AMERICAN AFFAIRS.
(FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.)
Committee on Government.
The Committee on Government, established by the House of Representatives on the 15th of May, has been very busy since its organization. It has held several meetings and has received many reports from its various sub-committees. The Committee is particularly interested in the question of the removal of the Federal Courts from the States, and has been holding numerous public hearings on this subject. It has also been engaged in a general survey of the condition of the public debt, and has proposed various measures for its reduction. The Committee's reports are expected to be published shortly.

Slavery.

The Southern States are determined to enforce the law, and will not permit any interference with the rights of the slave. The result of this contest will determine the future of the Union.

California.
