

PORRIGN MISSIONS.

The Poreign Mission Board, besides caring for three stations in Bolivia are in India serving twenty two atations with a missionary staff of eight ty six of whom five are physicians. These are assisted by five hundred and forty one native helpers. There are more than two hundred village schools, nine boarding schools, two high schools, one normal school, a theological seminary, an industrian school and five hospitals. Christians are found in four hundred and eighty future villages on the field, and, at least fifteen hundred willages receive monthly gospel preaching. Eleven hundred and eighty fitted during the past year.


