debt could be incurred for this work, and it could only be undertaken with money in hand or subscribed.

A Committee was appointed to take the matter into consideration, consisting of Rev. Canon Macnab (Convener), Messrs. Edmund Wragge, Stanley Pettit, Samuel Nesbitt, S. E. Cork, G. G. Lemesurier, the Treasurer, and the Sidesmen, with power to add to their number.

On Tuesday evening June 13th, the Annual Synod Service will be held as usual in S. Alban's Cathedral. The preacher will be the Rev. Canon Spragge, Rector of Cobourg. This Service is always a notable one, and splendidly rendered by the S. Alban's Choir under the leadership of Mr. Kemp. Although principally for the members of the Synod, Clerical and Lay, the service is open to all Churchmen, and we earnestly hope the members of our own congregation will not be (as in some previous years) conspicuous by their absence. Certain seats will be specially reserved for the Clergy and lay members of the Synod. It is anticipated that there will be a large crowd at this Service, and the Cathedral Sidesmen are requested to be early in attendance to assist in providing seats for the worshippers.

His Lordship the Bishop of Toronto expects to attend the Service, which will be at 8 o'clock p.m.

On Saturday evening June 17th (S. Alban's Day), the Bishop of Niagara will hold Confirmation in S. Alban's Cathedral. A large number of Candidates from several City parishes will be presented as well as those from our own congregation. The Cathedral Sidesmen are asked to be in attendance to act as ushers. The special offertory is for S. Alban's Cathedral debt.

An Ordination Service will be held in the Cathedral on Trinity Sunday, June 18th. The Bishop of Niagara will take Bishop Sweatman's place. Rev. Canon Sweeney, Rector of S. Philip's will be the preacher. The order of Services for that day will be: 8 a.m., Holy Communion; 10 a.m., Matins; 11 a.m., Ordination Service.

At a meeting of the Sunday School teachers and officers held in the Crypt it was decided to hold the Annual S.S. Picnic and congregational outing at Bond Lake on July 5th (Wednesday). It is expected that the holiday will be as successful in every way as in previous years, and we hope the members of the congregation will join in helping us to make it a memorable gathering. Tickets are obtainable from the officers and teachers of the Sunday School.
