

Fertilized by Volcanie Ashes.

Fertilised by Voleanie Ashes. [Scientifs Journal.] The role of wind in fertilizing the ground is remarkably illustrated by the very fertile valley of Limagne, in Au-vergne. The prevalent winds there are wast and southwest, and traverse the chain of the Domes, where are vast deposit of volcanic ashes. Much of this dust is is us carried to the Limagne valley, and settles there of itself, or is carried down by rain or snow. As it contains a large amount of phosphoric acid, potash and lime, if is highly fertilizing, and its very fine stete favors rapid assimilation. As a result, Limagne is by far the most fertile valley in Europe. Forcin Lette.]
