### LEGAL DECISIONS.

Any person who takes a paper regis-  
tered from the Post Office—whether dir-  
ectly from the Post Office or whether  
subscribed or not—is responsible for  
the payment.  
If a person orders his paper discon-  
tinued, he must pay up all arrearages, or  
publishers may continue to send it until  
paid is made, and collect the whole  
amount, whether the paper is taken from  
him or not.  
The courts have decided that refer-  
ence to the newspapers and periodicals  
at the Post Office, or removing and  
selling them uncalled for is prima facie  
evidence of intentional fraud.

Resolved that the following amendment to the by-laws at last meeting: "That clause 116 of the by-laws regarding exhibitions be amended, and that lectures be included with other entertainments and be liable to pay a license fee..."

Resolved that the appointment of a sanitary inspector be deferred until next meeting. The following estimates for the current year were passed:
